Our school was first opened in 1878 for the education of children of all ages, becoming an infant school for children aged 4-7 years old in 1967.


Chellaston Infant School has been at the heart of our community for 140 years and we are proud of the ongoing success of our school.

We also use a web-based app called Class Dojo which you can access freely and see your child earning 'Dojo' points for making good choices at school and displaying good behaviour for learning.

School Uniform

Our aim is that our children look smart and this sets them up nicely to be ready to learn every day. Our school uniform consists of a red or green school jumper, a polo shirt and grey trousers or a skirt/ pinafore. PE kits consist of a white t-shirt, black PE shorts and black pumps.

We ask that children use a book bag-style bag for their school things rather than rucksacks. Our school uniform is available from 'Clothing 4 Schools' on the High Street, Chellaston or via Tesco's school uniform.

Lunchtimes

Lunchtimes at Chellaston Infant School are slightly staggered to accommodate everyone in our lunch hall. Most of our children, more than 80%, choose a school meal which is cooked fresh each day on the Junior school site.

Menus are on our school website and shared with the children each day so that they can make their choices about what they'd like to eat.

Children go into the hall in their class groups and can sit and enjoy a dining experience with their friends.

We thank you for the time you have taken to visit our school and we look forward to working with you, to ensure that your child's time at our school is as positive, exciting and successful as it can be.
