ABOUT THE WOODVALE PRIMARY ACADEMY

About our Academy

Woodvale Primary Academy is a two-form entry community academy where we cater for children from the age of 4 to 11. We provide three phases, Foundation Stage for Nursery and Reception; Key Stage 1 for Years 1 and 2; and Key Stage 2 for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6.

Our Nursery is a 39 place unit where we offer morning and afternoon sessions. In school we presently have 14 classes altogether. Each year group has two parallel classes. We have a well-qualified and dedicated teaching and support staff team.

At Woodvale Primary Academy, we have three core values that underpin everything we do:

Be Safe Be Kind Be Responsible

We enjoy taking **responsibility** for improving our **knowledge** and **creativity** by developing our **confidence** as independent learners. We demonstrate enthusiasm about **belonging** to a caring, **respectful** community which promotes **honesty** and **co-operation**. We challenge ourselves to show ambition because we are **determined** to be the best we can be!

House Teams

The academy has four house teams; Boughton, Lamport, Sulgrave and Althorp. Our children are taught to be respectfully competitive and work hard both academically and socially to achieve merits and house points. The House Championship trophy is awarded at the end of each academic year to the house with the most points. All pupils in the winning house also get an end of year treat.

The Facilities

Woodvale Primary Academy offers excellent learning facilities in a modern building including a library/ICT suite. Extensive grounds enable us to provide different outside learning environments including a trim trail and a wildlife area with local woods within a short walking distance. Our Early Years and KS1 outdoor areas have just been extended to give the children extra space.

The Curriculum

We have a good curriculum provision. The curriculum is well balanced and provides challenge to meet the needs of all pupils. The pupils access a wide variety of learning opportunities which develop key skills. The curriculum promotes spiritual, moral, social, cultural development along with core British values.

Training and Development

All staff, regardless of role, benefit from a wide range of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) opportunities. The academy promotes the CPD of all staff so that they contribute, as much as possible, to the education of our pupils and to the continuous development of the academy. As part of Greenwood Academies Trust, all staff have access to a wider range of development opportunities and because of the diverse staff across the Trust there is always someone you can call upon for advice and support to develop personal practice. In addition to informal support throughout our academy, the Greenwood Learning Alliance offers a wide range of formal CPD opportunities to provide numerous courses and workshops. All new staff receive a comprehensive induction and can be assured of regular, continuous, high calibre professional opportunities.

The Community

Working together with our community is important to us and we are always grateful for voluntary help which supports the teaching we do in the academy. We regularly send out newsletters to keep parents and carers informed of events that are happening and all are invited to attend events which run throughout the year including celebration assemblies, sports days and termly hot dog nights.

We have a family support worker who is available for advice, guidance and support on a range of issues that may affect children and their families, and also have a Community Hub that is open on Thursdays from 9-11am for parents, carers and pre-school children to come along for a tea/coffee, biscuits and a chat.


I strongly like this academy especially as my children started part way through the year. The academy and staff really made my children feel welcome.
