I am delighted to be able to introduce you to Arnold Lodge School, a leading co-educational school in Leamington Spa, Warwickshire. Academic study at Arnold Lodge is not about percentages and statistics, it's about the individual pupil and helping them to attain the very highest that they can.

School is about so much more than classroom teaching. Our approach continues in music and sport where pupils are encouraged to take part, gain experiences and to enjoy being active, creative and on the stage. Some of our pupils are outstanding artists or musicians and these skills are valued highly at Arnold Lodge. All of our pupils are encouraged to develop their leadership skills; from joining our Pupil Parliament, taking part in Duke of Edinburgh right the way to being selected as Head Pupil, there are opportunities throughout the school for children to grow in confidence and find new interests and passions.







Junior Phase: Reception to Year 2

Our vibrant Junior Phase classes, starting with Reception to Year 2, are very special, with a dedicated, experienced teaching team. During the first few years of Arnold Lodge, each child is given the right foundations for their future. These years mark the beginning of the children's journey through education and we make sure they start off in the right way.

Each child is unique and our Junior Phase offers a relaxed, safe and structured atmosphere, where children are provided with opportunity and experiences which allow them to hone their skills and begin to understand their individual passions.

From cooking and craft to playing and performing, our Early Years Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 curriculum activities are varied and exciting. Pupils are taught French, Drama, Music and P.E by subject specialists and our pupils also have a weekly swimming lesson as part of their sports curriculum. While we are immensely proud of our small class sizes and school ethos, it is the breadth of our Key Stage 1 curriculum and the use of subject specialists that makes the learning experience extra special for our pupils.

Outcomes for pupils are carefully tracked and individual progress is monitored and shared. We record the milestones along the way and provide our children with the support that they need to make the most progress they can. In Key Stage 1, as much as anywhere else, our ethos shines through: happy children learn best.

Junior Phase: Year 3 to Year 6

The second part of our Junior Phase, Years 3 to 6, lays the foundations for our pupils to stride ahead through their Junior years before moving up to the challenges of the Senior Phase.

We offer a balanced curriculum with a clear focus on challenge, attainment and intellectual growth for every pupil. The core subjects: English, Mathematics and Science, coupled with immersive learning experiences, ensure our pupils develop the skills they need to be successful learners. Subject specialists in Music, Drama, Art, PE and French ensure that the students receive instruction at the highest level for their age group. Extension and Enrichment (known as ExEn) offers a multitude of opportunities that underpins these crucial years.

We look to build on the children's natural enthusiasm, excitement and spirit of enquiry to continue their love of learning and ensure they achieve their full potential. Our pupils experience the joy of aiming high and the satisfaction of achievement.

Friendly competition is introduced at Year 3 as pupils join a school house. The system fosters team-work, creativity and a community spirit. Children are encouraged to use their creativity, thinking skills and learning to achieve as many house points as they can!

As an all-through school, we know our children well and support their transition into Year 3 and then into Year 7. Our caring, family atmosphere gives the support, security and self-confidence needed for children to flourish personally, socially and academically at each stage.

Senior Phase: Year 7 to Year 11

In the Senior School, pupils focus on achieving their full potential in both their academic learning and more widely too. With examinations increasingly a part of school life, the academic environment becomes evermore important; first rate teaching, small mentor groups and excellent interventions allow pupils to make huge progress.

The Key Stage 3 curriculum remains broad giving pupils access to a wide range of subjects. English, Mathematics and Science form the core curriculum with excellent teaching, support and encouragement necessary to ensure pupils further their core learning. Our pupils study a broad creative curriculum: French, History, Geography, Computer Science, Music, Art, Food Technology, Sport and Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Studies.

School is about so much more than classroom learning and Arnold Lodge pupils delve into our ExEn sessions (Extension and Enrichment) which offer a phenomenal range of opportunities to our pupils. This might be taking the Duke of Edinburgh award, coding, literacy support, advanced mathematics, Engineering or Ultimate Frisbee - there's an ExEn session for everyone!

Whether it's a love of learning, a passion for sport or a burgeoning interest in one of our ExEn sessions, we know these school years are crucial and we seek to develop the interests and talents of every pupil.

Senior Phase: Year 7 to Year 11

The GCSE years are all about creating a bespoke learning experience for our pupils. Our core subjects, English, Mathematics and Science, provide a variety of pathways for your child to pursue and we can also offer a range of different qualifications to find the right combination for your child.

Arnold Lodge offers a wide range of elective subjects for pupils to pick from and we support them in their selections as they begin to think of careers for the future. Some pupils will take 10 GCSEs while others might take 7 and have additional support where they need it; we tailor our curriculum around what is right for the child so they have the best outcomes in their examinations.

During these GCSE years, pupils focus on their examinations and staff work closely with them to ensure the highest levels of teaching. Exceptional pastoral care ensures pupils are supported during the crucial GCSE years while pupils continue to enjoy Games and ExEn sessions to support their wider development. One of Arnold Lodge’s greatest strengths is the value that we add to children’s education in examinations.

On average we have added over 5 grades to each pupil beyond their targets. Our school ethos, coupled with excellent teaching and pastoral care, allows pupils at Arnold Lodge to achieve beyond their target grades and attain academic success at a level higher than they might have elsewhere.

Sixth Form

Arnold Lodge Sixth Form has an outstanding breadth of courses on offer with A Level and the EPQ available providing pupils with access to a truly bespoke education. Our Sixth Form balances the need to develop independence and responsibility with the vital support and care that young people need during these crucial years to fulfil their potential.

Sixth Form is an important time for pupils as they look to their future and work towards achieving long held dreams and ambitions. Sixth Form life is an exciting change from the highly structured day that pupils are familiar with, to one where they are encouraged to develop independent study skills and are expected to take responsibility for their own learning. Our Sixth Form environment mimics University life in many ways with a Sixth Form kitchen, a common room, silent study area and seminar style teaching.

Alongside their studies, Sixth Form pupils follow a programme of Enrichment that helps them prepare for life after school. Support for UCAS applications, careers sessions, University visits and life skills (such as personal finances and cooking) sit alongside this development that includes cultural trips to museums, residential trips abroad and personal skills (such as first aid qualifications).

Performing Arts

While we know that the core academic curriculum is important and we pride ourselves on our excellent examination results, we also place performing arts as having the same level of importance. For us, a school curriculum should champion the performing arts as a means of enriching the school experience of all children. From Drama classes through to Music, Music Technology and Dance, we place a great deal of emphasis on ensuring all pupils engage with creative subjects as this provides pupils with confidence, self-awareness, a sense of achievement and, above all else, enjoyment.

Alongside our performing arts curriculum, pupils have the chance to engage in a broad range of extra-curricular clubs (including Music Technology & Composition in the iMac Suite, Choir and various Dance classes) as well as working through their music examination grades with our visiting music teachers or signing up for the lead role in one of our Drama performances. Your child can learn to play the violin, the piano, guitar, drums, flute – to name just a few while they embrace their creativity, confidence and unearth their passion for performance.

Sport for All

Sport is a crucial part of life at Arnold Lodge as we believe that a breadth of experience and activities are vital to a rounded education. The main emphasis in the sporting life of Arnold Lodge is of participation and passion for sport; we strongly encourage inclusion and enjoyment of sport for all our pupils, whatever their ability.

Opportunities for sport at Arnold Lodge are abundant. We offer a wide range of sports from Reception through to Year 13 who are coached by a highly trained team with a specialist physical education department. Whether pupils enjoy traditional team sports such as netball, hockey and football or individual pursuits such as swimming, golf, squash or gymnastics, our sports curriculum offers a chance for all pupils to participate and represent their school community. Using world class facilities at the University of Warwick for swimming, athletics and hockey to developing links with local teams including the Old Leamingtonians rugby club, Leamington Tennis and Squash and Leamington Cricket Club, our pupils are encouraged to improve their skills and develop a life-long passion for sport.

We have competitive fixtures throughout the school and very high levels of participation see the majority of pupils given the opportunity to compete regularly. Through our sports curriculum and competitive sport, pupils develop their core skills of communication, creativity, critical thinking and collaboration reinforced with resilience, perseverance and hard work also develop as important parts of sport.

Extension & Enrichment: The ExEn Programme

Arnold Lodge has an extensive Extension and Enrichment Programme known as “ExEn”. Learning does not stop outside of the classroom and the ExEn programme sets out to give Arnold Lodge pupils access to experiences that are vital as part of a broad and rounded school experience.

Extension supports the school curriculum and sessions such as Problem Solving, Coding, Project Art and Junior/Senior Chef give the opportunity for pupils to stretch their learning. Extension sessions also give support and a boost for pupils who might need it with numeracy, literacy, EAL (English as an additional Language) and science booster sessions taking place across the whole school.

Enrichment broadens the scope of learning and offers a rich array of sessions for pupils to find their new passion. Furthermore, with sessions covering everything from chess, karate, horticulture, sign language, music production through to fencing, street dance, horse riding and ultimate frisbee, there’s sure to be an ExEn session to interest everyone.

The ExEn programme works in tandem with other opportunities such as Duke of Edinburgh or joining the Arnold Lodge Journalists as part of the BBC School Report, our ExEn sessions take place over lunch breaks and after school to provide a truly outstanding experience for our pupils.
