


Uniquely King's

Our School is located in the stunning city of Ely, just a few miles outside of Cambridge. Founded in 970AD, it is one of the oldest schools in the country. Boasting some of the most historic buildings in the city, the School's facilities provide the perfect blend of old and new, creating an inspiring place in which to teach and learn. Our weeks begin and end in a service of reflection within the magnificence of Ely Cathedral. The sky above the city is often blue. The air quality is always pure. There is no better place in which to grow and learn.









Selectively King's

Our pupils are in the top 50% ability range based on both performance and potential. To ensure that they will be able to access all that we have to offer, we carry out entry assessments from Nursery through to Sixth Form. Scholarships (Y9 and Y12) reward our top performers in Art, Music, Academic, STEM, Drama and Sport. Our GCSE and A Level results are strong and success in Oxbridge entrance is on the rise. In 2023, 98% of those heading into Higher Education secured places at their first choice Universities, Colleges, Music Conservatoires, Fashion and Drama Schools. Our academic rigour is balanced by a timetable which values the contribution made by students in all areas of our Co-Curricular Programme.









Extensively King's

Our Co-Curricular Programme is modern and exciting, encompassing such opportunities as robotics, pottery, Mandarin, food nutrition, History Café, Avicenna (budding Medics and Vets) and The Ely Scheme; a chance to brave the outdoors ahead of embarking on the Duke of Edinburgh Scheme. Our approach challenges students to give things a go, confident in the knowledge that they are in control of the choices that they make and are not being judged on their performance.
