

## Reed's School Job Description TEACHER OF HISTORY

Reed's School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

## The Role and Department:

The History Department consists of four full time Teachers.

The Department is housed in a very modern building on the school site and is very well resourced with three fully functional classrooms and a departmental office.

Trips are an integral part of our studies. Day or residential trips are arranged for many year groups, and all members of the department take a full part in the planning and running of trips. 33 pupils went to Berlin in October 2017 and planning is underway for a similar trip in 2019. Every year we take our entire Year 9 cohort to the battlefields of the Great War.

History is taught throughout the school and is a popular subject. All pupils at Key Stage 3 take the subject and over half of Year 9 pupils opt for iGCSE each year (our board is CIE). History A Level (AQA) is consistently among the most popular option choices for our Sixth Formers. The Department has enjoyed significant examination success in the past and a number of students each year go on to university to read History or related subjects.

All members of the Teaching staff are involved in the school's tutorial and pastoral systems and are expected to be involved in the Activities Curriculum provided to the pupils.

## Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- Teach History from Year 7 to Year 13 or as required by the Head of History.
- Be an outstanding classroom practitioner with a passion for History and learning.
- Provide support to the Head of History and work cooperatively within the departmental team.
- Be familiar with the aims and objectives of the department as outlined in the departmental handbook.

- Assist the Head of History with the development of schemes of work and assessment materials.
- Keep records of marks achieved in preps and tests by the pupils.
- Attend suitable INSET as required under the guidance of the Head of History.
- Participate in History Activities outside the classroom as required by the Head of History.
- Promote History as a subject.
- Undertake such other comparable duties as the Headmaster requires from time to time.
- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons for whom you are responsible and with whom you come into contact.
