

HEAD OF DRAMA

Edgeborough School is seeking a highly motivated, passionate, and qualified Head of Drama to inspire children in our nurturing, caring and collaborative Prep Department, teaching across Year's 3-8. Applications will be welcomed from qualified teachers, or a professional interested in entering the profession.

The successful candidate will be welcomed into a highly collaborative partnership with the Head of Music, with the prospect to share a new vision for curriculum performing arts. They will also have the opportunity to build on our successful programme of plays, musicals and performance showcases, reviewing and refining our offering for a modern Prep School.

DRAMA DEPARTMENT AT EDGEBOROUGH

We are incredibly proud of our award-winning drama department. Last year, our Year 7 and 8 production of A Midsummer Night's Dream was named Best Play at the National School Theatre Awards. This year, we are nominated for two further categories and have been invited to perform at the awards ceremony, which takes place on a West End stage!

Edgeborough boasts a purpose-built theatre with tiered seating, The Dunbar Hall Theatre. This facility has a specific sound and lighting box equipped with high specification resources suitable for all performances.

This is a very exciting time for our community, with plans afoot for some significant developments, including the complete redesign of existing facilities to create a state of the art Performing Arts Centre.



OVERALL PURPOSE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Head of Drama is responsible to the Senior Deputy and Deputy Head, Academic. Our new Head of Drama should have great talent and flair, and should expect to:

- Oversee the teaching and delivery of drama across the whole school.
- Have responsibility for teaching drama to all pupils from Year 3 to Year 8.
- Develop excellence in performance skills, encouraging participation from pupils of all ages and abilities.
- Have responsibility for delivering extra-curricular drama opportunities for all pupils from Year 3 to Year 8, providing opportunities before school, during lunch and after school.
- Direct a successful series of musicals, plays, and showcase opportunities across a variety of age ranges.
- Build meaningful relationships and partnerships with relevant lead staff at Charterhouse.
- Accompany pupils to competitions, events and concerts.
- Plan and facilitate theatre trips and enrichment opportunities.
- Work closely with the Deputy Head, Academic, for the planning, growth and overall strategic development of Drama at Edgeborough, within and beyond the curriculum.
- Take on the role of form teacher or mentor/coach as requested by the Deputy Head, Academic.
- Generate and foster a genuine love of drama among all pupils.
- Be an inspirational and dynamic leader within the department.

- Support the development and maintenance of a clear strategic plan for Drama at Edgeborough.
- Ensure that those with a talent in this area of the curriculum are identified, supported and driven to achieve highly.
- Assist with the development and preparation of potential Drama scholars.
- Proactively look to further develop the existing relationships with Drama departments at Senior schools.
- Represent Edgeborough School at relevant association conferences and meetings.
- Manage and maintain teaching areas and equipment to facilitate stimulating learning environments which make effective use of available resources.
- Ensure that resources are accurately recorded, well cared for and economically used.
- Attend Department and Full Staff meetings as required.
- Mentor new staff as requested.
- Identify and request attendance at appropriate and targeted CPD opportunities in line with the School's development objectives.
- Be an outstanding and effective communicator.
- Enjoy the parent-school interface, and seek to build excellent relationships with parents through in-person and written communication.
- Deliver a broad and engaging performing arts programme across the School.

The teacher shall carry out the professional duties of a school teacher under the direction of the Head, and these shall include:

- Planning and preparing engaging and welldifferentiated lessons in accordance with the aims and objectives of the school and the programme of study.
- Teaching the pupils assigned to each class and being responsible for the welfare of the children for the time of the lesson.
- Ensure appropriate use of the resources available to promote pupil progress and well-being, including Teaching Assistants, the LEAP department and the School Listener.
- Maintaining good order and discipline amongst the pupils and safeguarding their health and safety whilst they are under your supervision.
- Taking responsibility for the pastoral care of the children in your form, liaising with staff and parents where necessary.
- Assessing, recording and reporting on the development, progress and attainment of pupils in accordance with procedures laid down.
- Maintaining a high level of communication with the parents of the children within your form, ensuring all are kept up to date with necessary information.
- Liaising with colleagues to ensure continuity of teaching and learning in each class.
- Supervising and, as far as is practicable, teaching any pupil whose teacher is not available to teach them.
- Assisting in the supervision of pupils before during and after school, as directed by the leadership team.

- To issue and monitor rewards and sanctions for pupils in your form, highlighting anomalies or concerns.
- Maintaining resources and displays in an ordered way and to a high standard.
- Participating in training, professional development and appraisal.
- To be responsible during a fire alarm for the supervision of the pupils of any class they are teaching out of the buildings and their subsequent registration.
- To be responsible for the organisation and supervision of pupils during relevant school trips in the manner laid out in the Staff Handbook.
- Participating in any meetings affecting the school and its pupils, as appropriate.



OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Adhere to the policies of the school, in particular policies relating to the safeguarding of children.
- Provide guidance and advice to pupils on educational and social matters.
- Undertake wider staff responsibilities, including covering of lessons and staff duties, as required.
- Contribute fully to the wider life of the school, including but not limited to, evening and weekend co-curricular activities, the sporting fixture programme, and boarding life at Edgeborough.

All staff are required to play their full part in the effective and efficient running of the school. This would include:

- Supervision duties.
- Carrying out any other duties which may be reasonably required by the Head.
- Stay informed about events, general school organisation and staff discussions by reading the minutes from whole school meetings and notices posted on electronic whole-school platforms.
- Take part in events that may be during the evenings or, occasionally, at weekends, within reason.
- Have a good working knowledge of whole school policies and aims.
- Promote the ethos, good name and reputation of the school at all times.
- Any other reasonable request made by the Department Head, Deputy Head or Head.
