Job Purpose

The KS2 Primary School Teacher will deliver a high-quality, engaging curriculum that fosters the academic, social, and emotional development of children in Key Stage 2. The role requires expertise in developing students' reading comprehension, writing, mathematical reasoning, and broader subject knowledge, ensuring each child is supported and challenged to achieve their full potential in a nurturing and inclusive environment.

Main Responsibilities

- Plan, prepare, and deliver a stimulating Key Stage 2 curriculum, following the English National Curriculum and supplementary programmes (e.g., Talk for Writing, Maths No Problem).
- Develop students' reading fluency and comprehension skills, fostering a love of literature and critical thinking through high-quality texts.
- Strengthen mathematical reasoning and problem-solving skills, ensuring students develop confidence and fluency in applying key concepts.
- Use creative and structured strategies to support English language proficiency in EAL learners while maintaining their access to the full curriculum.
- Assess, record, and report on students' progress, attainment, and development, using assessment to inform planning and individualised support.
- Set clear, ambitious targets for each child, building on prior knowledge and skills.
- Provide and contribute to oral and written assessments, reports, and references for individual students and groups of students.
- Collaborate with specialist staff to support the holistic development of each child, including social, emotional, and physical growth.
- Ensure the health and safety of children and staff is maintained during all activities, both inside and outside the classroom.
- Work in partnership with parallel classes and other teachers to ensure consistency, shared resources, and equal opportunities for all students.
- Foster strong relationships with parents and carers, providing opportunities for engagement and involvement in their child's learning journey.
- Guide and support Teaching & Learning Assistants (TLAs) to ensure they are effectively involved in supporting student learning.
- Participate in continuing professional development (CPD) and keep up-to-date with current pedagogy, including advancements in literacy, mathematics, and enquiry-based learning.



- Actively contribute to school-wide initiatives, departmental and staff meetings, and the implementation of the school development plan.
- Demonstrate and maintain a commitment to safeguarding, inclusion, and the school's overall ethos.
