## **GCSE**

In Geography and RE we study the new AQA courses; in History, Edexcel. Students must study Geography or History and RE at Key Stage 4. Pass rates in all three subjects are significantly above the national average.

### A-Level

We follow the AQA course in Geography, and OCR courses in History and Philosophy and Ethics. Numbers are buoyant and results are historically strong.

#### Enrichment

Extra-curricular activity is an essential part of Geography across all key stages. The department has organized trips to the Lake District, Dorset coastline and Epping Forest; in addition to other school-based and local scale fieldwork. We also have a very active Sixth Form, with Geographers running a popular Geography Society.
