About the School

The British Schools of Montevideo was founded in 1908 as a joint initiative between The British Cemetery Society and The Anglican Church to establish an English school in Montevideo with "the object of giving children a complete education, both intellectual and moral, based upon the ideas and principles of the best schools in The British Isles".

The School is organised as a private, not for profit, coeducational, secular day school, which aims to provide an excellent bilingual education that blends the Uruguayan national curriculum with a strong English language programme, and where students sit for both the Cambridge IGCSE Exams and the IB Diploma. The School offers an exciting academic environment in which all members of the community strive to instil a love of learning, preparing students to meet the challenges of the 21st century.

The British Schools' is led by Mr Simon Roberts who is overall Principal and is governed by a Board of Governors elected by The British Schools Society, whose Honorary President is the British Ambassador to Uruguay.

LOCATION

Located in the suburbs of Montevideo, in the residential area of Carrasco, the School site encompasses the Early Years Centre (EYC), Junior School, Senior School, Auditorium (seating capacity 400), Cafeteria, Sports House, Pavilion, Playing Fields, Hockey, Rugby, Football pitches, a synthetic Hockey pitch, multipurpose synthetic pitch, outdoor Tennis Courts, Basketball Court, Gymnasium (1654m2) and Open-Air Swimming Pool.

Parents are drawn to the School by its challenging bilingual programme, strong traditions, and solid set of values. The School programme is academically rigorous while also involving an open scope of extracurricular offering and a holistic approach based on individualised learning experiences.

Over the years, through their achievements and contributions to society, graduates from The British Schools have become renowned leaders in the local and international community. At every level of society, they have exercised influence by applying the knowledge, skills and values acquired during their formative years at the School.



Early Years

The first years of pre-school are of the utmost importance for the development of the child, therefore, we strive to help students develop into happy, confident, inquiring individuals who are interested in life and enthusiastic about the challenges they encounter. We empower our children to take a leading role on their lifelong learning journey, fostering their natural curiosity.

The Early Years Centre provides facilities for students in Pre-Kinder (3 to 4-year-olds), Kinder (4 to 5-year-olds) and Prep (5 to 6-year-olds). Designed with the future needs of the youngest students in mind, the four-storey state-of-the-art building includes classrooms with differentiated learning centres, an age-appropriate multimedia projection centre, and a hall/mini theatre with ample space for collaborative work, a psychomotricity area, a Library, an art studio and many other child-friendly "nooks" to arouse curiosity, creativity and encourage positive interaction, through play.

OUTDOOR LEARNING

Being outdoors is core to the learning experience at The British Schools. The green of our beautiful gardens and fields makes our School an ideal place for developing students with outdoor skills and a lifelong connection with nature and our planet.

Providing immersive and adventure-like experiences of the natural world allows students to improve their coordination, strength and critical thinking, encouraging their physical and mental fitness whilst promoting emotional and social skills.



Junior

The Junior Learning Programmes blend together key aspects of an adapted British and Uruguayan curriculum, delivered within the innovative and inquiry-based framework of the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP). At all year levels, in addition to the Form Teacher and the Spanish Teacher, full-time specialist teachers instruct and guide students in the areas of Music, Art, Drama, Dance, ICT, Library Skills, Values and Physical Education. Educational trips and School assemblies serve to broaden students' horizons as well as to provide opportunities to emphasise aspects of the School's Community Commitment Programme.

The Junior curriculum promotes an awareness of different learning styles in order to cater for the individual needs and talents of each student. The School expects all students to become fully bilingual in English and Spanish. All curricular subjects are taught in English, with the exception of Spanish classes and Physical Education classes.

Senior

The Senior School provides facilities for students from Y7 (12 to 13-year-olds) to Y12 (17 to 18-year-olds). In addition to classrooms, these facilities include a Library Resource Centre, ICT Labs, Mobile Device Labs, Science Labs, Music Rooms, Technical Drawing Room, Visual Arts Room as well as a Multi-Purpose Room. There are also student break-out spaces, a Staffroom and Administration offices.

Every Senior student is expected to complete both the Uruguayan National Programme and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, thus allowing them entry into national or international universities. Prior to the IBDP, the students sit for IGCSE exams. The purpose of the taught curriculum is to encourage students to become successful learners, confident individuals, effective contributors, and responsible citizens – as elaborated in the attributes of the IB Learner Profile.

Beyond the Classroom

At The British Schools, education is not only limited to the academic sphere. Extracurricular activities play a vital role in shaping a well-rounded student. These activities offer students opportunities to explore their interests, develop valuable skills and foster personal growth besides providing a platform for social interaction, teamwork, and self-expression. Extracurricular activities include musical productions, Model United Nations, Robotics, Choir, Karate, Scottish Dancing, Maths Olympics, Tennis, various sports. To enhance this offering, the School is constantly seeking ways to further develop and increase the programme in order to appeal to all students.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS

The Physical Education curriculum at The British Schools begins in Kindergarten and extends through to Y10 in Senior School. The programme of activities is age appropriate, with an additional focus on values formation.

Sports at The British Schools have a long and respected history. Today, our main games are rugby for boys, and hockey for girls. However, this is not all we play. Boys and girls compete with other schools in football, basketball, handball, volleyball, cross country and athletics.

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT PROGRAMME

At The British Schools we understand that educating hearts and minds necessarily implies developing in our students a sense of social responsibility and the drive to actively engage and contribute to our community. The Community Commitment Programme is a Whole School philosophy initially sparked in Junior and continued throughout Senior, focused towards generating awareness on different issues that happen around the world and in our surrounding community. It emphasises the importance of students, staff and families coming together and acting upon these issues.
