The AMCS Curriculum **Powerful Knowledge**

At The Dean Trust, we believe that the acquisition of powerful knowledge and transferable skills, together with experiences that build social and cultural capital, is a fundamental right for all young people.

EYFS Curriculum

In EYFS we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. Our children are nurtured in a secure environment, whilst being allowed to explore, enquire and develop their learning both inside and outside the classroom.

The seven areas are as follows: Three Prime areas - Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Communication and Language. Four Specific areas - Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts and Design.

Key Stage 1 and 2 Curriculum

We value all children as individuals, each with a unique potential for learning. Our aim is to prepare every child for life beyond Abraham Moss, providing them with an exciting and empowering curriculum with the skills, knowledge and values that equips them for today and tomorrow.

Core Subjects: English (Reading, Phonics, Writing), Maths and Science. Foundation Subjects: Computing, History, Geography, Spanish, PE, Art and Design, Design Technology, Music, RE, PSHE and Citizenship (including British values

The Key Stage 3 Curriculum

Abraham Moss Community School's Key Stage 3 is a three year curriculum that is broad and balanced. It fully prepares our pupils for Key Stage 4 and beyond.

Pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 study a wide range of subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, Spanish, History, Geography, Technology, Computing, Art, Music, Drama, Religious Studies and PE. In addition, pupil also learn about Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PHSE).

The Key Stage 4 Curriculum

The Key Stage 4 curriculum offers a very traditional and well-balanced range of courses, with the essential subjects of English, mathematics and science remaining at the core of our provision. All pupils have access to a minimum of nine qualifications.

The majority of pupils follow the English Baccalaureate at Key Stage 4. Subjects included are:

- English Literature Combined or Separate Sciences
- English Language
 Religious Studies
- Maths

As well as studying these subjects, pupils have the opportunity to study a minimum of any three from the following:

- Spanish
- French
- German
- Physical Education
- Food and Nutrition
- Design Technology

- Drama
- Music
- Art
- Sports Studies
- 3D Design



Ambition and Aspiration

Our ambitious and aspirational ethos has played a key role in our improvement to date and it will always be at the core of our practice as we continue to strive forward. All pupils benefit from a well-balanced and differentiated curriculum.

In addition, Higher Achievers engage in a bespoke educational strategy, with opportunities to extend their capabilities beyond the classroom. To further embed a culture of high aspiration, we work alongside a number of universities from the Russell Group to encourage Higher Achievers to aspire to attend university.

Pupils can take part in a plurality of academically enhancing experiences. In addition to lessons we provide a range of opportunities and activities to support and extend their learning. Some of the additional activities include:

- The Junior and Intermediate Maths Challenge.
- Masterclasses at Loreto College for Y10 and Y11 pupils as part of the Greater Manchester High Achievers Programme.
- Visits to a number of universities and colleges include for some pupils an overnight stay at Oxford University.

Mensa

As part of this tailored plan, our English Baccalaureate Higher Achievers are supported and funded by the school to partake in the Mensa Supervised IQ Test.

Pupils who pass this test are considered as Exceptionally Able pupils and are amongst the top 2% of the population.

Passing the Mensa test is an admirable achievement that opens additional pathways in the future.

Enriched Learning Healthy in Mind, Body and Soul

Abraham Moss Community School is a modern building with state-of-theart facilities and high-quality resources. We pride ourselves on the additional opportunities we provide for our pupils beyond their excellent academic experience in lessons.



Enrichment

Our extra-curricular and enrichment activities, aim to develop the skills of pupils and contribute to them becoming wellrounded citizens.

There are currently 19 clubs in the secondary phase which pupils can choose to attend, with 11 of these running at lunchtimes. There are additional extracurricular and enrichment opportunities pupils are invited to or can apply for.

Community

Community engagement activities include reading intervention, presentations and support for parents/ carers, coffee mornings, charity fundraising events, book fair, carboot sale and the Grand Iftar.

We hold a Winter Fest to celebrate the winter and Christmas season. Pupils visit Broughton House Veteran Care Village to meet with residents, share festive treats and sing Christmas songs.



Pupil Leadership

There is the opportunity to develop pupil leadership, with roles such as the Pupil Librarians, Literacy representatives, a girls' network, a Charity and Community Committee and a Young Interpreters group.

Facilities

Our school shares the use of Abraham Moss Library & Leisure Centre after its multi million investment. The facilities include a state of the art gym kit with dedicated cardio, strength and functional training areas. The facility also houses two swimming pools and a sports hall.
