KEY STAGE 3 - YEAR 7 TO 9

Students follow a rich and varied curriculum which offers both breadth and depth. Our aim is to inspire students and ensure that they are provided with a strong foundation for future learning.

- » **Core Subjects:** English, Mathematics and Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics)
- » **English Baccalaureate Subjects**: Humanities (History and Geography), Modern Foreign Language (French) and Computer Science
- » **Practical/Creative Subjects**: Physical Education, Technology (Design Technology and Food Technology), Art, Music and Drama
- » Personal Development Subjects: SMSC (students are encouraged to reflect on their social, moral, spiritual and cultural development)
- » Additional Careers Information, Advice and Guidance sessions.

KEY STAGE 4 – YEAR 10 & 11

Students follow a personalised pathway which takes into account their ambitions, ability and desired study route at Post 16.

- » English Baccalaureate Subjects: English Literature, English Language, Mathematics, Science (Combined or Triple Science), History and/or Geography. Option to study Computer Science and French
- » Open Subjects: Students have a choice of 2 additional subjects. There is a wide range of academic and vocational courses on offer. At transition to KS4 students will receive further guidance tailored to them
- » Physical Education each week
- » Additional Careers Information, Advice and Guidance sessions including training delivered by external organisations and university providers.

Alongside lessons, students have the **opportunity** to participate in a variety of super-curricular and **extracurricular activities** such as:

FACILITES

Surrounded by ample space for **outdoor learning**, Kemnal's distinctive Grade II Listed building offers a range of **high quality** educational facilities which are continually being extended and **developed**.

> Our P.E. department boast **excellent facilities** both inside our newly developed sports hall and outside on our extensive grounds. We therefore offer a wide range of sports and activities.

As our name suggests, we provide a number of **exciting technology** areas which include several computing suites and technology rooms including a brand new food technology room. Our specially created Year 7 Block aims to provide a **secure and gentle transition** from primary to secondary. Inside, the colour coded classrooms, **dedicated** technology and computing suites alongside the exclusive common room offer a space for new students to develop their confidence and become part of the KTC **community**.

We also offer high quality science labs, drama spaces, music rooms and a specialised SEND wing called 'ARC'.

SEND PROVISION

Kemnal aims to help provide an **inclusive, tailored and high-quality education** for all children. We take pride in creating an effective and supportive learning environment allowing each of our students to achieve.

Our curriculum is **carefully considered** to be inclusive of all of our students, including those with SEN. As well as quality first teaching, we have a small team of TAs that go into lessons to **support** as well as a specialist form group

which aims to meet the needs of students who require a more tailored setting. **Participation** in this group is carefully monitored and decided in conjunction with the pupils.

AMBITION & RESILIENCE CENTRE

Kemnal has ARC wing which is **exclusively designed** to accommodate student interventions. As well as numeracy, literacy and handwriting interventions, ARC run lots of **social interventions** such as horticulture, TalkAbout for Teenagers, lego therapy, art therapy and behaviour workshops. There is also a reset room that students can use (with an ARC reset pass) to refocus themselves with colouring, lego, books and music.

ALTERNATIVE QUALIFICATIONS

We also offer ASDAN, an alternative qualification recognised by colleges with the aim to focus on key skills for employability, such as working with others, public speaking and personal target setting.

PASTORAL CARE

APPLYING FOR A PLACE AT KEMNAL

We understand transition from Primary to Secondary can be a daunting experience and that wellbeing is **paramount** in creating an environment where learners can **thrive**.

Our aim is that parents and new students feel **informed and knowledgeable** about transition.

Below are some of the ways we aim to keep parents and carers informed about transition...

- We employ a transition director with extensive experience in primary schools to support families navigate the move to secondary,
- We provide **primary school visits** to local schools to deliver transition lessons to all Year 6 pupils in those schools,
- We offer **Open Days** and **Open Mornings** in Autumn 1 of Year 6 which allow families to view the school,
- Places offered in March are followed by a Welcome Pack which includes key information and forms to complete,
- We have a dedicated **New Starters Webpage** available with FAQs, information, advice and support for both parents and children,
- We make **calls** to any families who receive a non-preference offer to support and guidance,
- You will receive **regular contact** from KTC via email once your place has been confirmed with details of transition,
- Our Transition Director and Head of Year 7 conduct **Primary Visits** to our to our top feeder schools to meet the new students in a familiar environment,
- Our Transition Director contacts all feeder schools to receive information about each and every accepted child,
- A **Pupil Voice Questionnaire** is conducted before transition to best tailor transition days to the cohort,
 - **Transition Days** for new students allow them to experience taster days in the Summer Term,
 - We also offer **Family Welcome Events** for families and staff to get to know each other,
 - For additional opportunity for students to get to know their new school, Summer School is available to all students,
 - An **Induction Day** allows the Year 7s to have their first official day at school to to settle in.


