HARROW INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL & INNOVATION LEADERSHIP ACADEMY (HAIKOU)

Harrow International School (HIS) and Harrow Innovation Leadership Academy (HILA) Haikou is a key project for the Hainan government as they transform Haikou into an international education hub. Harrow Haikou is the first world-renowned educational brand in the Province and will transform concepts of high-quality education across the region. Strategically located in Jiangdong District at the north of Jiangdong Avenue and south side of Linhai Third Road, Harrow Haikou provides K-12 international and bilingual education for foreign and local day and boarding students. Both schools opened in September 2020 with a maximum capacity of 1,800 students. The current phase of student admission will target children aged 2 –16 (Kindergarten to Year 11/ Grade

Central to our educational ethos is a commitment to foster the values of 'Courage', 'Honour', 'Humility' and 'Fellowship' in our students. Haikou campus covers an area of 96,673 m², with a total internal floor area of 71,167 m². The school is designed by world-renowned architecture firm Aedas and Harrow's specialists, introducing a fresh, modern approach to the traditional British architecture originated from 'Harrow on the Hill', with their renowned buildings in north London, using contemporary design concepts to create a truly British, 'Harrovian' environment, that beautifully echoes the style and culture of Hainan's unique architecture.

The school's design fully embraces Harrow's requirement to put the students first when considering facilities. The site provides a vibrant and creative atmosphere with garden landscapes partitioning shared areas. The generous space of the campus allows the students to explore their learning in a safe and clean outdoor environment, both within and extra to the curriculum. The semi-open design of the school buildings draws on the architectural features of Haikou's traditional 'balconies', allowing for the range of space types across the site makes the school unique.

Harrow Haikou represents an extraordinary step forward in bilingual and international education for boarding and day students in south-eastern China. The school will set a new benchmark for innovative, values driven holistic education in the region.

Through enquiry based learning and innovative use of technology, our pupils learn to take risks, develop key skills for the future and transfer knowledge from one subject to the next. The curriculum is delivered in both Chinese and English, supporting the pupils' language development. From a young age our pupils are immersed in the English language whilst also maintaining their mother tongue. Further up the school, the children are taught various subjects in either English or Chinese and cross curricular links are made between the subjects to allow our pupils to learn vocabulary in both languages in preparation for their exam years.

As a global family, the Harrow Schools work closely with each other as well as with our education team at headquarters to share best practice across the group. We also give our pupils the opportunity to engage and contribute to the history and traditions of Harrow UK. Our community is built on the Harrow core value of fellowship. Building strong relationships between our pupils, parents and staff, along with our family of schools and the local community, is vital to our success.

How we do it.

Together we are building a happy, proud and vibrant community where young Harrovians learn and develop to their full potential. Our qualified staff at Harrow Haikou are passionate about education and are determined to go above and beyond to support the pupils in their academic and personal development. HARROW BOARDING

Boarding is at the heart of what makes Harrow. Many Harrovians live in one of our 2 Boarding Houses during term time, going home at the weekend or during the half terms and holidays.

Boarding Masters/Mistresses and their families also live on-site. In this environment, there is a real sense of community, built around enriching, long-lasting relationships.

The Boarding House's primary function is to provide a place for pupils to rest, to relax, to do their prep and to socialise. Under the Boarding House Master/Mistress' leadership and with the support of numerous other pastoral specialists, the Boarding House underpins each child's personal and academic development, so that he or she is prepared to enjoy life and be of good influence after school.



Rather than being one single, distinguishable aspect of what we do, comprehensive and effective pastoral care underpins each Boarding students entire experience of Harrow. At its most straightforward, it equates to term-time parenting: guiding, directing, consoling and nurturing, as well as intervening more significantly in times of need. And yet, it is also about enabling each Harrovian to become the best possible version of themselves: considerate, perceptive and able to tackle life's challenges head on. Whilst the focus of pastoral care is in the Boarding House, many other people, programmes and platforms play their part too.



A good education enables young people to contribute to and thrive in society once their school days are over. Personal Development is at once the least tangible and the most important aspect. It cannot be examined nor certified, but instead presents itself in less obvious ways: morally, socially and culturally.

Our Values of courage, honour, humility and fellowship are at the heart of our approach.

Sending a young person to a boarding school is a huge decision for any parent and their child. At Harrow we are fully aware of the emotions involved in making the decision to board. BOARDING AT HARROW HAIKOU



At Harrow Haikou there are two boarding houses, The Grove and The Knoll, named after Harrow UK Houses and honouring the rich history and heritage of Harrow. Our Boarding Houses offer both full time and weekly boarding to boys and girls from Grade 5/Year 6



Full time boarding	Full time boarders will live on campus during term time, including weekends.
Weekly boarding	Board every weeknight; have weekends at home.





Boarding House Master/Mistress

The position of Boarding House Master/Mistress is one of significant importance and responsibility. It involves oversight of all aspects of the academic and personal life of each student and, as a result, the Boarding House Master/Mistress is the focal point for all communication about the students in the Boarding House with teachers and parents. The Boarding House is an ideal environment in which to encourage the development of the School's Leadership Attributes and building cohesive, supportive communities is essential to the School's continuing development. Staff are on a rota and help with the supervision of the Boarding House during the mornings and evenings. Jo Evans, Assistant Head, supports with the Boarding House structure and procedures.

BOARDING AT HARROW HAIKOU

As boarding is a key part of the experience we offer at Harrow, all staff, not just those with specific responsibilities in the Boarding House, will be expected to contribute to the development of the boarding community and support for our pupils who are resident on campus. Staff can contribute in a variety of ways, both during the week or at weekends; academic support, activities or accompanying students on trips and service activities. From knitting to basketball, yoga to volunteering at a giant sea turtle sanctuary, there is never a dull moment! Staff with families are encouraged to include them in boarding too, adding to our family focused approach. Weekly boarders are free to leave the Boarding Houses at the end of the school day from 4:00pm on Friday, returning either in time for bed on Sunday evening or for the start of School on Monday morning. Weekly boarders must be collected by a parent, guardian, driver or someone known to the Boarding House. A large proportion of weekly boarders remain until Saturday in order to benefit from additional schooling or sports coaching. A series of events and trips are

arranged for those boarders who remain in residence.



Wellbeing of our boarders

We emphasise to our students respect for each other, kindness and empathy. We insist that boarders do not exclude others through language or actions. Communication is key to a successful community and consideration for how people feel is vital. It is also important to know about commitments that impact boarding, so we request clear information about these matters.



At the heart of Harrow's educational philosophy are the development of the mind and an understanding of how an individual student learns best. The intellectual, social and ethical needs of our international students determine our educational requirements. In its curriculum development, always an on-going process, Harrow Haikou is forward thinking and innovative. We believe in a curriculum that has its foundations in intellectual content rather than assessment, important though that is. We aim to equip our students to think, appreciate and create, while always having the opportunity to excel.

> The Harrow curriculum consists of two distinct yet complementary strands, both of which seek to promote individual excellence and achievement. The examined curriculum guides the academic structure in both the Senior and Prep sections of the school; the focus being successful preparation of students for both IGCSE and A-level public examinations. In our selection of courses, we aim to provide subject material that will inspire students of all ages. The curriculum as a whole is well-balanced and provides the breadth to contribute effectively to students' academic and social attainment. Harrow Haikou aims to broaden the intellectual horizons of our students further through the non-examined part of the curriculum. Here we provide access to essential learning opportunities which may not otherwise be accessible to students in regular academic lesson time.



The Harrow Haikou curriculum is rooted in the English National Curriculum, but a vital focus is also given to the international dimension of the school. We never lose sight of the fact that we are a school in China and celebrate our host culture whenever possible.

Education at Harrow Haikou is a continual process of discovering, learning and maturing, as students, supported by their teachers and their parents, progress through the various key stages of their school life. Probably our greatest challenge as a school is to develop in our students the capacity for independent thought and action, and then combine this with rational and responsible decision-making.

We appreciate the value of many traditional teaching methods and we employ them with skill and enthusiasm, but we also believe that lessons are best taught when students are actively involved in a dynamic process of thinking, discovering, and understanding things for themselves. The way students learn is just as important as the way teachers teach. We therefore place an emphasis on interactive and co-operative learning, devising lessons that draw on the different knowledge, aptitudes and learning styles of individual students.

Classes are kept small and, as a result, each student receives the individual attention from the teacher that is essential in ensuring that necessary progress is made. The facilities and resources available support our educational philosophy at

all junctures.



Chinese Curriculum – International Approach

Our Harrow Innovation Leadership Academy curriculum for Grades 1 to Grade 9 is committed to ensuring excellence in delivery of the Chinese National Compulsory Education Curriculum, combining this with our unique HILA approach to holistic education – preparing students to excel academically and to succeed as global citizens.

Exclusively designed by senior education experts, the curriculum blends the best of East and West. Core subjects such as History, Geography, Chinese Language, Calligraphy and Culture and Moral Education are taught in Chinese, using the rigour of Chinese teaching methodologies. Subjects such as Biology, Chemistry, English Language, ICT, Mathematics, Physics, and together with co-curricular Arts and Design, Physical Education and Music offer an opportunity for acquiring bilingualism through by being delivered in English and supported in the Chinese





Students have the opportunity to sit a number of GCSEs based on their blended journey in Year 11 which allows for A-level study alongside CNC subjects in the 6th Form.

Students transition to the sixth form confident in both Chinese and English, well prepared academically and socially for entry to the very best universities globally. This approach, a first in China, ensures that students benefit from a world-class education which blends academic excellence with preparation for life and leadership.



With over 20 years' experience operating in Asia, the Harrow International Schools are independent day and boarding schools for students aged 18 months to 18 years. The age



range is broad, as is the representation of nationalities. This international diversity creates a dynamic learning environment. Helping to shape the character of all students regardless of age and nationality are the Harrow Values of Courage, Honour, Humility and Fellowship. These Values anchor the holistic educational approach that focuses on individual care and support to develop the whole person.





Harrow International Schools are equally renowned for academic excellence, the House System, and enrichment and service activities that produce

high-achievers with the leadership attributes and experiences that will serve them well throughout their lives and benefit the wider community tomorrow.



EARLY YEARS (TO AGE 5)

Our Harrow Little Lions Early Years Centre in each Harrow International School adopts the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) of the English National Curriculum encourages students to be curious, independent and happy. Children are able to develop creative thinking and essential life skills through an exciting, individualised curriculum that recognises that every child is unique. Children also benefit from lessons by specialists in Physical Education, Music, and Languages.



PRE-PREP PHASE (AGE 5 TO 10)

In Pre-Prep, children continue to develop essential literacy, numeracy and commuting skills. Emphasis is placed on the enjoyment of books and the teaching of reading and writing along with Mathematics and Coding. As they progress through Pre Prep, children are introduced to more specialist subjects in Languages, Music, Physical Education, Drama, Computing, Design Technology and Science.





PREP PHASE (AGE 10 TO 13)

Modelled on the best practices of British Preparatory Schools and international Middle Schools, our Prep Phase is a blend of specialist-taught core subjects such as English, Mandarin, Mathematics, Science and Coding, with additional subjects taught including; Art, Coding, Drama, Design Technology, Geography, History, Music and Physical Education. Students in Y6-9 study less subjects in Chinese, focusing on a Broad and Balanced "Prep" education. This leads to a broad range of options for GCSE and beyond into A-level.



THE SENIOR PHASE (AGE 13 TO 16)

Designed to build on the knowledge and skills developed in the Prep Phase, our Senior School curriculum is increasingly academically demanding, focusing students on national and international public examinations. Building towards their IGCSE examinations (usually taken in Year 11), students are intellectually stretched. Subjects taught include: Art, Biology, Chemistry, Computing, Design Technology, Drama, English, Geography, History, Languages, Mathematics, **Physics and Physical Education.**



THE SIXTH FORM (AGE 16 TO 18)

Following IGCSE examinations, students move into the 'Sixth Form' Phase of the School and prepare themselves for success at University. They complete a two-year suite of A-Level courses, that are regarded as the gold standard of the British education system and recognised worldwide for university entrance. The Sixth Form years are both challenging and exciting. Students have the opportunity to specialise in subjects they particularly excel at and study these areas to an advanced academic level. Many students complete an 'Extended Project Qualification' (EPQ) which allows for the development of research skills and the exploration of a topic of special interest in even greater depth. Students also have an opportunity to contribute to the management and leadership of the school by taking on key student positions of responsibility such as Prefect, Senior Prefect, Head Girl, Head Boy, Student Academic Leadership Team and the Student Council.







What is the difference between Harrow International School (HIS), Harrow Innovation Leadership Academy (HILA), Harrow Little Lions – I thought we were Harrow Haikou?

To answer this question, it is important to understand the way in which students are "allowed" to attend Harrow Haikou. You will hear about students on different educational licences (it is a very complex system) and that will determine which school they are enrolled in; however, broadly speaking:

• International Licence (ISL) – These students generally have an overseas passport, they may be

truly international or Chinese students holding for example a Canadian passport – these students will belong to the HIS.

• Private Licence (PL) – These students are Chinese nationals holding a Chinese passport and other required location documentation (think catchment area) and are within the compulsory years of education in China – Year 2 (G1) to Year 10 (G9) – these students will belong to the HILA.

So, if we are mixing international students and local students in the same class what do we teach?

Again, it is important to understand the Chinese context here. For compulsory years on the PL it is an EDB requirement to teach the full Chinese National Curriculum (CNC). For ISL students the school can determine its own curriculum. The EY has elements they must also cover as part of their licence.

As previously mentioned, Harrow Haikou has essentially 2 schools on 1 campus – fairly unique in the Chinese setting – and allows for the enrichment of both curricula. The development of creative,

innovative and problem-solving mind-sets, innovation, communication and leadership will be embedded in all aspects of Teaching and Learning (T&L)

Medium Term Plans (broad schemes of work) are continually developed to ensure that the CNC is fully incorporated, and that there are opportunities to blend in further

enrichment activities that align with our British / International background. This will set the conditions for success at GCSE / A-level and beyond. This could be delivered through extracurricular activities, and our strong pastoral system, and not simply through discrete subjects or activities. The interaction with other people from different countries / cultures offers a holistic education that is also a key component of our students' learning experience.

66 Do we teach GCSEs / A-levels to the Y10 and above?



Yes, we offer GCSE examinations at the end of Y11 and pathways to A-level study in the 6th Form years. The current MTPs have already considered what is required in the CNC and CIE GCSE specifications to ensure that students have the required knowledge and skills from earlier years to successfully enter Y11 and complete GCSEs.

I understand that local school education in China is more about learning facts for examinations, perhaps a different ethos from UK T&L?

Part of the journey our students will be on is learning how to learn in a different setting and in a broader way. Self-directed learning, choice, learning through experimentation / enquiry, applying knowledge and skills from one part of the curriculum to another – making those cross-curricular links will be critical. Essentially looking to move students from the lower to upper half of Bloom.







Our curriculum is broken down into English, Maths, Art, Science and Homeroom. However, we will be teaching half-termly 'topics' which will be cross-curricular and thematic, and we will therefore be working within our year group teams, and across year groups, to build in the relevant history, geography and guidance/PSHE lessons across all allocated English, Science, Homeroom and Art sessions.

What is our Early Years curriculum?





The EY curriculum is Harrow's own 'Little Lions' curriculum. This unique curriculum is based on the UK EYFS curriculum and blended with the Chinese curriculum. In Year 1/K3, there will also be an additional blend with the UK Primary National Curriculum alongside the Development Matters framework. This blend offers students a strong bilingual perspective in terms of language and culture, while also inspiring creative thinking through play.

Early Years is a very particular area of education in China – Pre Nursery (PreK) to Y1 (K3) – and has a special Kindergarten license with all students enrolled on the HLL license. In order to move into Y2, they will be required to transfer to the PL or ISL; if they are not eligible, they may not be able to

continue at Harrow Haikou.

What are Sports, Drama, Music and the Arts progammes?

Harrow Haikou offers an extraordinarily diverse range of competitive opportunities in team games, endurance sports, and other physical endeavours. Our performing arts enrichment programme teaches students performance skills. Every student will learn at least one musical instrument taught in dedicated practice rooms where students can join a variety of instrumental and vocal ensembles. Visual art is also an integral part of our education. The Upper School (Y6 upwards), led by Alex Ward. In the first few years, as we grow the numbers in the HIS and HILA to make them individually viable, we have been given dispensation from the Education Bureau (EDB) (like our local authority) to place them together in classes; therefore, the class will likely be a mix of licence types.



Each Harrow Agreement has important appendices that define the accountabilities for the operation of the individual school. AISL is the operating company for the Harrow International Schools, providing strategic oversight, co-ordination and quality assurance for the existing schools and establishing new Harrow International and Bilingual Schools.



There is significant interaction between the schools within the Harrow family, for instance:

- 1. Old Harrovians sit on the Governing Boards of all our schools.
- 2. At one time a former Head of one of the Harrow Foundation's London institutions, The John Lyon School, was Head of Harrow Bangkok.
- 3. A former Deputy Head of Harrow School (London) was the founding Head of Harrow Hong Kong and returned to London as Head Master of Harrow School (London).
- 4. A Master (Beak) taught mathematics at Harrow School for 16 years before going on to teach at all but one of the Harrow International Schools.
- 5. Graduating students from both Harrow School and The John Lyon School have worked in Harrow international schools as gap students.
- 6. A Year 9 student exchange takes place between Harrow International schools.
- 7. Selected students from all schools in the family attend Harrow School's, 'Family

Fifth Form Conference' each June; there is also an annual Family Ski Camp.

8. There are several annual inter-Harrow school student competitions (e.g., Coding, Mathematics, Swimming).

9. All newly appointed international Heads of School are inducted at Harrow School.

10. AISL senior management and all Harrow International school Head's work closely with the Harrow Foundation (London) throughout the year.

11. Several managers in schools in our family have moved to senior management posts in our newest schools last summer, including the founding Heads of Harrow Shenzhen and Harrow Haikou.

OTHER SCHOOLS IN THE HARROW ASIA FAMILY



Harrow Bangkok



Harrow Bangkok was the first Harrow International School, established in 1998. The school is situated on a spacious garden campus beside Harrow Lake, on the northern outskirts of the city. The campus boasts world class facilities for the day school, boarding, sport and creative and performing arts. Currently, Harrow Bangkok has over 1,600 students from Early Years to Year 13 from over 35 different nationalities including British, Thai, Chinese, Japanese.





Founded in 2005, building on the proven success of Harrow Bangkok, Harrow Beijing initially opened as a Secondary school with a clear brief to provide high-quality British based education and preparation for leading universities around the world.

In 2008, after four years of Harrow education, forty-seven students graduated, securing places in a range of strong universities in Britain, America, Canada and Australia. Satisfied that the founding mandate had been fulfilled and with the secondary school almost full, in August 2008 a Lower School site was opened.

In March 2013 a brand new, spacious, purpose-built site was opened, with outstanding facilities, including boarding.



Harrow Hong Kong



Harrow opened in Hong Kong in September 2012 on a spectacular site overlooking the Gold Coast of the New Territories. Harrow Hong Kong was the first day/boarding international school in Hong Kong to offer extensive facilities in an iconic setting.

Almost half of the students in the Upper School are weekly boarders. The school's roll is currently 1,300. The school has swiftly achieved outstanding academic success and provides a world class education and strong success in university placements.





Harrow Shanghai opened in August 2016 making it the most recent addition to the Harrow family. The school offers day and boarding education for students aged 2-18. Pre-Nursery to Year 10 opened in August 2016 on the newly-developed Sunland project in the Waigaoqiao Free Trade Zone, thirty minutes from the centre of Shanghai.

In August 2017 we expanded to Sixth Form with the establishment of Year.

Getting to know Haikou

Haikou (海口, Hǎikǒu) means 'Mouth of the Sea', and while sea trade remains relatively important, the buzzing provincial capital at the northern tip of Hainan is most notable for its booming construction. New and restarted projects are everywhere.

Haikou has a laid back vibe. Palm tree lined streets lead to lush green parks, and locals can be found relaxing with a cup of tea or coffee in the "Old Dad's Tea" shops, or enjoying a performance of traditional Hainan opera. There's plenty of great food eat, from restaurants with local Hainan specialties like rice noodles and salt baked chicken, to ones featuring dishes from every other part of China. Outdoor enthusiasts will enjoy climbing Haikou's volcano or swimming at Holiday Beach, while shopaholics will enjoy the many large modern malls that have recently opened here. Downtown has vibrant nightlife and many hotel pools offer a night swim under the stars.



Home to over two million residents, Haikou is the most populous city in the Chinese province of Hainan. The city enjoys some of the best air quality of any of China's major cities and since 1995 the city's local government has been working hard to improve the quality of life for its residents.

Haikou has a humid subtropical climate, falling just short of a tropical classification, with large monsoon influences. The rainy season is from May to October, with September seeing the heaviest rainfall and January being the driest month. The temperature here doesn't have too wide a range of fluctuation with the coldest month being January, where temps can get as low as 15C and with the hottest month, July, reaching up to 39C. Haikou is filled with Hainan cuisine classics with lots of chicken, duck, lamb, and seafood on offer. One of the most popular dishes is Wenchang Chicken, which is a whole boiled chicken cut up and then dipped in salt, ginger, and various other spices and served with rice. Other dishes popular in the area are Dongshan Lamb, Jiaji Duck, Hele Crab, and Li-style Rice. Each of these dishes have a specific way the meat has been handled before cooking, whether it is a special diet fed to the animal, requirements the animal be free-range, or having it soaked and marinated with watermelon or coconut before cooking. For delectable street food, the must stop place is Qilou Snack Street which has on offer a wide range of unique street food offerings and local delicacies.

Among the sites to see in Haikou, Xinglong Tropical Botanical Garden is a great place to see over 1200 species of plant, this botanical garden is focused on issues related to botany and environmental protection. Haikou is also near Mt. Wuzhi National Reserve, where you can find a wide range of rare animals and birds along with great views. The Hairui Tomb is a well-known point of interest for this city along with Qiongtai Academy to give insight into the history of the city. Southwest of Haikou city you will find the Volcanic Crater Park, this park has more than 40 volcanoes and is referred to as a natural geological museum. Haikou Arcaded Streets are known for being amongst the top historical and cultural streets in China, here you can find vendors with local crafts and delicious foods in a covered street setting.

Hainan cuisine originated from the central plains cuisine, but in the process of development, it has integrated the characteristics of Fujian and Guangdong cuisine, and absorbed the dietary characteristics of local ethnic minorities such as Li and Miao. At the same time, the unique geographical environment allows Hainan cuisine to absorb some southeast Asian flavours. Although Hainan cuisine absorbed various regional cuisines, it gradually formed its own unique style and flavour. In terms of food materials, Hainan cuisine includes seafood, fruits, with some wild herbs and other local specialty materials. The flavour is light and natural, which meets the dietary need of the local hot environment in Hainan.

You will find both excellent local dishes and a full range of international cuisine on offer at the restaurants and hotels in Haikou. This means the visitor has the choice of appetising snacks or something more familiar that they would choose if dining out in their home town. You need never go hungry in Haikou as there is something to please all palates!

Seafood restaurants in Haikou fall into two categories. One is the up-market variety where the decor and service is as much of the dining experience as the quality of the food. Such places are the Ruihua restaurant on Binhai Avenue and the Longquan Restaurant on Longkun South Avenue. These extra touches come at a price, so eating in these venues is rather more expensive. The alternative is the one on the roadside where you will see the seafood alive and kicking in the tank! This kind of restaurant is much more reasonably priced especially if it is merely your hunger you wish to satisfy. Popular venues in this category include those on Haixiu Middle Road and on Xinbu Island.



Hainan's four local specialties should not be missed.

The first one is Wenchang Chicken. The chicken recipe, originally found in Wenchang City of Hainan, has been handed down over many generations. The dish looks pleasing to the eye, and the special seasoning ensures that it is also very delicious.

The second is the Dongshan Mutton. With a black skin, the meat is fresh and tender and the soup is dense and savoury. It is prepared in several ways, stewed, roasted or cooked in coconut milk. All of them are worth trying.

The third one is Jiaji Duck. Initially the duck was bred in Jiaji Town of Qionghai City, hence its name. It can be cooked in various kinds of ways, but it is often best when it has been cut.

Finally, the Hele Crab is produced in Wanning County and Lezhen Town. Hele Crab is famed for its tough shell and fresh and tender meat. You can cook it by steaming, boiling, stir-frying or roasting. Steaming Hele crab is probably the best way as it gives full flavour and retains the shape of the crab. You will be amazed by this delicacy!

The most famous Chongqing style hotpot restaurants are in Haidian Erdong Road, Nanbao Road, and Baipol. Taguang Hotpot Restaurant at the junction of Haifu Avenue and Bailong South Road specialises in Hainan local hotpot and mutton hotpot. Hotpot restaurants in Longkun South Road mainly deal in Sichuan flavours.



Where to Eat in Haikou

Night markets first appeared in the Tang dynasty, however, it now refers to a market 'where people do business at night, vendors mainly sell groceries, food snacks, games and other items'. Night markets have become an important display window of urban characteristics. The night markets are an important tourist attraction in Hainan and an indispensable element in the daily life and culture of the residents. Hainan rice noodle is also very good and Indian Roti Prata is quite tasty. The Haikou Arcaded Snack Street is busy and a good place to experience food and culture.

<u>Airport</u>

The Haikou Meilan International Airport is Located 18 kilometres southeast of Haikou city, Hainan province, China, it is a class 4E civil transport airport and one of the important trunk airports in China. The easiest way to get there is to take taxi to get to the airport.

Train Station in Haikou

In Haikou there are three principle train stations:

Haikou Railway Station

Haikou Railway Station locates in Xiuying District, Haikou city, Hainan province, China. It is a second-class passenger and cargo Station under the jurisdiction of China Railway Guangzhou group Co., LTD.

Haikou East Railway Station

Haikou East Railway Station locates in Longhua District, Haikou city, Hainan province, China and you can get there by taxi.

Meilan Railway Station

Meilan Railway Station locates in Meilan district, Haikou city, Hainan province. Meilan airport station is 14 kilometres away from Haikou east station in the north, more than 50 kilometers away from wenchang station in the south, and only 320.7

meters away from Haikou meilan airport.

Buses in Haikou

Haikou has more than 40 bus routes, most of which operate between 6:00am to 23:00pm.



Meilan district, under the jurisdiction of Haikou city, Hainan province, is in the northeast of Haikou city. It is connected with Wenchang city in the east, Qingshang district in the south, Jiao long district in the west and Qinzhou strait in the north.

Meilan district is the seat of Hainan provincial party committee and government offices. It is the political, economic and cultural centre of Hainan province and the centre of Haikou city. As of January 2017, Melian district has jurisdiction over 9 streets of Bailong,

Baisha, Boai, Hadian, blue sky, Haifu road, Renmin road, Xinbu and Heping south, and 4 towns of Lingshan, Yanfeng, Sanjiang and Dazhipo, with a total of 53 communities and 53 villages.

The total population is 709,708. The total area is 581 square kilometres.

Corners Deli on Guomao Lu offers the biggest range. Cheese, meats, lots of tins, jars etc. Prices are considerably higher than at home, but the local markets are so cheap it balances out.
