

Job Description: Curriculum Leader Engineering

Teaching, learning and assessment

- 1. Lead the team responsible for the delivery of Engineering Apprenticeships.
- 2. Lead by example in teaching consistently good and better lessons to ensure excellence in subject pedagogy and the quality of teaching, learning and assessment.
- 3. Take responsibility for the learner experience, for example, retention; attendance; achievement; destinations; added value; learner satisfaction.
- 4. Take responsibility for the development of high-quality learning resources that can be shared within the team and where appropriate across the college.
- 5. Use a variety of formative and summative assessment methods ensuring that learners understand the purpose of assessments.
- 6. Provide timely and constructive feedback to learners and employers to support and inform their learning.
- 7. Take responsibility for personal and professional development in order to plan and deliver high quality teaching in both practical and theoretical lessons.
- 8. Maintain comprehensive, up to date student/ course/ subject records and provide information as requested.
- 9. Ensure close liaison and good communications with other staff in matters concerning learners
- 10. Identify and put in place intervention activity where necessary to enable learners to achieve their full potential.
- 11. Value and support learners to achieve their full potential.
- 12. Deal promptly and effectively with inappropriate learner behaviour in class and across the campus.

13. Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement

- 14. Use College systems effectively to track and communicate student progress in a timely manner.
- 15. Be responsible and participate in standardisation, verification and moderation as required.
- 16. Working with the Head of Division ensure continuous professional development activities are appropriately planned, support the development of the team's subject pedagogy to reflect the curriculum development aims for the division.
- 17. Work with the Head of Division and quality team to ensure the team complies with all college quality processes in the quality cycle.
- 18. Be responsible for the appropriate administration of exam entries for the course and subject.
- 19. Work closely with the quality team with external awarding bodies regarding quality visits
- 20. Delegated responsibility for student disciplinary meetings (stage 2) where appropriate.
- 21. Conduct staff reviews including Key Goals where appropriate









22. Curriculum Development

- 23. Work with the Head of Division for Work-based Learning and Apprenticeships and the Head of Apprenticeship Sales and Recruitment to actively develop new apprenticeship opportunities for that are responsive to local and regional economic demands.
- 24. Work collaboratively with Head of Division Workbased Learning and Apprenticeships and Head of Division for Engineering to ensure classroom based off-the-job training is responsive to employer requirements and satisfies the requirements of apprenticeship standards.
- 25. Support the development and maintenance of positive relationships with external organisations to enable the generation of new work and identification of opportunities for development.
