- Establish a safe and stimulating environment for pupils, rooted in mutual respect
- Demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values and behaviour which are expected of pupils
- Demonstrate effective use of assessment to monitor student progress and provide feedback to students to help them to improve
- Demonstrate a clear understanding of the needs of all pupils, including those with special educational needs; those of high ability; those with English as an additional language; those with disabilities; and be able to use and evaluate distinctive teaching approaches to engage and support them
- Have high expectations, clear rules and routines for behaviour in classrooms, and take responsibility for promoting good and courteous behaviour both in classrooms and around the school, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy.
