Job Title: Teacher of Mathematics and Engineering

Reporting to: Member of the Leadership Team

PURPOSE

- To provide innovative and inspirational Mathematics and Engineering Teaching.
- To contribute to the development of the Mathematics and Engineering Faculty as a leading centre of educational excellence where young people are offered outstanding learning opportunities in Engineering.
- To contribute to the wider development of the School.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACCOUNTABILITIES

A. Teaching

- 1. Teach students according to their educational needs, including the appropriate setting and marking of work to be carried out by the student in the School and elsewhere.
- 2. Experience in engineering subjects including electrical and mechanical, programming and product design.
- 3. Assess, record and report on the attendance, progress, development and attainment of students and to keep such records as are required.
- 4. Provide, or contribute to, oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual students and groups of students.
- 5. Ensure that ICT, Literacy and Numeracy are reflected in the teaching/learning experience of students.
- 6. Ensure a high quality learning experience for students, which meets internal and external quality standards.
- 7. Prepare and regularly update subject materials.
- 8. Use a variety of delivery methods, which will stimulate learning appropriate to student needs and demands of the syllabus.
- 9. Maintain discipline in accordance with the School's procedures, and to encourage good practice with regard to punctuality, behaviour, standards of work and independent learning.
- 10. Undertake assessment of students as requested by external examination bodies, departmental and School procedures.
- 11. Mark and grade student work and give written/verbal and diagnostic feedback as required.

B. Pastoral System

- 1. Be a Tutor to an assigned group of students.
- 2. Promote the general progress and well-being of individual students and the Tutor Group as a whole.
- 3. Liaise with a Pastoral Lead to ensure the implementation of the School's Pastoral System.
- 4. Register students, accompany them to assemblies, encourage their full attendance at all lessons and their participation in other aspects of School life.
- 5. Evaluate and monitor the progress of students and keep up to date student records as may be required.
- 6. Contribute to the preparation of Action Plans and progress files and other reports.
- 7. Alert the appropriate staff to problems experienced by students and to make recommendations as to how these may be resolved.
- 8. Communicate as appropriate, with the parents of students and with persons or bodies outside the School concerned with the welfare of individual students, after consultation with the appropriate staff.
- 9. Contribute to the spiritual, moral, social and cultural wellbeing of students according to the School policy.

10. Other responsibilities

- 11. Be an outstanding practitioner and to undertake a teaching commitment depending on the needs of the School.
- 12. Attend School meetings and committees as required.
- 13. Provide assessment information and reports for parents/carers in line with School policy.
- 14. Contribute to the School's Enrichment programme, including a willingness to participate in occasional overnight visits.
- 15. Undertake such other duties as are commensurate with the post and which may reasonably be required by the Principal.
