Culture

We have an ethos of 'Culture Eats Strategy for Breakfast' – our positive culture is about the central mission of 'improving outcomes for all students'. Course information

Overview

During the Teacher Postgraduate Apprenticeship you'll benefit from lots of experience of on-the-job teaching, with 6 hours per week of your time dedicated to your own learning and development. The University of Staffordshire also give you bespoke support, assign you an academic mentor and work-based education officer, and welcome you to their wider community of trainee teachers. You'll plan engaging lessons, explore behaviour management techniques and discover how children develop and learn. By combining theory and practice, the apprenticeship will equip you to become a successful and confident teacher.

What will I achieve?

Upon successful completion of the apprenticeship, you will achieve:

- Recommendation of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS)
- Teacher Postgraduate Apprenticeship Certificate

Course content

The course is designed to combine university-based research-informed teaching and school-based experience, enabling the trainees to see how theory and practice are entwined. University days are designed to support the knowledge, skills, and behaviours required to meet the apprenticeship standards. Modules support individuals to engage with new professional and practice knowledge to inform their teacher development. Individuals will be supported by an academic mentor and work-based education officer to progress their application of new knowledge and skills in a teacher context.

Modules

- Teaching a Knowledge Rich Curriculum
- Educational and Professional Issues
- Teaching Practice (The Emerging to Established Teacher)

Delivery

This programme is delivered using a blended learning model including face-to-face sessions on campus, complimented by online webinars.

Assessment

Throughout the apprenticeship a variety of assessment methods could be used, these include:

- Written assignments
- Examinations
- Reflective activities
- Group assessments
- Presentations
- Professional discussions
- Academic assignments
- Critical analysis

Learning support

In addition to the excellent support you will receive from your course teaching team, the university's central Academic Skills team provides group and one-to-one help to support your learning in a number of areas. These include:

- study skills (including reading, note-taking and presentation skills);
- written English (including punctuation and grammatical accuracy);
- academic writing (including how to reference);
- research skills;
- critical thinking and understanding arguments; and
- revision, assessment and examination skills (including time management).
