





Curriculum

The Fairfield curriculum is designed to promote a love of learning. We emphasise literacy and numeracy and offer a strong foundation in a wide range of subjects.

All students in Key Stage 3 study two Modern Languages, Dance, Music and Drama as well as STEM (Science, Engineering, Technology and Maths) and EBacc subjects (Maths, English, the Sciences, Geography or History and a Language). In Key Stage 4, all students have the opportunity to take EBacc qualifications alongside Engineering, Music, Drama, Dance, Classical Civilisation, Computer Science, Arts subjects and PE. We are responsive to the national educational landscape, ensuring that our students can compete robustly with all students nationally.





Extra-curricular

Our extra-curricular activities build confidence and character in an environment where students are supported and nurtured.

We offer a wide range of sports; previous years' offerings include football, netball, basketball, hockey, rounders, cricket, rugby, badminton, swimming, athletics and trampolining.

Students who love the outdoors can take part in nature club in our on-site garden or join the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme.

Music, singing, drama and dance are highly valued at FHS and students have many opportunities to perform, such as at our annual musical production and the Summer/Winter Galas.

We are proud to offer a wide variety of clubs which change and evolve on an ongoing basis. Students are involved in many charity, citizenship and community activities, getting the chance to live our values and become creative, ethical, global citizens. Students enjoy participating in local and national competitions and getting involved in leadership and enterprise opportunities.

Through collaboration with national organisations such as Integrate UK and Just Like Us, students have the opportunity to shape and lead our equalities agenda. We also feel privileged to be a Stonewall Champion and have been awarded the Halo Status.

We run numerous trips for enrichment, including visits abroad to suit historians, linguists, sports enthusiasts and artists.



Fairfield High School offers a Transition Team to help students make a positive transfer from primary school.

All prospective students are invited to come in and meet staff and other new students during our Year 6 induction programme. We also offer a Summer School.

SEND / pastoral

We believe that all students should have access to the full curriculum. Our team, led by a Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator, has broad experience and expertise in supporting children who may face barriers to their learning.

Teachers are skilled in delivering a curriculum which is accessible to all. Visually impaired, hearing impaired and physically disabled students follow broadly the same curriculum as all other students. Attainment and Progress data for our Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) students is extremely positive. We are made aware of students' needs through links with primary schools, families and carers.



Brighter Futures


Helping our students to develop the skills and attributes to succeed and flourish when entering the world of work is very important to us at Fairfield High School. To date we are proud to be achieving 100% across 7 out of 8 Gatsby Benchmarks; these are a national framework of guidelines that define the best careers provision within secondary schools.

Our careers provision is embedded throughout our curriculum, as we feel it is crucial in equipping our students to feel empowered and informed to make decisions regarding the opportunities and challenges of adult and working life. Across all year groups, students can access a range of employers from different industry sectors in addition to various events taking place over the year to enable our students to fully develop their enterprising skills. We are also proud to be working with Schools of Tomorrow which, amongst other things, provides cohesion and support for school based leavers.

During Year 10, students are offered support to undertake a diverse range of work experience, together with a range of local employers to deliver vital mock interview practice.

All students benefit from utilising our online careers platform, Unifrog, whereby they log their key competencies, achievements, work experience and post-16 provisions. This has proved highly valuable for students as they progress through their five year career journey at Fairfield.

We are proud that we have a high percentage of leavers who go onto further education or training; former students also have a strong record of success at Russell Group universities and in top apprenticeships.
