Main Purpose of the Role

The Teacher of Music will be responsible for planning and delivering highquality and inspiring lessons across Key Stage 3, 4, and post-16. This includes teaching KS3 Music, AQA GCSE Music, RSL Level 2 Music Practitioners, and RSL Level 3 Music Practitioners.

This is an exciting opportunity to join a vibrant and forward-thinking music department, working alongside two other enthusiastic music teachers with the opportunity to collaborate with the other music departments within the In Toto Ed Group of schools.

In Toto Ed currently benefits from two fully equipped music classrooms and will soon be expanding into a third dedicated space, reflecting our continued growth and commitment to creative arts education.

The Music department is well-resourced, featuring a suite of Macs, a live music space, and a range of instruments to support practical music-making and high-quality teaching. The department has a strong track record of supporting students to progress into Higher Education through music-related pathways, including performance, production, and music technology.

The successful candidate will be a confident performer and skilled teacher, passionate about inspiring young musicians through performance, composition, and production. They should also have strong technical skills and be proficient in Logic Pro, using it to support students in developing their creative and production abilities.

This role is central to the In Toto Ed's vision of providing a nurturing and inclusive environment that encourages creativity, self-expression, and a lifelong love of music.

Key Responsibilities and Duties

Teaching and Learning

 Plan and deliver engaging and differentiated music lessons across KS3-5, in line with In Toto Ed's curriculum, policies, and schemes of work.



- Deliver practical, performance-based, and theory-based sessions using a range of resources and technology, including digital audio workstations, live instruments, and recording equipment.
- Model confident performance skills to inspire students, including leading ensembles, bands, or solo demonstrations.
- Teach music technology using Logic Pro to support composition, recording, and production work at all levels.
- Ensure progression in students' musical understanding, performance, and compositional skills through creative and structured learning experiences.
- Set clear, measurable learning objectives and use assessment data to inform future planning and target setting.
- Maintain high expectations for behaviour and establish a positive and productive learning environment in classrooms and performance spaces.
- Keep accurate records of assessment, attendance, and progress; report regularly to parents and carers.
- Write reports, contribute to grade tracking, and attend parents/carer evenings as required.

Wider School Responsibilities

- Contribute to the enrichment and wider school community through extracurricular activities, performances, and music clubs.
- Support school events such as concerts, showcases, assemblies, and community performances.
- Follow In Toto Ed's safeguarding and child protection policies.
- Collaborate effectively with colleagues across departments and with external partners such as visiting musicians or community organisations.
- Ensure all resources, instruments, and technology are maintained, stored, and used safely in line with Health and Safety procedures.
- Take responsibility for developing a specific area of the music curriculum and sharing updates at department meetings.

Additional Duties

- Attend departmental and standardisation meetings.
- Contribute to the development and refinement of schemes of work and resources.
- Undertake the role of a form tutor when required.
- Support the department's public performances and examination preparations.
- Cover for absent colleagues and support supervision and invigilation duties when necessary.

- Experience teaching or leading AQA GCSE Music and RSL Level 2 and Level 3 Music Practitioners courses.
- Strong classroom and rehearsal management skills.
- Ability to inspire and engage students through creative teaching and performance-based learning.
- Effective communication and organisational skills.
- Commitment to ongoing professional development and collaboration within the wider Creative Arts team.
- A passion for supporting students of all abilities, including those with special educational needs.
