Our four step journey

Our Pre-Prep children begin their Feltonfleet journey at the age of three in our Nursery classes at Calvi House.

Throughout the Pre-Prep phase, pupils are nurtured with excellent teaching and pastoral care as they develop core academic skills, personal qualities and attitudes for life. We recognise the importance of having the time and space to explore, investigate, question and collaborate, naturally developing the attributes that underpin lifelong learning. Every moment of their precious childhood is truly valued. Classroom facilities combine a spacious, traditional house set in stunning natural woodlands with modern technology. Nursery, Reception and Year One pupils are educated largely in Calvi House and its grounds, with regular visits to the Swimming Pool, Dance Studio, Ashbee Theatre and Sports Hall on the adjoining main school campus.

In their final year of Pre-Prep, Year 2 children have a dedicated House, offering pupils their own space to learn and forge closer links with the Prep School, with the majority of specialist lessons taught in the Prep School buildings. This allows the pastoral familiarity of being part of the Pre-Prep whilst developing confidence for transition to the Lower School.

The second stepping-stone of the Destination 13 journey takes pupils into the Lower School.


A purposeful focus on developing independence and a positive attitude towards living, learning and leading helps the pupils to explore new experiences and strive to be the best versions of themselves. Pupils are taught in forms for most academic subjects, with sets for Maths and English. Geography, History, Science and Technology are taught through a thematic approach following the International Primary Curriculum and pupils move to dedicated areas of the school for specialist teaching in French, Computing, Design & Technology, Music, Drama, Art, PE and Games.

Pupils in Lower School complete this phase of their journey secure in their sense of belonging and with an exciting vision of the path ahead.

Year 5 brings new experiences for the children with greater subjectspecialist teaching and more time with Form Tutors. Our nurturing framework continues to support pupils as they build personal organisation, self-motivation and self-discipline.

We focus on individual aptitudes and foster a thirst for learning to supplement the broader skills required across the learning spectrum. Pupils continue to enjoy a rich and varied curriculum throughout the Middle School alongside thorough preparation for senior school pre-tests in Year 6, all supported by our robust and caring pastoral framework.

The School offers a diverse range of enrichment opportunities, covering sports, the arts, drama and music, including visits to museums, galleries, concerts and shows. As Year 6 closes, pupils are ready to take on the challenges and leadership responsibilities of the Upper School.

The final stepping stone marks the conclusion of the Feltonfleet experience and the progression to some of the best senior schools.

Pupils make outstanding progress in their first two years of secondary education. A focus on core skills ensures that pupils can take a lead in their next phase of education, with many pupils securing scholarships to their chosen senior schools.

At the top of the school, pupils flourish in positions of leadership and with wider responsibilities, from planning and leading charity events to representing the School in sporting, creative and academic spheres. Our Enrichment provision, such as the Leonardo Lectures and academic symposiums with partner schools, offer exciting platforms for academic and personal development, whilst developing resilience through a wider variety of interests. As their Destination 13 journey comes to an end, our pupils are able to collaborate, think independently, and make responsible decisions. They show a mature approach to learning, are articulate, digitally skilled, and can express themselves through writing, art, drama and music. Above all, they will carry a sense of wellbeing and belonging throughout their lives.

Feltonfleet provides a happy, safe and caring environment where pastoral care is taken very seriously. Close relationships are developed between the children and staff throughout the School to encourange openness and approachability.

The four School stages ensure each child's needs are met on the learning journey, allowing them to grow in self-confidence and independence.

Our core belief is that every individual child really matters, and we have a structured pastoral framework which runs throughout the School. Class Teachers and Form Tutors pay close attention to their pupils' pastoral welfare on a daily basis, supported by Year Leaders, and the Deputy Head, Pastoral.

Feltonfleet creates an environment conducive to mindfulness and positive mental health. 'Time To Think' sessions are an integral part of the curriculum and Form Tutor system, providing the emotional space for pupils to relax, reflect, and develop resilience and flexibility, while our Wellbeing Centre provides the physical space for calm reflection.



PASTORAL CARE FRAMEWORK









Feltonfleet has a fully-trained School Counsellor who is supported by three House Matrons. Staff attend frequent training and refresher courses on pastoral issues and there are information sessions for parents and pupils on pastoral care and pupil welfare. Parents are welcome to contact us with any concerns about their child, no matter how big or small. All staff are contactable directly by email, enabling teachers and parents to work together to ensure pupils' welfare. Pupils are encouraged to reflect on pastoral issues and consider how they can contribute to the well-being of the school community, and there are specific opportunities for open discussion in both weekly PSHE Education lessons and in the Pupil Voice Committees.

Our Boarding House is situated at the heart of the School, providing a friendly, warm and comfortable environment with dedicated dormitories for boys and for girls. Over fifty pupils from Years 3-8 board from Monday to Friday, cared for by our experienced House Parents, Matrons and Boarding Tutors.

Full boarders stay 4-5 nights per week while flexi boarders stay on set nights. Warm, spacious, bright rooms have 4-6 beds with modern bathrooms. Pupils are welcome to bring items from home to decorate their space, making it more familiar.

Evenings are busy with activities such as Dodgeball, Wacky Races and Arts and Crafts; extra study is also available to boarders. A cooked supper and breakfast

are key parts of the overnight stay, as well as a snack of toast and cereal before bedtime.

Boarding is essential preparation for children intending to move on to boarding senior schools, while for others friendships are cemented and new ones made within the boarding community. Feltonfleet is a highly creative school enjoying considerable success in gaining arts-based scholarships to senior schools.

In Art pupils learn to apply different materials, techniques and design processes to communicate what they see, feel and think. Our light and airy studio is always open throughout the working day and into the evening. Visits to galleries, workshops and exhibitions add to the richness of the art experience.

Design and Technology teaches pupils about materials, their properties and practical applications. Through project work pupils have the opportunity to design and make products for a real purpose with a specific target audience. Many pupils develop entrepreneurial skills through 'Feltonfleet Warehouse', a business enterprise group.

In Music, most pupils have individual lessons with instrumental or vocal specialists. A weekly programme of ensembles includes five choirs, two orchestras and groups for string and wind instruments. The concert diary is extensive, with informal and formal











events, workshops and community visits. This performance experience contributes towards notable success in ABRSM exams.

Regular Drama productions are a popular feature amongst events in the Ashbee Theatre. Each year group mounts an annual production, with all pupils involved in a play or musical. A sizeable number of pupils take private LAMDA lessons in school.

Dance is very popular, with pupils studying ballet, free style, street and hip hop, tap and contemporary dance. It is not unusual for some of our more able dancers to perform with the Royal Ballet or the London Children's Ballet.





Pupils leave Feltonfleet after examinations in Year 8 and routinely gain entry to their first choice senior school. Well-balanced, self-confident and ready for the challenges to come, our leavers are highly thought of in senior school circles.

A high proportion of Year 8 children secure scholarships to leading independent senior schools across a number of disciplines. Candidates for academic scholarship follow a bespoke timetable with tutorial sessions, a process that fosters independent learning and provides excellent preparation, not only for the demanding academic papers, but also for success at senior school. Scholarships are available in many areas - one in three of our pupils wins senior school scholarships in recognition of their particular talents in music, drama, art, dance, design and technology
