Situated in the heart of the Midlands, Telford itself was established in 1968 by Thomas Telford, and so is a relatively new town which is constantly growing and expanding resulting in more housing, jobs and schools for prospective families. With close links to the M54 and M6, Telford appeals to commuters wanting the beauty of the Shropshire countryside without the hustle and bustle of city life.

Telford is proud to be home to Ironbridge, built in 1781 on the River Severn it was the first major bridge in the world to be made of steel. Ironbridge stands in Ironbridge Gorge in the rolling hills of south Telford and is a popular beauty spot with both local residents and tourists.









Safeguarding
