About RGS Worcester

Located in the historic City of Worcester, RGS Worcester lays claim to being the sixth oldest school in the world. The School was originally founded around 685 by Bishop Bosel, with the first written record in 1291.

Our motto 'Cherishing the past, looking to the future' reflects a school that combines tradition with a modern, forward-thinking approach to education. An innovative Digital Learning Programme inspires pupils to be active learners and co-curricular opportunities provide them with the chance to express themselves and pursue what they love. Pupils run through the School gates in the morning, keen to try something new and exciting.

RGS Worcester is a welcoming and friendly school. Class sizes are small and RGS is large enough to provide a wealth of opportunities, but small enough so that each pupil is treated individually and encouraged. Pupils work closely with their teachers and are well supported. They develop lifelong friendships at the School at whichever stage they begin their RGS journey.

Admissions

We encourage a visit to our Open Mornings or a personal visit on a normal school day. Admission is at 11+ (Year Seven), 13+ (Year Nine) and 16 + (Sixth Form) although pupils can join in other Year groups. There is an entrance examination for entry below Sixth Form and an interview process for Sixth Form entry. Scholarships and Bursaries are available and further information is available on request. A full induction programme at all entry levels ensures that pupils feel well settled into the School.

Academic

We want pupils to be fully engaged in their learning, to become active learners, and not to be content with the role of the recipient within the classroom. We blend innovative learning such as the Digital Learning Programme, with the traditional practice of highly qualified and experienced teachers.


RGS has a long tradition of achieving outstanding examination results at A Level, BTEC and at GCSE and consistently attains excellent value-added scores, which are calculated once pupils achieve final examination results. Each year, well over 80% of our students achieve their first-choice university places.

We provide a wide, varied and balanced curriculum in the Lower School (Years Seven and Eight), and work closely with our feeder schools to ensure we have continuity of development in these important foundation years.

In Year Nine, we provide further focus on the Core subjects (English, Mathematics, the Sciences and Modern Foreign Languages) whilst allowing pupils to maintain breadth with a choice, for example, of Creative Arts subjects, Latin and Classics or Computer Science.

At GCSE (Years Ten and Eleven), we offer a more personalised curriculum with pupils studying their choice of subjects.

The Sixth Form is a time of transition when a pupil in a class becomes a student of a subject. Students have the opportunity to study a wide range of academic subjects (at A Level, BTEC and the EPQ), taught by specialist teachers in high quality facilities.



Creativity

The Creative Arts are a crucial and impressive part of an RGS Worcester education, and the pupils are constantly challenged to think creatively and perform at a high level. Through the Creative Arts, our pupils develop an awareness and understanding of culture while also developing skills and confidence.

In Music, we provide opportunities to perform in large concerts at prestigious venues with our numerous choirs, ensembles, and the orchestra. At the same time, we have Big Band concerts, the extremely popular annual 'Cabaret' event and many other less formal opportunities for all pupils to perform. Pupils from RGS have gone on to achieve Scholarships at Music Colleges and develop careers in both classical and modern music.

Similarly, in Drama, our plays and musicals always push the boundaries. Examples include our Senior pupils performing 'Romeo and Juliet' on a beach, and our Juniors delivering 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' in the open air at an English Heritage site. The breadth of provision is superb and pupils develop confidence and excitement in their Drama at RGS.










In Design and Technology, the pupils are challenged to design and innovate. They develop their understanding through industry visits and compete for national awards such as Arkwright Scholarships. RGS Worcester has a record of more of these scholarships than any other school in the Midlands. Pupils can also extend their knowledge in practical scenarios through Greenpower racing and the Land Rover 4 x 4 Challenge, both competitions in which RGS has participated in the World Finals.



The pupils are constantly being encouraged to think creatively, seize opportunities and take on new experiences. They are inspired by their teachers and peers and always rise to the challenge, producing work of exceptional quality and enjoying every aspect of the creative journey.

Scholarships in the Creative subjects are available at 11+, 13+ and 16+ for the Sixth Form.



Sport

Enjoyment, teamwork and commitment are at the heart of RGS Sport and these values are supported by pupils, staff and parents. Some achieve excellence, and all play with pride and enjoyment.

The RGS sporting ethos can be split into two main strands: Performance and Values.

At the heart of <u>Performance</u> lies an ambition to ensure 'each and every child is fulfilling their potential'. The majority of pupils play sport for the School, taking with them the benefits of their sporting experiences into their future lives. Many of our pupils pursue and develop their sport beyond school in local clubs and we are very proud of the many pupils we have represented at a national level across a wide range of different sports.

Our Charter for Sport describes the <u>Values</u> that we promote and look to develop. To join a school like RGS Worcester is to join a community and become part of a team. Like any team, the School thrives on the trust and commitment which its members show to each other and the values that those teammates share. As such, we expect all of our pupils to be <u>Resolute</u>, <u>Gracious</u>, <u>Selfless</u> and <u>Willing</u> and to be proud of 'Being Green' (the School's colour).

With nearly 20 different sports available and superb coaching from experts in each sport, as well as bespoke strength and conditioning support, the pupils enjoy the opportunities available to them. Whether it is playing in a Rugby or Football match at Sixways stadium (home of the Worcester Warriors) or to a sell-out audience at the University Arena in 'Superball' in Netball, or at our new International Hockey Centre, or our beautiful Flagge Meadow Cricket ground, the pupils enjoy their sport. There is an Athlete Development Programme to assist their sport development and they experience Sports Tours in the UK and abroad. Whatever the sport, we can assist pupils to achieve their potential and enjoy every moment of the experience.

Sports Exhibitions and Scholarships are available at 11+, 13+ and 16+ for the Sixth Form.









Clubs and Societies

We are committed to the idea that the more someone is willing to try, the more potential they have to become. Our Co-curricular provision, therefore, encourages pupils to do more and to be more.

Co-curricular activities work hand in hand with each pupil's academic and personal development to encourage confidence and enjoyment of school life. Pupils are encouraged to try something new and develop their interests through a breathtaking array of different Clubs and Societies.

There are over 45 different Clubs and Societies at RGS Worcester so there is something for everyone. Creativity and new skills are encouraged through Film Makers' Club, Textiles Club, learning the Ukulele or being part of a Drama production. Academic interests can be explored through Astronomy Club using the RGS observatory, Reading Club or Literary Society, Anatomy Club or Computer Coding. The School offers the opportunity to build leadership and teamwork skills in the popular Combined Cadet Force (Army, Navy and RAF Sections) and the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. Pupils can develop presentation skills through Debating in which the School has a national reputation. Whatever your child's interests, they will have the chance to explore and develop through the Cocurricular life of the School.

There is a vibrant House system at RGS with all pupils and staff allocated to a House for competitions in a wide-range of activities from sport, music, drama and dance, to creative writing and chess. The pupils enjoy participating, earning points for their House, and contributing to the competition.

Being a part of our community and contributing to that community is an important aspect of an RGS education. Pupils support local and national charities and participate in activities for local school children and the elderly, raising funds through group and individual challenges.











Pastoral Care


At RGS Worcester, we have a strong reputation for Pastoral Care and we have in place the expertise and capacity to deliver a programme of care that we believe is unique and unrivalled. Providing care tailored to the needs of the individual is our core principle and we know each individual child extremely well.

We are fortunate to have numerous ways in which we can help and support the pupils and their families, and our extensive pastoral provision centres upon the team around the child. With highly skilled staff, we offer a holistic approach to help children cope with, and resolve, any issues they face. The team comprises the pupil's Form Tutor, the Head of Year, dedicated Heads of Lower School and Sixth Form, fully qualified Nurses, School Counsellors and a Relaxation Specialist. Sixth Form students also act as Pastoral Prefects, assisting the younger pupils in the Lower School.

We raise awareness of current issues that our young people have to negotiate during their adolescent years. The School regularly hosts external speakers, often of international reputation, to stimulate discussion on a wide range of topics.

The Learning Development team assists pupils with specific learning difficulties and those individuals who need extra help with revision and other learning techniques. They also offer support to build confidence and social skills.

We understand the challenges of growing up in today's world with its many different pressures. We ensure that our young people have the skills to cope with, and enjoy, their adolescence so that they can look forward to happy, fulfilling and productive young adult lives.



Digital Learning

Digital Learning has been developed at RGS Worcester since 2014 when the School introduced a Digital Learning Programme (DLP) with the infrastructure and training to integrate technology effectively in education. Every pupil comes to school with an iPad and teachers are fully trained in using technology when it makes a difference to learning. Traditional teaching techniques continue and are blended with the digital to provide the very best learning outcomes for the pupils.

During the pandemic of 2020-21, the RGS Worcester Schools were able to provide continuity of education for all pupils, involving teaching over 18,000 lessons online and maintaining provision for Pastoral Care and Co-curricular activities. As the only Apple Distinguished School in the region, RGS is regularly used by Apple to demonstrate best practice in Digital Learning nationally and even internationally.

Pupils are given a full induction into using the technology when they arrive at the School and quickly grasp the benefits, as well as understanding the importance of e-safety. They can choose to become Digital Leaders who advise and assist others.

Pupils leave RGS fully equipped for a modern, technological world and are ready to use technology at University and in the workplace, understanding its advantages and value.

By Road


The most direct route is via the M5. Leave at Junction 6 and join the A449. Travel for 2 miles on this road which leads into Barbourne Road and then Upper Tything, A38. The entrance to RGS Worcester is on the left after the Little London turning.

By Rail

The nearest mainline station is Worcester Foregate Street, which has a direct link to London Paddington and regular services to the West and West Midlands. The station is also a short journey from Birmingham. Turn right out of Foregate Street station and it is just a short walk to the School which is on the right.
