Teaching and Learning

We have a dedicated team of qualified teaching staff who are all committed to providing the very best for every student.

Each student is valued as an individual and is encouraged to take an active part in all aspects of school life. We recognise that all students have different strengths, aptitudes, and interests. Our purpose is to ensure that our students are encouraged and supported to pursue their interests, harness their strengths, and develop their areas for development.

We understand that one size doesn't fit all; our lessons are responsive to the students in them. Our teachers use low-stakes assessment techniques to check students understand before moving on, and they provide individual feedback to help students understand the next steps in their learning and make the required improvements. Teachers encourage students to be resilient and to see mistakes as part of the learning journey. A culture of high expectations, alongside a curriculum and lessons personalised to meet the needs of all students, underpins our aim to bring out the best in all our students.




Challenging and Inspiring

We provide opportunities to stretch and challenge all students inside the classroom and beyond. Our 5 year curriculum will ensure that students study a broad and balanced range of academic subjects. This ensures that our students are equipped to attain the English Baccalaureate by the end of Key Stage 4, a suite of subjects including English, Maths, Science (our most able will study Triple Science), a Humanities subject and a language. This qualification is highly regarded by universities as a balanced foundation for higher education.

There will also be opportunities for our most able to study additional qualifications. We actively encourage all students to read ambitious and challenging texts to broaden their minds and vocabulary.

We are about inspiring students to have ambition for themselves and to challenge themselves to pursue the dream that's right for them.

We are proud to be part of the Boat Race Challenge programme, a unique training and extra-curricular programme set up by Nelson and Colne College. The programme runs over three years to help students prepare for college, progress to top universities in the country, and ultimately reach their career aspiration. The programme includes a visit to the University of Oxford. We are equally proud of our links with employers and colleges providing apprenticeships and training post 16, which mean the vast majority of our students secure their chosen pathway after leaving us.



Our Curriculum

Our five year curriculum aims to provide sequences of learning which are engaging, well planned and focus on lifelong learning experiences for all. Our curriculum is balanced and delivered by subject specialists in defined pathways of study. Schemes of learning promote the key interdisciplinary skills of problem solving, building resilience, thinking strategies, numeracy, literacy and effective communication. At Key Stage 3 we build upon the experiences in English and Maths at primary school and broadening students' experiences in a range of subjects including Science, History, Geography, French or Spanish. These are studied alongside practical subjects such as Art, Technology and Music. We aim to nurture the social, moral and cultural interests and experiences of students within the subjects they learn and also through the PSHE curriculum.

West Craven operates a two-week timetable. In years 7 and 8, students over the two weeks will study:

- English, Mathematics and Science
- History and Geography
- French or Spanish
- PSHE and RE
- Computing
- PE and Music

At Key Stage 4 we encourage students to maintain a balance of core subjects including English, Maths, Science, a Humanities subject and a Language. Beyond this we aim to provide opportunities to suit all students with academic, practical and vocational courses on offer. Students will choose their subjects at our Options Evening in Year 9. Our curriculum is under constant review to ensure we are meeting the needs of individual students in an ever changing world as we prepare them for life as adults.

Career Driven

At West Craven High School, we encourage our students to think about their career aspirations and understand the benefits of planning for them early in order to guarantee the best possible success. Research evidence suggests improved careers education is linked to higher academic achievement at GCSE and greater personal economic security.

We believe it is essential that the school contributes to preparing young people for the opportunities, responsibilities and experience of adult life. Careers learning is intended to be a golden thread woven throughout the school curriculum from Year 7 to 11, that supports young people to explore their dreams, make decisions and manage transitions as learners and workers, towards being valuable lifelong professionals.



With strong links to local employers and a curricular focus on careers, we ensure that our students' ambitions are linked to careers which they will find both fulfilling, profitable and rewarding with a firm understanding of the changing local labour market and job opportunities. Local and national employer involvement in our curriculum is essential to our students' educational experience. All students who attend West Craven High School, will be exposed to the knowledge and skills they need to make informed choices and achieve economic wellbeing in later life.

We have been measured against the CEC guidance and have over a number of years consistently maintained 100% compliance with all 8 Gatsby Benchmarks. This means our students benefit from live experiences, visits and mentoring, in addition to enterprise projects, at least two weeks' work experience and employability skills sessions delivered by local employers and organisations. Students receive training with CV writing and interview techniques; how to achieve their chosen next step position at 16 and beyond.

Students' success is recognised and supported by Employability Awards, which are given at key stages of transition for successful Work Experience completion, CV writing and employer interviews and other areas of recognised employability skills. Students can achieve Bronze, Silver and Gold awards and they are encouraged to keep in their personal achievement portfolio.



Reading Focus

At West Craven High School we are proud to be a Reading Academy. Reading is seen in every lesson, every day across the school.

All our students in years 7, 8 and 9 have designated lessons in our school library to borrow a book, or books, of their choice from a wide range of fiction, non-fiction and graphic novels. We promote reading for interest and pleasure as well as helping and supporting out pupils to challenge themselves with their reading choices. Our knowledgeable and experienced librarian and English teachers will guide the book choices. We strongly recommend that students read at home for at least 15-20 minutes every day.

In addition we run several programmes in school to promote and develop reading at all levels.

- Three times a year our pupils are tested using the national New Group Reading Test to assess and monitor reading ages. This data is used across to the school to inform all teachers of reading ability in each pupil.
- Phonics and reading intervention sessions to support reading in those below chronological reading age.
- Robust Reading in Form time a chance for form tutors to read with their form, the expectation being that the pupils read for pleasure in this environment. This helps garner a love of reading.
- The use of the school library to borrow books the library is open break and lunch times every day to offer a place to borrow books and read quietly.
- A range of new books are purchased termly and displays and reading focusses are out and rotated in the library each week the We are a Reading Academy newsletter is published each week with news of new stock, book events and book recommendations for the whole family.
- We also enjoy a range of book and reading related events across the school year, from National Poetry Day to World Book Day.





Life at West Craven High School

Our core values of ASPIRE: Ambition, Supportive, Positivity, Independence, Resilience and Equality are at the heart of life at West Craven High School and students are awarded core value achievement points through the ClassCharts website and mobile app for demonstrating these attributes in all aspects of school life. We will celebrate students' success and achievements throughout the year with reward events, assemblies and in our annual Star Awards Evening. There are also numerous leadership opportunities for students of all ages. In Year 7 students will have the opportunity to be a form tutor group representative or they could become involved in the School Council. There are leadership opportunities as Sports Ambassadors, Year 7 Champions, Eco forum representatives, and Anti-bullying Ambassadors, to name a few. Older students have the opportunity to act as mentors to our Year 7 students and towards the end of Year 10 students can apply to become Prefects or even Head Prefects.













Extra-curricular and Community Focus

All students are encouraged to take part in the wide variety of activities at West Craven High School. We encourage not just academic development but personal growth through structured sessions before school, at lunchtime and after school. All extra-curricular activities are free and are a great way to try something new and make new friends, just simply turn up and have a go! Extra-curricular timetables are updated regularly and further information regarding activities can be found from form tutors.



Examples of activities on our current extra-curricular timetable include choir, Duke Of Edinburgh, table tennis, Wellbeing Club, library sessions, Tech Club, Computer Science Club, badminton, teen gym, netball, football, basketball, Homework Club, Python Club and much more.

As well as daily extra-curricular activities, we also arrange many trips and activities outside of school including to Chester Zoo and the Blue Planet Aquarium.

These trips allow students to further develop their knowledge of subjects and bring learning to life whilst creating long lasting memories of their time at West Craven High School.



Community Involvement

At West Craven High School we see ourselves as a learning community at the heart of the wider community and as such we encourage our students to be active citizens in their local community.

Building Bridges

Students in Years 7 and 9 can experience working on a 'building bridges' programme that explores the important issues around identity, culture and community and provides them with the opportunity to work as a team on a potentially winning community project. If selected as the winning project it is funded by the Building Bridges programme to run as an actual event with our students leading with their own design.

Duke of Edinburgh

We place great importance on encouraging our students to have a go and take part in this established and highly respected national award scheme.

We offer our students the opportunity to complete both Bronze and Silver awards with us. Students complete key elements including volunteering in their local community, taking on a new physical activity and learning a new skill as well as being successful in the expeditions.



National Citizens Service (NCS)

Each year we encourage our Year 11 students to take part in this national scheme after their exam studies. Many do and develop their confidence even further ready for post-16 study having learnt more about what they can do and what their real potential is.

Burnley Football Club



As a key asset in our local community, our partnership work with BFC is a real strength for our students. With regular visits to Turf Moor and use of their teaching suites, we currently participate in the Education and Enterprise Programme and the Interventions Programme, with excellent access to educational facilities and sporting experts.

Local Charities

Students work hard to raise funds to support local charities such as Open Door, Pendleside Hospice and Petal Cancer Fund.



Care and Support

We aim to offer high levels of care and support for all our students.

The Form tutors play a vital role in this as a twice daily point of contact. Your child's form tutor will play a key part in helping them settle into secondary school. The form tutor is also an important point of contact for parents. There is a 10 minute registration period each morning, where tutors will greet the students, check that they have all they need and help them get ready for the school day. Each afternoon there is a 20 minute form tutor period with planned activities and key messages, including a weekly assembly. Each year group has a non-teaching pastoral support worker available at all times during the day.

A dedicated Attendance Officer works with parents and students to ensure excellent attendance and punctuality. Our SENDCO and team of Teaching Assistants provide tailored support and intervention for students with additional needs. This support underpins the progress students are able to make in their learning. Pastoral support at West Craven High School is strong, with a dedicated team of staff to support students through school. An Attendance Officer works with parents and students to ensure high levels of attendance are maintained. We are also one of only two secondary schools in Pendle to benefit from the services of a Burnley FC in the Community Emotional Wellbeing Worker.

We know that the best learning takes place when students feel safe and happy, and we don't underestimate the importance of building positive relationships, both with students and parents and carers. This starts the moment your child joins West Craven, as we all work together for the best interests of every student in our community.





Parent Teacher & Friends Association

A new West Craven High School Parent, Teacher & Friends Association (PTFA) has recently been launched and we are keen for as many of our parents and carers as possible to join.

With the support of Parent Kind, the place for parents who want to be more involved in their child's education, the PTFA will be working on a number of fundraising initiatives to support our school and its students, including a pre-loved uniform collection.

Leading Parent Partnership Award

West Craven High School has been commended for its work in partnership with parents and carers after achieving the Leading Parent Partnership Award (LPPA).

The LPPA is a nationally recognised award supporting schools who deliver effective parental engagement. The assessment is made by an external advisor. A team of staff at West Craven High School successfully put together evidence in eight categories for the advisor and are now celebrating after securing the Award for the first time.

Commenting on the evidence produced by the team at West Craven, Awards Verifier Maureen Nash said: "There is strong leadership of parental involvement at West Craven High School, led by the Executive Principal and leadership team who have a clear vision to provide high quality education, recognising the value of parent partnership.






West Craven High School is proud to be part of the Pendle Education Trust family
