Through our strong pastoral care and guidance, we will instill St Michael's core values and support your child's personal growth and social development.



Communication:

We feel that communication between school and home is key in making sure our students flourish and fulfil their potential.

Our communication strategy aims to provide the flow of two-way information, keeping you informed of what is going on in school, as well as parents being able to communicate with us on a regular basis. We ensure parents are kept up to date with latest information through:

Every student has a planner to support individuals with their organisation, where parents can monitor their child's homework and maintain contact with school. Homework is set to supplement learning in the classroom and enhance student progress; all students will be expected to record this in their planner, whether their homework is paper based or online.

Form tutors, Heads of Year and the Pastoral Team are there to ensure that each student is happy, safe and thriving in all aspects of their school life. Attendance and high achievement go hand in hand, and we are committed to working alongside parents to ensure any absence is kept to an absolute minimum.

Student Voice

At St Michael's, we believe consultation with students is integral to nurturing responsible, collaborative and pro-active young people. Student Voice was launched in 2012 and is a non-elite group, consisting of around 100 members. 

Love of learning

Staff at St Michael's are committed to delivering the highest quality of lessons to our students. We know that excellent teaching ensures excellent student outcomes. We have a dedicated team of practitioners who use strategies steeped in educational research within the classroom that result in students making strong progress.

We are incredibly proud of the first class learning experiences students receive at St Michael's. We structure learning to excite our students' curiosity and to inspire them to become successful, lifelong independent learners. Our teachers are extremely enthusiastic and passionate about their subjects, spending considerable time planning high quality learning experiences, communicating their passion for their subjects to the students.

We are fortunate to have a high quality learning environment, including our purpose-built drama studio, music rooms and extensive sport facilities support our varied extracurricular programme.

Our vibrant and welcoming library supports learning throughout the school, catering for a range of reading abilities and includes an impressive range of reading genres. We aim to engender a genuine love for reading and excitement about learning in every child at St Michael's. Our approach to literacy is centred around improving reading ages to enable all students to access the curriculum. All teachers are teachers of literacy within their subject areas, and all students read for pleasure within form time. The plethora of strategies that we deliver helps us with our mission of improving reading ages of the young people of Sandwell.

Our broad and balanced curriculum is designed to cater for the needs of all of our students, enabling them to flourish in their future career pathways; our last inspection confirmed this: "The school's curriculum contains an appropriate range of subjects in each year. In key stage 4, a balance of academic and vocational options ensures that pupils study subjects that motivate and interest them. The key stage 3 curriculum has a strong focus on English and mathematics, with a view to strengthening pupils' basic skills." Ofsted.

Careful consideration and meticulous planning by subject leaders has resulted in a well sequenced curriculum that is delivered innovatively through quality pedagogy and practice. A blended curriculum offer will ensure that our students become knowledgeable in their subject areas whilst being able to apply this knowledge to academic scenarios and the wider world.















An inclusive environment for all



Inclusion is at the heart of St Michael's, and we provide excellent focus provision for students with physical disabilities. The Special Educational Needs (SEN) department is a dynamic team of Learning Support Practitioners (LSPs) who are expertly managed by a senior SEN coordinator and a SEN coordinator. LSPs work with individuals or small groups of students to improve literacy, numeracy, communication, and social skills.

All SEN students, including those in the focus provision, are helped to achieve their full potential through a personalised approach to both the learning process itself and to the support available within and beyond the school community. Co-ordinated multiagency work ensures all students access an appropriate range of support, are fully integrated and have access to all facilities.

Students with an Educational Health Care Plan (EHCP), have a bespoke student profile to support teachers with their planning, teaching and reviewing, to ensure that each student reaches their full potential. EHCP students will be allocated a key worker ensuring communication is clear, and a positive home-school relationship is fostered.

Our highly skilled team enhances the progress of students within lessons using a range of strategies bespoke to student needs.

The SEN team are passionate about student development and are immersed in the day-today-care of students with individual needs.



Opportunities for extended learning

At St Michael's, students are provided with a wide range of extra curricular activities to broaden their educational experience and help build character. As a school, we believe these extended learning opportunities create more well-rounded individuals who are supported socially, emotionally, as well as academically, to succeed.

We offer a variety of clubs and activities before school, during lunchtime and after school. In addition, we run residential trips and trips to other parts of the world. Examples of some of the different opportunities our students enjoy are:

On a regular basis, our students participate in sporting competitions at a local and regional level. They are also expected to contribute to a range of year group events and competitions such as Sports Day, Winter Sports Day and house events.

From September 2022, we are introducing the Duke of Edinburgh Award at Bronze and Silver level. This will be a wonderful opportunity for team work and developing resilience and confidence in our young people. Additionally, we work in partnership with West Midlands Police, to facilitate the Police Cadet programme, which endeavors to instill St Michael's core values and builds character, confidence and responsible young citizens.


