# A world of discovery

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Sparking our pupils' natural curiosity lies at the heart of our approach to teaching and learning. From Nursery upwards all pupils are taught PE, French, Music and Performing Arts. In EYFS we also include regular Forest School sessions. ICT, German, Spanish, Art, DT and Science are introduced in later years. The core subjects of English, Maths, History, Geography, PSHE and RE are taught with an imaginative approach. We go beyond the knowledge and skills outlined in the National Curriculum, providing a bespoke offering where strong and meaningful links are made between subjects to enhance the pupils' learning experiences. We follow the principles of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework with a strong emphasis on developing children's literacy and number sense. French, Music, Dance, PE and Drama are also offered and taught by specialist teachers.

Outdoor learning is a key part of our curriculum and come rain or shine, our youngest pupils are given the freedom to explore and have fun in our Forest Schools where they get to enjoy the natural world.





# Our Pre-Prep

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The Pre-Prep welcomes children from Reception through to the end of Year 2. Learning in our Pre-Prep is vibrant and exciting, with a wide variety of subjects taught through a well-sequenced curriculum. In Pre-Prep we encourage a sense of independence and inspire pupils to explore and question the world around them. We nurture each child, celebrate their strengths, and support them fully so they can flourish and reach their full potential.

The Reception classes follow an enhanced Early Years curriculum. This is designed to prepare them for progression into Years 1 and 2 where children are taught a broad range of subjects in dedicated lessons for Literacy, Mathematics, Science, Geography, History, Computing, French, Music, PE and RE.

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From the early years upwards, children demonstrate articulate communication skills and extensive vocabularies.

# Our Prep

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As our pupils move into the Prep at Year 3 we focus on building their confidence and encourage them to continue being inquisitive learners who think critically.

The curriculum remains broad in the Prep, right through to Year 6, with a firm commitment to providing pupils with a rich and varied education in the performing arts, sport, art and design, as well as a continuing rigorous focus on the academic subjects.

As in the Pre-Prep, lessons continue to be taught by specialist teachers, with form teachers also providing excellent pastoral care for their pupils. By the time they reach Year 6, our pupils have benefitted from a varied and stimulating education and are well-equipped for the next stage of their education.





# Moving on

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In Year 5 and Year 6 we prepare our pupils well for their 11+ and senior school entrance exams, as well as supporting our parents in the choices that they are making for their child.

Each year, our pupils consistently achieve outstanding results in entrance exams, for both the maintained and the independent sectors. They successfully gain offers from many of the leading schools in South East London and Kent, including Alleyn's, Dulwich College, Eltham College and the Kent Grammar schools. In 2025, 70% of our leavers achieved scholarship offers from their schools of choice.

## **Part of the Eltham College family of schools**

Pupils at Blackheath Prep who select Eltham College as their choice of senior school are offered a preferential admissions process. Our pupils have the option to sit an early test at the start of Year 6 and successful pupils are offered a place at Eltham College ahead of external candidates which is not available to any other feeder school. This enables our pupils to then withdraw from the 11+ cycle.

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Pupils are successful both in achieving entry to senior schools of their choice and in gaining academic, music, sporting, drama and art scholarships.

# Shine on stage

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The arts are a key part of the curriculum at Blackheath Prep. We firmly believe that creativity is fundamental to children's development, confidence and wellbeing.

## Feel the beat

Music is at the heart of our school life. From Nursery to Year 6, all pupils have dedicated music lessons each week and learn at least one instrument, taught by one of our ten highly experienced peripatetic staff. With six choirs, two orchestras, a wind band, a jazz band, recorder and flute ensembles, and a guitar club, we ensure that there are plenty of opportunities for pupils to develop a passion and appreciation for music.

## Let's dance

Dance lessons at Blackheath Prep are taught by a specialist teacher and are purposely designed to be fun and inclusive with an emphasis on the positive effect that movement can have on our pupils' wellbeing. Dance genres and styles from around the world are explored, including jive, salsa, bhangra, hip hop, ballet, contemporary, African dance, jazz, flamenco and disco.

## Take centre stage

From Nursery upwards, all pupils have weekly Performing Arts lessons, taught a specialist teacher with a background in professional theatre. Every child is given the opportunity to shine during the school year and perform in school assemblies, the Christmas nativity and our wonderful end of year productions.

# Learning support

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Children may experience learning challenges for all sorts of reasons. Our learning support provision is embedded into the teaching culture of the school to ensure help is provided where it's needed.

Our Learning Support department work closely with teaching staff across the school to identify and nurture a wide range of abilities and talents. They create an inclusive and motivational atmosphere that supports the educational and pastoral needs of pupils. This includes children with SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities), EAL (English as an Additional Language), and exceptionally able students. In class, teachers and teaching assistants provide additional support both in small groups and individually.





# Eating well

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Lunchtime is an important part of our school day. Our pupils look forward to lunch and come together to enjoy a tasty and healthy meal with their classmates. We offer an imaginative, weekly changing menu which uses fresh ingredients and the finest British produce sourced from local farmers, growers and artisan suppliers.

In collaboration with our catering partner, Thomas Franks, pupils take part in food education classes. Tasting sessions encourage them to try new types of food, exotic fruit and vegetables, and learn about seasonality.

# Wraparound care

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To help meet the needs of parents, we offer wraparound care providing a relaxed and sociable environment at the start and end of each school day (additional charges apply).

## **Breakfast Club and Late Stay**

Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am on weekday mornings during term time and is open to all pupils from Nursery upwards. Games, activities and a hearty breakfast sets each child up for the day ahead. A late stay provision is available until 6pm following our after-school clubs. Children can relax and socialise with friends, supervised by our friendly staff who occupy them with indoor and outdoor games, construction toys, and art and craft activities. A light evening meal is served at 5pm (when booked in advance, charges apply).

## **School Clubs**

We offer a wealth of exciting clubs and activities enabling pupils to try new things and explore favourite passions. Over 70 lunchtime and after school clubs take place every week, including art and crafts, coding, dance, lego, gardening, writing, chess and sports clubs.

# How to apply

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We welcome applications from all children, regardless of background, who will thrive in this academically stimulating environment and who will benefit from, and contribute to, all areas of school life.

## Register online

Registrations should be completed online at [blackheathprep.openapply.com](http://blackheathprep.openapply.com) together with payment of a £180 non-refundable fee to complete the registration process.

In all year groups we accept children by assessment, not on a first come, first served basis.

Nursery is the usual point of entry to the school, with an additional intake at 7+ in Year 3.

If you are interested in registering your child for a place in another year group, please complete the online registration form and we will contact you when an occasional vacancy arises.

## Offers

Offers are made in writing once all assessments have been completed. Places are offered to pupils who meet our admissions requirements according to the number of places available.

When you accept a place, we ask you to pay a non-refundable deposit of £1,500 and sign a contract which outlines the standard terms and conditions under which your child is accepted as a pupil at Blackheath Prep.

Following assessments, we keep a reserve list of children. Should a place become available in the year group for which your child has been assessed, we will contact candidates on our reserve list with an offer of a place.

## Nursery intake

Children join the Nursery at the intake following their 3rd birthday. We have two intakes, one in January and one in September.

## January entry (Nursery A)

If your child's birthday falls between 1 September and 31 December, you have the option for them to join our January intake into a small Nursery class of up to 16 pupils. These pupils automatically transfer into the main Nursery classes in the following September.

Please note, children eligible for the January intake may wish to be assessed instead for the September intake. However, if children attend the assessment for the January intake and are unsuccessful, they will be unable to be reassessed for September entry.

## September entry (Nursery 1 and 2)

If your child's birthday falls between 1 September and 31 August your child is eligible for entry in September.

## 7+ intake (Year 3)

We offer a limited number of places for children wishing to join us in Year 3. The number of places available varies each year.

## Occasional vacancies

Occasionally places become available in other year groups.

Occasional vacancies may occur at any point in the academic year.

# Assessments

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At Blackheath Prep we assess for entry into all year groups.

### 3+ Entry (Nursery) - What to expect

Our Nursery assessments take place in the morning, as part of a play-based session. Each session may include up to 12 children. Our aim is for your child to have a positive experience with us, in a warm and friendly environment, with adults that are kind and responsive to their individual needs and interests.

The assessment process takes approximately one hour, during which time refreshments are provided for parents, with an opportunity to meet the Head and members of the Senior Leadership Team.

All staff engaging with your child during the play session are highly experienced and will take into account the month in which your child was born. If your child's first language is not English, this will also be considered, as will any developmental delays.

### The play session

- The Nursery environment is set up with a selection of activities aimed at engaging children's interests. These include construction, small world play, malleable play, drawing and puzzles.
- We are looking to see how curious the children are and how well they engage with the activities provided. We also observe how the children focus on the activities, and how well they engage and communicate with the adults and children alongside them.

### 7+ Entry (Year 3) – What to expect

At 7+ children are invited to attend assessments during the Spring Term preceding the September of entry. We complete assessments in English, maths and reasoning.

### Entry into other years

Assessments take place at all entry points into the school and will be age appropriate. For entry into other years, assessments are held as occasional vacancies arise.

### Sibling policy

In keeping with our family ethos, where possible, priority will be given to siblings of current Blackheath Prep pupils and to those with a recent family connection with the school.

Under current HMRC rules, we can only accept payment of fees by childcare voucher up to, and including the term in which your child turns five. After this date, school fees are no longer classified as childcare costs. You can continue to use the vouchers to pay for breakfast club, after school clubs and late stay throughout your child's time at the school.


