Plumstead Manor is a thriving secondary school with a mixed Sixth Form, with just short of 1500 students on roll. 
Why Work at Plumstead Manor School?

Great Location

The school is located beside Plumstead Common, a green and leafy oasis, an ideal place for a lunch time walk or a picnic in the summer. A woodland ravine at the edge of the common is recognised as a nature conservation area and is largely made up of woodland and is a haven for bird life and many species of butterfly. There is a bowling green and hard surface tennis courts and the common is also home to Greenwich Rugby Football Club. The school has good transport links with a range of buses stopping outside. Plumstead Station is a 15 minute walk away and Woolwich Arsenal station is only a short bus ride and is a DLR as well as mainline rail station. Central London is only 20 minutes away and Stratford station (Westfield Shopping Centre and Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park) are only a short distance on the DLR. City Airport is not far away. Road links are also good with the M25 not far away and the Blackwall tunnel and Woolwich Ferry providing links to east London. In addition the Thames Clipper commuter ferry runs services from Woolwich to Canary Wharf and the City. The Emirates Air Line cable car crosses the Thames from North Greenwich to the Royal Docks and the Elizabeth line.



A Rich History

Our school has been a centre of education for over a hundred years. Founded as Plumstead County School for Girls in 1913, it was later named Kings Warren Grammar, then in 1967 the school was renamed Plumstead Manor.

Plumstead Manor is located in the Royal Borough of Greenwich which lies on the south bank of the River Thames. Our borough is steeped in maritime, military and royal history with the town centre being designated a UNESCO World Heritage site and home of the Prime Meridian. Famous landmarks are the Cutty Sark, the Royal Observatory, the National Maritime Museum and Queens House and t the Old Royal Naval College. The capital's oldest Royal Park, Greenwich Park, (once a hunting ground of the royal palace), offers panoramic views of London and Greenwich's iconic O2 Arena. In recognition of the area's royal connections through history, and to mark her Diamond Jubilee, the Queen bestowed royal status on the borough.

Leisure Activities

Plumstead is not far from Blackheath Village and the historic centre of Greenwich, both of which have an excellent range of restaurants and independent shops. You can find food and drink for any occasion and from all over the world in Greenwich. Greenwich Market is a historic market established in 1700, with a wide variety of stalls including craft, antiques, jewellery, food and many more. Greenwich boasts one of London's premiere off-West End theatres which presents a year round programme of high quality drama, comedy, music theatre, children's shows and one of the country's most acclaimed pantomimes. There are also 3 cinema complexes in the borough ranging from a large multi screen cinema to the more intimate Picture House. There are 11 sports and leisure centres in Royal Greenwich offering a mixture of swimming, exercise classes, sports facilities and lessons. These include Sutcliffe Park Athletics Track, Southmere boating centre and Charlton Lido.





Teaching

The quality of teaching at Plumstead Manor School is consistently graded good or better in externally verified teaching and learning reviews.

The curriculum and all other activities allow the students to see themselves as global citizens with a deep sense of humanity.

The training that teachers receive is high quality and relevant with a sharp focus on improving the experience for students in the classroom.

Our teachers know our students well and foster purposeful relationships.



All staff undertake regular teaching sessions throughout the year to ensure that practice remains dynamic, relevant and keeps pace with the ever changing curriculum landscape. We support staff to keep their subject knowledge up to date as this is the foundation of academic excellence in the classroom.

All of our teachers are specialists in their field. Their enthusiasm for their subjects permeates their lessons and many have gained experience in industry, prior to their teaching careers.

Our teachers benefit from the opportunity to visit other schools to share best practice and gain valuable experience that they are able to bring back to the school. Working in partnership as part of a family of local schools is key to our ethos.

All staff are expected to have high aspirations for our pupils and we consistently encourage and support pupils to reach their full potential. We are proud of their many achievements when they leave our learning community and many return as staff, parents and members of our growing alumni.

Inclusion


