







### WELCOME

The main objective we have for all our pupils at Reed's is for them to be happy. We have outstanding teaching staff, excellent facilities and a compassionate ethos, so there is every reason that our pupils will flourish. The key to happy pupils, indeed happy people, is, in my view, based on having strong self-confidence and also the more subtle attribute, strong self-esteem; being valued for your own unique blend of interests and potential. For all schools, if we can imbue our pupils with these two elements, they will be happy, and happy pupils thrive.

So, what is it that we do at Reed's to try and achieve this? There are a number of strands in the answer, and if you weave those strands together, one has what we call 'ethos' - put simply our way of doing things. In no particular order let me unpick some of these strands. Firstly, we are relatively small for a senior school, so we know all of our pupils and they in turn know each other and develop excellent relationships with their peers and with their teachers. Secondly, although many of our pupils are day pupils, we have a boarding infrastructure. This means that all the facilities are on site, and we can pack a huge amount into each day. Most of our teachers are involved in the co-curricular side of the school and this all fosters that cohesive sense of community that is the hallmark of Reed's. One final strand it is important to emphasise is the role of the Andrew Reed Foundation. Around 10% of our pupils receive some form of bursary as they have lost the support of one or both parents. This altruistic mission, a thread running from the School's founding in 1813, shapes the ethos and values of the school and helps us develop compassionate, responsible, and confident young men and women who leave Reed's in the Upper Sixth with a strong moral purpose and personal integrity. If the ethos and values are strong, the outcomes should follow.

The School's reputation for academic excellence is supported by our outstanding public examination results and the excellent reputation of our co-curricular provision which is nationally recognised. It is often said that choosing a school is like buying a house, it is about that emotional connection or gut feeling. I hope that the information in this prospectus resonates with your philosophy of education and that you visit us to see for yourself whether Reed's is the right fit for your son or daughter. We look forward to meeting you.

## Who we are

Reed's School was founded in London in 1813. Today it is a leading HMC independent day and boarding school providing an education for boys aged between 11 and 18. Girls join at the age of 16 to create a vibrant co-educational Sixth Form. Our charitable Foundation remains an integral part of our ethos instilling in pupils the values of our Founder, Rev Dr Andrew Reed: Integrity, Compassion, Curiosity, Resilience, Responsibility, and Independence.

Located in 40 acres of grounds in Cobham, Surrey, we are blessed by being in a beautiful countryside setting with excellent transport routes by road and rail. Direct and close links to the M25 and the A3 allow for easy access to airports and a 30-minute drive (or 35 minutes by train) to central London.

Our extensive bus service means that our day pupils come from a wide range of areas such as Guildford and Woking to the south to Richmond and Putney further north. Reed's has a homely feel to it, despite its size. Facilities are modern with many recent improvements and additions.

The environment we provide for our pupils should be of the highest quality and we strive to be at the forefront of educational provision. A full strategic plan, put in place following consultations with parents and staff, allows us to anticipate the needs of the school in the future.

Our mission is to develop confident, articulate and happy young people by nurturing and inspiring each child within a supportive environment. Our rounded education inspires pupils to achieve their full potential and equip them with the ability to think critically and independently in a rapidly changing world.

We intend to continue to evolve as one of the country's leading schools, recognised for our dynamic and progressive approach to education.

Our Founder, Rev Dr Andrew Reed, was an eminent humanitarian, distinguished by his energetic and prescient campaigns against the many social injustices of his time. After founding seven charitable institutions in England, all of which sought to offer help and dignity to those in need, he then moved to America to advocate for the abolition of slavery and the rights of the indigenous population there. His legacy is at the heart of everything we do at Reed's and our six core values reflect his moral vision.

As such, we instil in our pupils the compassion to help those less fortunate than themselves, the integrity to call out injustice, the curiosity to seek solutions and the independence and resilience

to stand up for what they believe in. In doing so, we are able to develop their understanding of their responsibilities as global citizens, as well as their capacity to create positive change in the world.

Reed's School was originally established as a school for orphaned children.

Andrew Reed's belief that an excellent education in a supportive, family-like environment has the power to transform lives still holds true today. Through the Andrew Reed Foundation, approximately 10% of pupils at Reed's are Foundation pupils, having experienced childhood traumas leading to family breakdown.

Supporting these children underpins the pastoral framework of the School, from which all our pupils benefit.









## Provide a nurturing environment



For children to thrive academically and socially they need to feel safe and happy, to be shown and to show compassion to those around them, to feel confident in their own abilities and have the selfesteem to express their own distinctive individuality. This belief is fundamental to everything we do at Reed's.

Our pastoral care achieves this aim by emphasising values, character, well-being and by offering a range of experiences to provide a rounded education. We also provide a suite of tailored support structures to ensure that all pupils are nurtured and encouraged. This spans from the induction programmes to welcome new pupils before they start, into each day of the pupil's time at the school, right through to when they are making their way in the wider world.

At the centre of this is our House structure. Heads of House, along with their team of tutors, oversee the all-round development of each individual child. Care is planned and attuned specifically for boys up to the age of sixteen and then adapts accordingly to welcome girls into our co-educational Sixth Form.

Since the founding of the School in 1813, we have always welcomed everyone into our community as individuals and continue to place great store on the cultivation of one's individuality. Our core values help us to underline the need for all those in the school community to treat every individual with respect, courtesy and consideration. We see it as the responsibility of all members of our community to maintain our inclusive ethos.





## Promote academic excellence





At Reed's we have a culture of innovative, dynamic and progressive teaching which ensures that our pupils learn because they are excited, engaged and, like their teachers, passionate and curious about the world around them.

Using our unique Reed's Learning Model, we prepare our pupils for the future by developing their higher-order thinking skills, whilst also instilling a lifelong love of learning. With the world and technology changing at an ever-increasing rate it is imperative that our pupils, and our staff, have both the resilience and the cognitive and behavioural flexibility to adapt. Therefore, as well as stressing the importance of in-depth subject knowledge, our learning model also enhances one's ability to impart that knowledge and develops the capacity to make connections between multiple ideas and disciplines.

By continuously adopting new technologies and deploying cutting-edge pedagogical practices, our teachers raise the academic performance of all our pupils. Our extensive reporting system enables effective and detailed feedback to parents while our proprietary academic tracking process assists our teachers in supporting the progress of every pupil in real-time.

The Academic Curriculum provides an expansive education before pupils choose their GCSE/IGCSE and A Level subjects, encompassing entrepreneurship, leadership, computing and our pioneering, cross-curricular FutureTech programme. Additionally, educational trips, academic societies, visiting speakers and work experience all combine to enhance our pupils' competencies, preparing them for the careers of the future.
