General Duties

In addition to his/her particular teaching within the departments, the successful applicant will be expected to take a full and active part in the life of the school as far as this is possible.

The school day is split into 2:2:1 periods with five 60 minute lessons and an afternoon tutorial session. The school operates a two week timetable. Staff with no management responsibilities teach 42 periods per fortnight and Faculty Leaders teach 38 periods.
