There are many things about Bredon School that make us proud, but our pupils come top of the list. Every day we see them challenging themselves, having fun and growing in confidence.

We are a small, warm and friendly school, where we nurture and encourage every child individually. The education we offer helps every pupil develop their character, strength and talents.

We are a dyslexia specialist school offering a full and diverse curriculum. Many of our pupils arrive feeling that they will never succeed, and we teach them that they can thrive, learn and achieve.



Every pupil is different so our specialist staff work individually with each child. Their support can include small group learning, assistive technology in class, speech and language and occupational therapy, work with our psychologist, and many other strategies.

All our teaching is designed with dyslexia in mind and we make our learning active and practical at all times. We break learning into short blocks, never just copy or learn by rote, and make sure that everyone knows exactly what we are doing.

And it works! In figures published by the Department for Education in January 2019, we were delighted to be ranked number one out of 4434 schools and colleges in England for 'value added' for 16 to 18 year olds.



We make the most of our beautiful, rural surroundings: where else can pupils feed the farm animals before lessons, launch their canoes into the river, and learn to cook on a camp fire?

We don't just excel at rural and outdoor pursuits, we embed outdoor learning in the timetable because we believe in educating the whole child. We take our lessons outside whenever we can, whatever the subject, from Science to Poetry, and from Photography to Geography.





Alongside a full range of BTECs, including Catering and Hospitality, Business Studies, Sports, Engineering and Agriculture, we also offer GCSEs and A Levels. The emphasis on vocational qualifications reflects our students' strengths as many are exceptionally good at seeing problems from all angles and taking a practical, hands-on approach.

We prepare Sixth Form students for the next stage in their lives; offering careers advice, help with completing university applications and by ensuring all our students take part in our innovative work experience programme which takes place once a week over the course of an academic year.

This ensures they gain real insight into the world of work and the responsibilities and commitment that this brings. Our work in this field has been recognised by the Independent Schools Association (ISA) and Bredon was named winner of the 2017 ISA Award for Academic Excellence/Innovation.

Our Art department is extremely strong, with a great record of nurturing our gifted artists, designers and photographers. A number of past students have gone on to study at top art colleges and film schools. In 2018, Bredon won the Independent Schools Association Award for Excellence and Innovation in the Fine Arts.

Performing Arts at Bredon are also a powerful way for our pupils to express themselves.







Boarding at Bredon

In our comfortable, homely boarding houses our Houseparents make sure everyone feels relaxed and among friends.

Almost half of our pupils board, so there is a busy and lively atmosphere and plenty to do after school and at weekends when we have no formal lessons because we are far too busy with activities, sports, outdoor pursuits and visits.

Your child may board at Bredon from the age of 9 years old, choosing between full boarding which includes weekends, or flexi boarding which is charged per night. We

also offer day boarding which allows day pupils to stay on after school, complete their prep/activity and have supper, before being collected at 7pm. This can also help prepare a pupil for full or flexi boarding and enables them to complete their prep with specialist staff on hand to support.

Day pupils

Our day pupils come from various surrounding counties, many travelling in on the School's comprehensive minibus service. Day pupils are also able to join their boarding friends on weekend trips, by arrangement.
