Business & Economics at Dyatmika School

The knowledge and lifelong skills developed through the subjects of Business Studies and Economics prepares students for the modern, globalised world they will be participating in.

The Business & Economics department strives to enhance learning by providing opportunities for students to participate in field trips and providing guest speakers.

Economics is offered at both the IGCSE and AS/A Level. Students study both micro and macroeconomics. They learn to analyse economic issues and arguments and critically evaluate economic information, arguments and policies.

Business is one of the most popular subjects at both the IGCSE and AS/A Level at Dyatmika. Students gain knowledge and understanding of topics that include Marketing, Human Resource Management, Operations Management and Finance. They also develop the skills needed to be able to analyse business problems and make recommendations for action and implementation.

CAMPUS, CLASSROOMS & FACILITIES

Professional expectations

It is the expectation of the school that the Economics and Business Studies teacher will demonstrate commitment to the vision and ethos of the school, as expressed in Dyatmika's Charter, and to the strategic development of the school.

Teachers at Dyatmika are expected to be respectfully collegial, enthusiastic, flexible and innovative in their approach to their work. They should be a forward-looking person committed to providing quality education and should have the highest possible expectation of students. They must be committed to the development of effective teaching and learning in the subject area and to his/her own professional learning.

Key responsibilities of the Teacher of Business Studies and Economics

Specifically, the Economics and Business Studies teacher will work with High School students within the framework of the Cambridge curriculum, ensuring that students have access to a high quality, effective teaching and learning experience. The following areas are essential responsibilities for the role of Economics and Business Studies teacher:

Teaching and learning

Teachers at Dyatmika:

- promote high expectations in all areas of teaching and learning. They demonstrate exemplary planning and teaching of lessons, using pedagogical strategies backed up by research and results;
- ensure that lessons are engaging, enjoyable and probing, while providing support and extension through a wide range of activities, questioning and differentiation. Student-teacher relationships will therefore be maintained as positive and productive to allow achievement at the highest level;
- · collaboratively plan and teach together with National teachers where appropriate. Such mentoring is carried out in a systematic and supportive manner. Teachers must be reflective and able to give and receive constructive feedback on teaching and learning;
- follow, and update schemes of work that provide structure and clarity to teachers, students and parents. These will be maintained in line with the curriculum and will promote skills and attitudes in line with the Dyatmika
- conduct systematic assessments linked to schemes of work to provide clear feedback on progression to teachers, students and parents.

Resources

The Economics and Business Studies teacher should:

- prepare appropriate teaching and learning materials;
- ensure that all resources are safely, securely and conveniently stored;
- use non-renewable resources economically;
- maintain an attractive and stimulating learning environment;

Communication and record keeping

The Economics and Business Studies teacher should interact with all members of the school community in a respectful manner, being particularly responsive to cultural and religious sensibilities. Specifically, the Economics and Business Studies teacher should:

- inform the Head of Department and / or Academic and Pastoral Leaders (as appropriate) about any students making excellent progress/effort or encountering difficulties
- ensure that issues regarding student welfare, health and safety are raised with appropriate colleagues;
- maintain current schemes of work and supporting resources in the correct folders;
- use the Engage MIS as required;
- establish/maintain links with parents that will promote effective collaboration between home and school;
- prepare grade updates and reports for parents in line with school requirements and deadlines;
- carry out parent-teacher conferences during the school year as scheduled.

Professional learning

Economics and Business Studies teachers are expected to actively improve their own skills and expertise and are expected to share ideas with international and national colleagues regarding good practice and teaching strategies. The mentoring of national colleagues is an important aspect of the ongoing improvement of provision at Dyatmika.

Additional responsibilities

Teachers at Dyatmika can expect the full support of his/her line manager and of the Whole School Executive. They are invited to openly discuss matters of concern, areas of interest or other relevant matters with them and with colleagues.

An Economics and Business Studies teacher should attend all applicable teacher meetings at school.

A teacher at Dyatmika contributes to the extra-curricular activities programme as required.

Teachers are required to attend some calendarised school community events outside of the regular school day, including the occasional Saturday.

Confidentiality

At all times the Economics and Business Studies teacher must respect the confidentiality of any information belonging or relating to the school, including, but not limited to, the business, finances, dealings, transactions or affairs of any school employees, parents or students.
