# The **Oswestory**

As a school with an almost unrivalled history and heritage, it is important when looking to the future to recognise where we have come from.

Our foundation as a truly independent school, free from ties to either monarchy or church, was the pioneering vision of our founder David Holbache. The school continues to proudly wear the crest of the Holbache family as its badge; a family crest for a family school.

## > 15th Century

Oswestry pupils are educated in a halftimbered school building in the grounds of the Parish Church of St Oswald's. They are schooled principally in Latin, Greek and English Grammar.



**1407** 

Oswestry School is founded by David Holbache and his wife Guinevere; the second oldest truly independent school in the country.

## 16th Century

Oswestry School attracts the attention of Queen Elizabeth I who pledges an endowment of "40 shillings per annum" to assist with the running of the school.



1776

Due to an increase in numbers, the school moves to its present site at Upper Brook Street adjacent to the Maes-y-Llan playing fields.


#### Trust

The creation of a new **Library** was an important first academic priority, providing pupils with a dynamic and inspiring space for independent and collaborative study, and encouraging a passion for reading and learning. Further investment in academic facilities across both school sites will follow in the years ahead.

## Preparation for Life

The newly-refurbished **Sigi Faith Sixth Form Centre** - a major capital project made possible through the legacy donation of the Faith family - provides our senior pupils with a contemporary space for study as they are prepared for the wider world beyond.

#### Future-focused

Led by our Deputy Head Futures, the years ahead will see the development of our **whole-school Futures vision**, an adaptive and evolving programme to ensure that all pupils are best prepared for an ever-changing world with future-focused skillsets and mindsets, and the attributes and attitudes to make a positive and meaningful difference.

## > Living and Learning Together

September 2024 will see the opening of a first **Coeducational Sixth Form Boarding House** following a major refurbishment of our boarding facilities. This exciting evolution will be an era-defining moment, providing our senior pupils with the unique stepping-stone opportunity to live and learn within a coeducational setting.

## Expanding Global Horizons

A similarly evolutionary moment will come as we expand our family of schools to include a first **International Summer School**, rooted in the Oswestry School values and virtues and further affirming our fervent belief in the transformative power of global education.

Passionate **advocates of holistic education**, we aim to enhance and strengthen our co-curricular provision, ensuring that breadth and excellence is provided for our pupils both inside and outside the classroom.
