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HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE DEPARTMENT PROFILE

Coloma has a small but significant health and social care department which is deeply committed to vocational education. Traditional classroom teaching is combined with a well organised work experience programme to provide students with the knowledge, understanding and skills required to work in the health and social care sector. Teachers have first-hand experience of the sector and/or a sound grounding in social science, biology or physical education. The majority of our students go on to higher education and train as nurses, midwives, occupational therapists, social workers, paramedics or early years' practitioners.

<u>Courses</u>

We are currently offering the BTEC Level 3 National Diploma and the BTEC Level 3 Extended Certificate in Key Stage 5. The courses are completed over two years in the Sixth Form.

Students pursuing the National Diploma (equivalent of two A-Levels) have 12 lessons per week; those studying the Extended Certificate (equivalent to one A-level) join these students for 6 lessons per week.

All students currently study the following units:

- Unit 2 Working in Health and Social Care
- Unit 5 Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs
- Unit 11 Psychological Perspectives

In addition, Diploma students study:
