ABOUT US

Entrance to the School is by competitive examination and the School values its excellent academic reputation. The students are highly motivated and eager to learn. Significant emphasis is also placed on the broad and balanced curriculum, the wide-ranging co-curricular activities and the caring and supportive environment.

The ISI regulatory compliance inspection in September 2016 recorded that all eight parts of the standard were met and our report in the Good Schools Guide 2016 describes our "Excellent results achieved with a big dollop of humour, humanity and freedom of thought".

The October 2019 Inspection report said of the School community: "The quality of the pupils' academic and personal development is excellent. The pupils have high levels of attainment which are reflected in their performance in public examinations". They also commented that, "Pupils demonstrate strong self-knowledge, self-esteem, self-confidence, self-discipline and resilience, so that they are well prepared for the next stage of their lives".

The staff are thoroughly professional, highly qualified and knowledgeable, enthusiastic and passionate, support and have an appreciation of the breadth of the educational experience that is provided.

The school is characterised by a warm and welcoming atmosphere and mutually supportive approach. Expectations of staff are high but equally, personal workloads are carefully considered by the Senior Leadership Team. 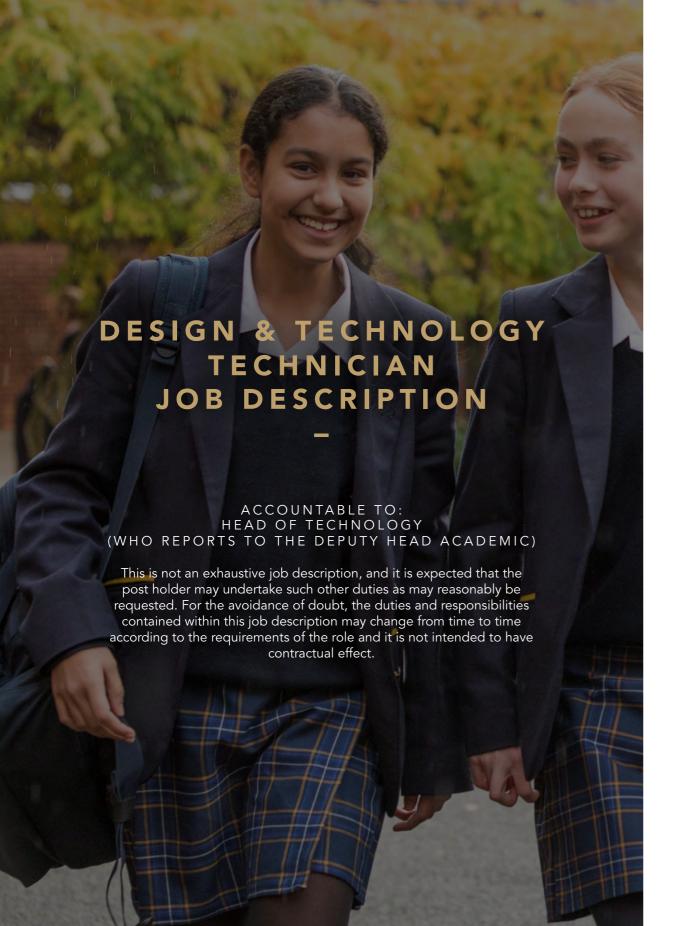

JOB PROFILE

To be responsible for the ordering, maintaining and preparation of machinery, equipment and materials used in the department, under the oversight of the Head of Department, as well as assisting in the supervision of the students as required.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Planning and Development

Take responsibility for the ordering, servicing, maintaining and preparation of machinery, equipment and materials as required by the D&T teachers.

Prepare resources for use in lessons including specialist equipment.

Help prepare the annual D&T budget request, providing support for the Head of Department.

Keep account of the D&T Department expenditure, ensuring that it stays within budget.

Manage stock levels and the routine ordering of departmental materials.

Prepare workshops and studios for lessons.

Manage storage of equipment and materials to ensure they are ready for use at all times.

Supporting Staff and Students

Support the aims, ethos, policies and development plans of the school.

Support cover staff in D&T lessons when teachers are absent, as required.

Provide technician support to the D&T teachers, assisting them as required and helping to supervise students in D&T lessons.

Form good relationships with staff, students, suppliers and others.

Health & Safety

Assist in the safe disposal of materials and outdated stock.

Ensure that all aspects of the department and school's Health & Safety policy are implemented.

Carry out daily visual inspections of all machinery.

Carry out weekly safety check as directed by relevant legislation.

Undergo training as required, with safety as the paramount objective at all times.

Work flexibly within the school, being available to help the other Technicians and other Support Staff, when there is capacity to do so.
