Welcome



SUCCESS

Be ready to take on the World

Everybody views success differently. Our job at Crown Hills is more than just ensuring that your child has every opportunity to choose whatever they want after they leave us; they also need guidance and support to be politically-literate British citizens with a full appreciation and understanding of their global responsibilities.

We know that while the world is becoming smaller, it is also becoming more challenging. Therefore, your child will require the resilience to cope with an ever-changing world and with whatever life throws at them so that, together, we can ensure that the world becomes a better place. We want our pupils to take on the world, not just fit into it.

At Crown Hills, the experiences your child will receive will place them in a prime position to be successful in the future. Currently, over 96% of our students remain in education, employment or training when they leave us, which is much higher than the national average.

Our results in 2018 placed us in the top 25% of schools nationally for progress and 8th in the county of Leicestershire. We are expecting further improvements in 2019. We were also inspected by OFSTED in 2019 and all aspects were judged as good with Leadership and Management of the college being regarded as outstanding.





Happiness, Safety and Well-being

The core purpose of Crown Hills Community College since it opened in 1950 has been to help students learn. We do this by developing comprehensive and detailed teaching and learning strategies that facilitate excellent academic progress. Since its inception, Crown Hills has been child-centred and every decision that is made is done with them in mind. We, therefore, take their safety, happiness and well-being extremely seriously.

We provide:

- a strong core curriculum that supports literacy and numeracy;
- a range of learning pathways to offer support and challenge to the more able;
- innovative and stimulating learning experiences.

How students are supported?

Crown Hills values students' well-being and their opinions as well as their achievement. All students are individuals and have a variety of needs, some of which are complex. Students with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), those who are more able and, indeed, the majority of students that fit into neither of these categories all need support and challenge. Therefore, we employ a team that includes social inclusion workers, psychologists, counsellors, welfare officers, assistant heads of year, heads of year and tutors, all of whom offer their time and support. In addition to our teachers, this team ensures that students are not only protected from bullying but are equipped with the skills that they need to protect themselves from things like cyber-bullying, sexual exploitation and radicalisation.

Pupils told inspectors that they felt safe and well cared for in school. They know who they can talk to if they have any worries or concerns and this information is displayed permanently around the school

Students at Crown Hills are taught in an environment that promotes the academic, sporting, creative and linguistic development: this is the Crown Hills Way.

ACADEMIC We will not compromise on students achieving exceptional levels of academic progress. We are rigorous in our teaching while engaging with our students' interests and inspiring them to achieve the highest academic standards. Behaviour is exceptional; classrooms are focused and students are required to complete their classwork, and the regular homework which we set them, to the best of their ability.

SPORTING As a designated Sports College, we are committed to promoting healthy lifestyles and encouraging wide participation in sport and sport leadership. We have student leaders of sport who support the delivery and development of physical activity with pupils with disabilities as well as in partnership with local primary schools. We also deliver a bespoke fencing programme for top athletes as we aim to take part in international competitions.

CREATIVE Learning experiences are promoted across all subjects and the creative subjects are regarded highly in our college. Every student has access and an entitlement to a wide range of creative opportunities through the formal curriculum, including trips, performances and productions.

LINGUISTIC Speaking another language is an invaluable skill in the 21st Century. Our students must be ready to take on the world. For that reason, every child will have the opportunity to study at least one foreign language and will also be given the opportunity to travel to France as part of their studies. Some of our more able students will also have their pastoral/tutor time taught to them in French over their five years here with us so that they master the nuances of the language.

You have also reviewed the schools curriculum and taken decisive action to ensure the breadth of pupil's learning experiences...You have monitored the schools commitment to sport and physical activity in support of prioritising pupils healthy lifestyles.

Duke of Edinburgh Award

Crown Hills Community College is proud to be an official Duke of Edinburgh Licensed Organisation. We offer an opportunity for students from years 9 and 10 to take on their Bronze D of E Award. Valued by employers and universities. Completing the award requires students to demonstrate commitment across four different elements over a period of 6 months.

Being able to work as part of a team is crucial to being successful in this element. Our experience tells us that the award provides our young people with new insights into their capabilities. Putting themselves outside of their comfort zone by trying new things, it really helps them to grow in confidence. Additionally, they develop a plethora of new skills through the activities they undertake.

Expressive Arts – Music

Crown Hills is committed to providing a high quality music education for all students and has been awarded a national Music Mark Award as well as achieving a Gold Music Quality Mark from the Leicester-Shire Music Education Hub for its commitment to music in and out of the classroom as well as the wider community.

All students at Crown Hills are welcome to attend extra-curricular music tuition and ensembles (before school, lunchtimes and after school). Students can choose from Bass Guitar, Bassoon, Clarinet, Dhol, Drum Kit, Electronic Keyboard, Flute, Guitar, Music Technology, Pitched Percussion, Saxophone, Steel Band, Tabla, Trumpet, and Violin. Students learning to play a musical instrument also have the opportunity to take graded music exams for their specific instrument.

International Student Leaders

Our World Leaders Club provides the opportunity for students to expand their knowledge of the World around us. Students have explore the traditions, cuisines, national dress for different cultures from all corners of the World.

They have increased their knowledge of the changing political situation in this country and how countries around the World are ruled. Students are then 'ready to take on the world'.

Leadership Academy

The Leadership Academy has students from all year groups and they play an integral role in supporting key events at Crown Hills such as Open Evenings, Parents Evenings, tours of the school, and sporting and Musical Performances.

If your child has the leadership potential, we will nurture and grow it by providing the appropriate and accredited training.

Inclusive Sport
