Helping you succeed



During your first few weeks, you and your tutor will set challenging but achievable targets tailored to your progress and career aspirations. Your progress towards your targets will be shared with your parents or carers.

You must attend classes, including maths and English and work experience placements, or provide a valid reason for your absence. Any absence will be followed up and your attendance and punctuality will be discussed at reviews with your parents or carers.

WHAT IF I NEED EXTRA HELP?

We strongly encourage you to tell us about any additional learning or physical needs you have when you apply. That way we can make sure that any help you need is in place for when you start your course. We also have a counsellor and a nurse available during term time.

If you are in care or have recently left care, we will ensure you have a strong support network at college. We can work with other agencies to help you in a range of ways, from giving you emotional support to practical advice and, in some cases, financial support. For example, we've helped our students deal with housing issues and change accommodation, buy emergency food, pay for trips and help with purchasing safety equipment for the course. Choosing your study programme

CHOOSING YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME

Each full-time student will have their own study programme designed. We'll start with your full-time course, and we'll talk to you about what you've already achieved and what we think will help you progress towards your future career.

If you don't already have a grade C or above at GCSE English and maths then these subjects or Functional Skills will be added to your study programme. Your study programme may also include a work experience placement, an extended project, and workshops to help you search and apply for jobs.

Study programmes include at least 540 hours spread across the academic year. All parts of it are compulsory.

CHOOSING YOUR COURSE

The pages in this prospectus will give you an overview of the courses we offer. The team are Matrix-accredited, which means they give expert and impartial information on your career. How to apply

EXPLORE YOUR OPTIONS

Find out more about our courses on our website. Come to an Open Evening and chat to staff and current students, to find out more about what studying at Nescot is like.

APPLY ONLINE

Search for your course on our website and click 'apply online'. Fill out the form on-screen. Once we've received your application we'll send you a confirmation email.

BOOK YOUR INTERVIEW

We'll email you an invitation to book your interview in our applicant portal.

THE INTERVIEW

You'll be asked why you want to study the subjects you've chosen. We'll make sure the course and level are right for you. Remember: We're all here to help you. We want you to start your course at Nescot confident that you've chosen the right subject for you.

THE OFFER

We'll consider your application and interview carefully, and hope to be able to offer you a place. Your offer may be conditional on you getting particular GCSE grades.

ACCEPTING THE OFFER

The Advice & Guidance team will ask you to accept your offer of a place through the applicant portal. You will need to do this within three weeks, or we cannot guarantee your place.

WELCOME AND INDUCTION DAY

We will invite you to a Welcome and Induction Day, usually in late June. This will give you the opportunity to do fun activities and meet the people on your course.

JOIN AND ENROL AT NESCOT

In July we will send you a time and date to come into college to finalise your place by enrolling. Enrolment begins on GCSE results day. Make sure you come to enrol no matter what you get in your GCSEs. We may be able to move you to a different level if this would be more suitable.

AUTUMN - PRIORITY BOARDING

Every year we get more applications than we have places available, so we advise you to apply early. If you apply by January 16 2017 we will guarantee you an interview.


SPRING - LAST CALL

Applications after the January deadline will still be accepted but we cannot guarantee an interview if your chosen course is full.

SUMMER - GATE CLOSING

Even after all the places on a course have been accepted we may still be able to offer you a place on a waiting list. If you accept a place on a waiting list it is important that you have an alternative backup plan as well, because we cannot guarantee that everyone on the list will get a place.

Apprenticeships

Doing an apprenticeship is a way of learning a profession by combining studying the knowledge and skills at college with getting real work experience in a paid job.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF DOING AN APPRENTICESHIP?

- ➤ You get the best of both worlds.

 Earn money and get experience working, while getting the experience, skills and qualifications that employers want you to have.
- ➤ Great support. Again, you'll get the best of both worlds, with all the support you need from both Nescot and your employer.
- ► Learn at your own pace. As an apprentice, you're encouraged to take the time you need to understand something, and ask for help if you don't.
- Do a real job. All apprentices do 'real' jobs, usually alongside full-time colleagues, so you can get a sense of what your career will be like day-to-day once you finish your training.
- ▶ Practical experience. By the time you finish your training you'll not only be qualified to work in the industry you're training in, you'll have an understanding of your role and sector that you can't find in a book.
- ▶ Transferrable skills. Although your training will be specific to your profession, you'll also gain skills like time management and teamwork, and improve your numeracy and literacy skills.

▶ Great prospects. You could progress to the next apprenticeship level, go into Higher Education, stay with your company or look for a new job elsewhere. Our apprentices tell us their experience helps them stand out, and makes them feel more self-confident.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP?

Anyone who is living in England, aged 16 or older, not in full-time education, and doesn't already possess a qualification at Level 4 or above.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

Entry requirements vary between courses, but they are flexible. You will need to show that you are interested in and committed to the course vou've chosen.

HOW CAN I FIND A JOB?

To do an apprenticeship you need a contract of employment in a relevant job. If you don't have a job, Nescot can help. Call the Employer Hub to find out more.

HOW MUCH WILL I EARN AS AN APPRENTICE?

As an apprentice you're guaranteed to earn at least the National Minimum Wage for Apprentices. This is currently £3.30 per hour. There is no upper limit to what apprentices can be paid, and many are paid much more than the minimum wage.

HOW WILL I BE TAUGHT?

Most apprentices spend one day a week at Nescot, and the rest working for their employer. At college you'll be taught in a variety of ways, including:

- Practical and theory classes
- One-to-one tutorials, guidance and support
- Practical and written assessments. with feedback
- Being observed at work by a qualified assessor.

HOW LONG DO APPRENTICESHIPS TAKE?

Apprenticeships are flexible. Your end date will be agreed at the start of your apprenticeship by you, your employer and your assessor. A Level 2 apprenticeship usually takes 12-24 months, a Level 3 is usually 12-36 months, and a Level 4 qualification takes 24 months on average.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

You will gain a National Vocational Qualification, otherwise known as an NVQ. For example:

- Level 2 (Intermediate) NVQ in Hairdressing. equivalent to five GCSEs at grades A-C;
- Level 3 NVQ in Plumbing, equivalent to two A-Levels: or
- Level 4 NVQ in IT, roughly equivalent to a Foundation Degree.

WHAT CAN I DO AFTER MY APPRENTICESHIP?

Depending on your level, you could progress to the next level apprenticeship or to Higher Education. You could look for a full-time job at your company or elsewhere. Apprentices tell us their real-life work experience helps them stand out, and improves their confidence too.

WHAT KIND OF SUPPORT WILL **NESCOT GIVE ME?**

At Nescot we pride ourselves on making sure you have all the support you need to excel. We have a team of advisors available to support you through your time at Nescot and to answer any questions you have. You'll be taught by highly-qualified tutors and assessors, who are experts in their profession. If you're doing functional skills you'll be taught by a team of English, ICT and maths tutors who are experienced not just in getting you through your exams but in teaching you the skills you'll use every day in your career.

Animal and Landbased Studies

With purpose-built facilities surrounding the main campus buildings, more than two-thirds of the college's available space is dedicated to this department.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ▶ Theory sessions are reinforced by practical classes on Nescot's Animal Care Unit, to ensure that you are well equipped with the skills and knowledge to begin a career in the landbased industry.
- Nescot's 20-acre plot is home to a wide range of exotic, agricultural and domestic animals, which you will be responsible for.
- Our courses attract people aiming for careers across the landbased industries, from zoo keepers and animal trainers to veterinary nurses and farmers.
- You will be taught by highly-qualified and experienced staff, who are experts in their fields.
- ➤ The department has links with Chessington Zoo & Sea Life Centre, the Blue Cross, Surrey Wildlife Trust and Surrey and Kingston universities.



Previous students, including TV wildlife presenter David Bellamy, have gone on to Higher Education, while others work in zoos, veterinary surgeries, wildlife sanctuaries, conservation projects, animal charities, kennels, and the pet industry.



We work with a huge range of animals, from farm to exotic to domestic. We learn a lot about how to take care of them and handle them, and a lot about working in the industry. There's a lot of focus on our careers.


