About the Departments

<u>Art</u>

The Art and Photography Department is having a boost in November 2019, moving into the new £26million build. Currently there are 2 full time equivalent, 1 part time staff and an Art technician, all teachers will have new classrooms in the new build.

The leadership structure comprises of a Head of faculty for the Creative Collaborations (Art, Drama, Music and Technology). Head of Art and TLR 3 roles available for projects linked to the school or department development plan.

All staff have the opportunity to teach KS3 through to KS5.

The department is fully resourced with a wide range of materials for Art, including Art studios specifically for Post 16 Fine Art and KS4&5 Photography equipped with darkroom, photography studio equipment. In addition, there is a ceramic specialist area housing 2 electronic kilns and ICT to support learning, i.e. a bank of laptops and computers.

The current exam board of choice for KS4 is OCR, with students completing GCSE qualifications in Fine Art and Photography 2020. At KS5 we successfully offer AQA A Level Fine Art and Photography with specialist equipment intended to prepare the students for a career in the Creative Industries.

The Art department fully support the Wide Horizons agenda providing many extracurricular activities and opportunities, including lunchtime art clubs and trips to Compton Verney, Birmingham and London. We are looking to enrich further by visiting further afield in 2020 and beyond. Opportunities exist for students to enter exciting competitions such as the Young Rotary Photographer competition.

All students take part in the Annual Griffin Arts festival which is a fantastic opportunity for students to experience artists in residence, enjoy live music and take part in a wide range of workshops.

Technology

The Technology department also move into a new building, with subject specific studios, workshops and kitchens part our vision is to become a STEAM school and achieve Arts Mark.

The Technology department has 3 full time members of staff and one part time member as well as 2 full time Technicians and one part time technician.

All Technology teachers teach within their own subject specific area for KS4 but have the opportunity to teach across all the disciplines at KS3 (Cuisine, product innovation, electronics and graphic communications).

We offer GCSE Food preparation and nutrition, Product design, Graphic communication at GCSE and VTCT Hair and Beauty.

The Technology department is part of a successful and thriving Creative faculty, consisting of Art, Drama, Music, achieving the best results for achievement and progress across the school

Technology has developed into a creative, sophisticated and academic option that we believe is a necessity to life and employability skills. The subject encompasses a range of cross curricular subjects including the core subjects. As a Griffin school, Technology drives the vision of wider horizons by embracing influences, cultures, new technologies, employability skills and opportunities for WRL learning outside the classroom. We are proud to be part of the Arts Mark journey and include WRL STEAM partnerships into our curriculum plan. We have worked in partnership with the Royal society, Severn Trent Water, a variety of STEM ambassadors, Animal Aid, DATA and a variety of local Catering and Hair and Beauty businesses. Technology supports our students in becoming well round employable individuals that are prepared for life after school.

How to Apply

Candidates should submit a CV (including comprehensive details of key achievements and responsibilities) and address the following in no more than 1 side of A4 in 11 point and note that a generic statement will not be considered. Your application will be treated in strict confidence.

- Give details of how you have had a significant impact on student outcomes (or if you are an NQT how you would plan to) and how you would use this to improve whole school outcomes.
- From your research about this school and The Griffin Schools Trust, demonstrate how your experience and track record to date make you the kind of teacher we are looking for.

Please also include in your application the names, email addresses and direct phone number of two or three professional referees, making clear in what capacity they know you. Unless you ask us not to, we may contact them before the interviews.
