



Train from Liverpool Street Station (Chingford Line) to Wood Street Station then by taxi.

Board the Central Line to Snaresbrook Station then walk 15 minutes or take a taxi. Alternatively, board the Victoria Line to Walthamstow Central Station then take a taxi. Uber or bus route 20 (Loughton).



Route 20 stops in both directions along Woodford New Road and route W12 stops in both directions along Snaresbrook Road, leaving a short walk to the school.


Forest benefits from an exceptional location on the edge of Epping Forest. This enviable advantage, however, does present significant parking and traffic management challenges.

The Forest School is sited within the London Borough of Waltham Forest, a borough with a strong and commendable commitment to improving air quality throughout the borough.

This includes measures aimed at reducing congestion and car use, both of which cause difficulties around the School at busy drop-off and pick-up times, and we work with the Council to develop our travel plan.

As a School with over 1,430 children, it would be a dereliction of our duty of care not to support measures to improve the air quality around the site - not least because of the effect pollutants have on a child's lung development and which can lead to significant respiratory and cardiovascular conditions.

Diagram Key






Two Way traffic flow

With this in mind please be aware of the following:

- Forest School sits within the Forest Rising controlled parking zone (active from 10:00-16:00).
- Snaresbrook Road is a no-parking/nostopping road – at any time.
- Access to the School is via a one-way system: you may approach the School via The Forest only and leave by Forest Rise or Oakhurst Gardens.
- You cannot access the School from Woodford New Road as Oakhurst Gardens becomes one-way at the junction with College Place and Forest Rise is one-way only.

- There are double yellow lines on the field side directly opposite the front of the School.
- There are double yellow lines along Forest Rise and Oakhurst Gardens.
- Do not leave your engine idling at any time. Vehicle idling is an offence against the Road Traffic (Vehicle Emissions) (Fixed Penalty) (England) Regulations 2002. The law states that is an offence to idle your engine unnecessarily when stationary.
- Traffic wardens are active at busy times.
- Please be aware there is very limited parking here at the School.
