#### FEES

#### **Registration (for assessment/exam): £100 - Primary and Senior** (payable with Registration Form non-refundable).

#### **Entrance Deposit:**

£150 - Primary £500 - Senior and Sixth Form

(Payable when a place in the school is accepted; refunded shortly after the pupil leaves the school - or may be donated).

The funding will be for 35 weeks of the year.

Please note that funding ceases the term after your child's 5th birthday.

Derby High School operates its own Fees in Advance Scheme for the payment of school fees for future years. The percentage of savings is dependent on the interest rates at the time of payment. It is important that the Bursar's Department is made aware if you wish to take advantage of this deduction by 9.00 am by the first day of the second half of the Summer Term. Fees can also be paid monthly via an independent external provider, School Fee Plan. When three or more siblings attend the school, there is a reduction of 33.3% on the tuition fees for the youngest child.

The Governing Body reserves the right to revise the fee structure further should circumstances prove necessary. School fees are payable termly in advance. Extras are charged retrospectively. The basic school fee includes tuition, most books, stationery, lunch and a snack at break. Typical extras include exam fees, individual instrumental lessons and individual lessons for students with learning difficulties. School trips, photographs and miscellaneous other items are also charged as extras. These are either itemised on the school bill or charged directly by the person supplying the service. Parental consent is normally sought for a child to take part in a chargeable activity. Please contact the Bursar for more information.

#### WRAP AROUND PRIMARY CARE

Breakfast Club runs from 7:30am - 8:00am daily. The cost is  $\pm$ 3.50 per session, payable monthly and includes a light breakfast and supervision. Booking is not required.

The after school club for our Primary children is called Primary Extra Time and runs from 3:30pm to 5:30pm daily. The cost is £8 per hour, payable monthly. Children attending Primary Extra Time are collected from their classrooms at 3:30pm and taken to the Nightingale classroom in the Infant building where they have a snack and take part in various activities - arts & crafts, games both indoors and outdoors, weather permitting. Primary Extra Time places can be booked in advance or on the day when it is required. To book your child in please phone the school on 01332 514267.

For further information about Primary Extra Time please contact the Primary Head's PA. On Tuesdays and Wednesdays, which are longer days in the Senior School, we offer late waiting for no charge until 4pm for Primary pupils who have siblings in the Senior School so that only one pickup is required.

#### LATE WAITING IN THE SENIOR SCHOOL

The Senior School offers a free facility for late waiting whereby students are permitted to stay in the library, on the tennis courts or on the Head's Lawn (weather permitting) until 5:30pm. Senior Late Waiting is supported by our School Librarian alongside administrative staff.

#### PRIMARY DEPARTMENT

Your child will be invited to spend a morning in school joining in with a class of pupils of their own age. During that time we will observe them socially with other children and ascertain their ability to cope with the pace of learning in the class/ year group. Older pupils would have some work to complete to identify their current level of working.

#### ENTRANCE EXAM

11+ (Year 7) Three papers - English/Maths/Non-Verbal Reasoning, interview, reference from current school. Sixth Form (Year 12) GCSE results 7 x A\*- B (grades 9-6) plus individual subject requirements, interview, reference from current school. Students are accepted into other year groups in the Senior School, (assuming there are spaces), on a satisfactory performance on assessment papers along with a reference from their current school and short interview.

## YEAR 7 SCHOLARSHIPS

- Scholarships awarded to students entering Year 7 are valid until the end of Year 11, at which point students can apply for the full range of Sixth Form Scholarships and Awards.
- Academic General performance in the Entrance Examination for prospective students and internal assessments for Derby High Primary students is taken into consideration when awarding Academic Scholarships. There are no separate examination papers.

   Head's Awards may be given to a student entering the Sixth Form whose GCSE results suggest outstanding academic potential.
- Music Applicants should be grade 3 or above on one instrument/voice with ideally a grade on a second instrument/voice.
- **Sports** Applicants should be of County standard or equivalent in at least one sport.
- **Drama** Applicants should have experience of performing or working backstage both inside and outside school.
- Art & Design Applicants should have a portfolio of work completed both inside and outside school.
- Head's Awards may be given to students entering Year 7 who perform well in the Entrance Exam and whose interests, achievements and reference from their school indicates that they are likely to make a significant contribution to the broader life of the school.

Scholarships are available in other senior year groups for outstanding candidates.

## SIXTH FORM SCHOLARSHIPS

- Subject specific Academic Scholarships are available for students entering the Lower Sixth. They are assessed by examination. In addition to this, a few candidates are selected for interview to be considered for a Major Academic Scholarship linked to two subjects.
- Music Applicants must demonstrate a high level of musical ability and commitment to school music. They should have reached at least grade 6 on their chosen instrument.

Co-curricular Scholarships for Music do not require study of A level Music but Academic Music Scholarships do.

- Sports Applicants should be of County standard in at least one recognised school sport. They will be expected to have shown evidence of commitment to sporting activities throughout their school life and experience of assisting with the coaching of younger children will be an advantage. Co-curricular Scholarships for Sport do not require participation in A level PE but Academic PE Scholarships do.
- Drama Applicants should be able to demonstrate a talent for acting or be a key member of a backstage/ lighting team. Co-curricular Scholarships for Drama do not require participation in A level Theatre Studies but Academic Theatre Studies Scholarships do.
- Art & Design Applicants should have a comprehensive portfolio of work completed both inside and outside school. Art & Design Awards do not require participation in A level Art & Design but Academic Art & Design Scholarships do.
- All Rounder Awards may be made to students entering the Lower Sixth. These will be made to students who have not received any other award, but who are likely to make a significant contribution to the overall life of the school.
- Scholarships and awards start at £500 discount off the full fee. Any remission will apply only to the basic school fee, not to any extras. For further information on Scholarships, please contact the Registrar.

## MEANS TESTED ASSISTED PLACES

Assisted Places might be available to students in the Senior School and Sixth Form only who would not otherwise be able to benefit from the education offered at Derby High School or in situations of temporary hardship. The maximum value of an Assisted Place is 50% of the basic school fee. This remission does not apply to extras. Parents applying for an Assisted Place will be required to declare details of income and investments, using the standard form supplied by the Bursar. This paperwork needs to be completed fully before any decision about the awards can be made. The Bursar may request to see parents applying for Assisted Places should any clarification be required of information supplied.

Students benefiting from an Assisted Place will be expected to be fully committed to the ethos of the school and to play a full part in the life of the school. Their assessment, reports and conduct will be expected to reflect their commitment to their studies. Parents of students receiving Assisted Places are required to inform the school of changes in their financial situation. Assisted Places are reviewed annually and are not guaranteed to remain the same year on year.

Please note that no combination of award/scholarship will exceed 50% of full fees.

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
