JOB DESCRIPTION - DIRECTOR OF STEM

Job Role

To lead and manage the STEM Faculty in order to ensure the highest standards of teaching, learning and student progress are delivered.

Leadership and Management

- To line-mange Maths, Science and Computer Science.
- To develop and implement strategies to raise achievement at all levels.
- To lead, inspire and motivate the Faculty team to achieve aspirational outcomes.
- To be a highly visible presence around the Faculty, role model high standards of professional behaviour and challenge poor performance.
- To lead the preparation, implementation and evaluation of an annual Faculty improvement plan.
- To quality assure the performance of the Faculty through lesson observation and checking of students' books to ensure that standards of learning are high and that work is properly assessed.
- To be accountable for the effective use of resources within the Faculty, including proper financial management within agreed budgets.
- To be responsible for implementing appropriate Curriculum Plans and Learning Programmes and reviewing/updating these regularly.
- To ensure that Faculty staff adhere to the school's Health and Safety policy.
- To explore opportunities to embed engineering in the curriculum.
- To be responsible, alongside the Director of Studies, for ensuring Students are on the right options pathways at GCSE and A-Level.
- To work with the Prep school to ensure a quality STEM curriculum and line manage as appropriate.

Teaching and Learning

- To role model best practice and deliver consistently good and outstanding lessons.
- To ensure that teachers within the Faculty consistently prepare and teach lessons that inspire and challenge all students to make good progress.
- To ensure consistently high standards of student work in books/folders across the Faculty.
- To ensure that effective use of Firefly as well as other STEM related technologies to secure good progress for all students.
- To ensure that teachers within the Faculty have access to high quality CPD appropriate to their needs.
- To provide support for teachers new to the profession or students training within the Faculty and to carry out observations as required.

Assessment
