Curriculum

Key Stage 4

The Faculty offers Business Studies as a BTEC Tech Award. In year 9 pupils who have opted for Business are taught the bridging skills and knowledge that are required for Component One and then undertake the three coursework submissions for this component. The subject is very popular at key stage four and is delivered by subject specialists.

Key Stage 5

The Faculty offers a wide range of A-level courses which include Economics, Law, Psychology and Sociology. In addition, at Level 3 BTEC is offered in Business Studies and Health & Social Care (single and double award).

The Faculty will start to deliver WJEC Criminology from September 2019. The Sixth Form has over 250 students and the Social Science Faculty makes a significant contribution in the courses that are offered post-16.
