Well done Year 9!
















#### **Oak Forest School**

We encourage students to continue learning Pixton from home. They simply need to login to https://www.pixton.com/ and remember to "Sign in with Microsoft".
















# Reading raises cash for children's hospitals!

Years 7, 8 & 9 students were invited to take part in the Read for Good Readathon this term. The sponsored read began on Monday 14th June and ended on Sunday 27th June. All students received a Sponsor Card and were able to choose their own reading material for the two week challenge, asking friends, family and neighbours to donate online at readforgood.org/sponsor, or paying by cheque. Every penny raised contributes towards funding a resident storyteller to every major children's hospital in the UK as well as a supply of brand new books for the college library.

It's been proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives (OECD). The charity Read for Good encourages children to read through its unique



motivational approach inspiring reluctant readers to give reading a go, and keen readers to read more widely. Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audio books to blogs - they are not being assessed, it's all about reading for fun.
