ROLE OVERVIEW

We are seeking a Workshop Facilitator to run a series of personal development workshops during an Easter Revision programme aimed at students in Years 10 - 13. The workshops run daily, Monday - Friday, and cover three main themes:

- study skills
- professional skills
- personal wellbeing

These workshops are to provide information and support for students going through the exam period, as well as preparing them for life beyond school, whether that's going to university or entering the world of work. An outline of workshop content will be provided; however, the Workshop Facilitator is expected to adapt the sessions plans to the students' needs and to compile relevant resources.

Workshops run for 3 weeks (Mon-Fri) and bank holidays are operational days.
