## **IMPRESSIVE GCSE SUCCESS FOR THE CLASS OF 2022**

#### **HEADLINE FIGURES FOR STANDISH COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL 2022**

5 standard passes including English and Maths	78%
Students achieving English and Maths at Grade 9-4 or above	82%
Students achieving Grade 9 - 4 in English (Best)	92%
Students achieving Grade 9 - 4 in Maths	84%

The outstanding performance of Year 11 students in their examinations has resulted in an incredible number of students achieving exceptionally well on the reformed GCSEs. which are graded 9-1 instead of A\*- G, with 9 the highest grade. Under the new system, a grade 4 is the equivalent to a grade C.

Our class of 2022 achieved a phenomenal 82% grade 9-4 in English and Maths, which reflects 92% grade 9-4 in English and 84% grade 9-4 in Maths. We are also delighted with our 78% 5+ standard passes including English and Maths, which compares favourably to last year's cohort.





The success of this cohort of students clearly reflects the accomplishments of a collaborative commitment made by students, staff, parents and governors.

The Grade 9 was designed to distinguish excellence amongst the very best students in the entire country - with approximately only 2% of the national cohort achieving the grade.

# PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (PDP)

Standish Community High School is committed to ensuring that all students develop into successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens. Through the weekly PDP lessons, students will develop skills, understanding and knowledge of living in the wider world, health and well-being and relationships.

## SPIRITUAL, MORAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT (SMSC)

At Standish Community High School, we adopt a 'Whole School Approach' to the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our students. Opportunities are provided for spiritual development, with the focus on tolerance and respect. The school cultivates students' moral values, develops their social skills and enhances their understanding of their own and other cultures. Standish Community High School has a whole school approach to SMSC through curriculum time, assemblies, Personal Development Programme (PDP) and activities which are centred around a key theme that links to Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Development (SMSC) and students have an opportunity to reflect on themes that are relevant in today's society.

Jewellery	Students may wear one pair of plain stud earrings only. Students must not have any other piercings. Students may also wish to wear a wristwatch; this must not be a smart device or a smart watch. No other items of jewellery should be worn.		
Coats and Jackets	All outdoor coats must be black or navy blue. Any coats with logos should have the logo no bigger than the size of a credit card. Coats must be removed before entering a classroom or teaching space.		
Scarves and hats	Navy blue or black scarves and hats can be worn between October and February and must be removed before entering a classroom or teaching space.		
Footwear	All footwear must be plain black leather shoes. No trainers, pumps or branded shoes.		
Haircuts and styles	All haircuts must be no shorter than a number two and must not be dyed with unnatural colours.		
Makeup	We have a zero-tolerance policy towards the wearing of makeup. This includes acrylic/false/gel/painted nails, false tan, drawn on eyebrows, coloured lip balm or false eyelashes.

IGO pass application forms can be obtained from school or TFGM travel shops. Please check the Transport for Greater Manchester website for updates.


