



FUYUAN ORATORY SCHOOL (Shenzhen, China)

EAL Teachers required for beginning of August 2019

The Fuyuan Oratory School (formerly the Fuyuan British American School) is a new, collaborative venture between the Shenzhen Fuyuan School, China and The Oratory School, UK. The school runs both British and American curriculums and is looking to recruit EAL teachers for September, 2019. Teachers will be involved in delivering and assisting with the delivery of the secondary curriculum including ESOL IGCSE curriculum and preparing Sixth Form pupils for IELTS and TOEFL exams. Appointments will be made by The Oratory School, UK. For UK based applicants the application process will involve a visit to The Oratory, including the delivery of an observed lesson and an interview. For applicants already abroad the process will be completed via Skype.

The Fuyuan Oratory School is one of very few privately owned independent schools in China. There are currently in excess of 300 pupils in the school and class sizes do not exceed 25. The collaborative venture with The Oratory School, UK is an exciting new development and both pupils and teachers will have future opportunities to enhance their development through exchanges between the schools, as well as through a collaborative development of curriculum.

Requirements:

Shenzhen is a Tier 1 city in China, one of the most affluent and modern cities in the country, and is a short boat ride/train journey from Hong Kong. The Fuyuan Oratory School is looking to recruit EAL teachers who with the following key requirements:

- a Bachelor's degree
- 2 years English teaching experience OR have completed a 120+ hour TEFL/TESOL certificate OR have QTS.

GENERAL TEACHING DUTIES

The duties of a classroom teacher at The Fuyuan Oratory School include the following:

Teaching and learning:

1. To manage pupil learning through effective teaching in accordance with the Department's schemes of work and policies.
2. To ensure continuity, progression and cohesiveness in all teaching.

3. To use a variety of methods and approaches to match curricular objectives and the range of pupil needs and ensure equal opportunity for all pupils.
4. To set homework regularly, (in accordance with the departmental homework policy), to consolidate and extend learning and to encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own learning.
5. To work effectively as a member of the Department team to improve the quality of teaching and learning.
6. To set high expectations for all pupils, to deepen their knowledge and understanding and to maximise their achievement.
7. To use positive management of behaviour in an environment of mutual respect which allows pupils to feel safe and secure and promotes their self-esteem.

Professional standards and development:

1. To be a role model to pupils through personal presentation and professional conduct.
2. To arrive in class on or before the start of the lesson, and to begin and end the lesson on time.
3. To cooperate with the employer on all matters concerning Health and Safety and specifically to take reasonable care of their own Health and Safety and that of any other person who may be affected by their acts or omissions at work.
4. To be familiar with the School and Department handbooks and support all the School's policies.
5. To establish effective working relationships with professional colleagues and associate staff.
6. To consider the needs of all pupils within lessons (and to implement specialist advice) especially those who: Have SEN; are gifted and talented; are not yet fluent in English.
7. To uphold the ethos of the school, including its emphasis on pastoral care for individual pupils.

Teaching hours: 22 periods (40 min per period) per week. Teaching hours - Monday-Thursday: 8am-12noon & 2pm-5:30pm, Friday: 8am-12noon. Occasional evening duty requirement.

Benefits:

- free accommodation and meals;
- transport provided to and from school;
- all meals provided while on duty in the school;
- usual Chinese school and public holidays (including 4-week Spring Festival holiday and 6-week summer holiday) as well as additional 1 week holiday at Christmas;
- reimbursement of air ticket and Visa fee arisen in China for each full year of service;
- annual free tour;
- accident insurance

Salary:

23,000RMB or above per month for 10 months (depending on teaching experience),
14,000RMB per month for the other 2 months of Spring Festival holiday (February) and summer holiday (July), with additional remuneration for any additional hours.
