Strathallan School was founded in 1913 in Bridge of Allan, near Stirling, but quickly outgrew its original site. In 1920, the school moved to the Freeland Estate in Forgardenny, a few miles south east of Scotland's ancient capital the City of Perth.

The campus is ideally situated for accessing the rest of Scotland, whether you want to head north to the ski slopes or south to the political and cultural centres of Edinburgh and Glasgow. Today's travel connections are simple and regular, with frequent trains from Perth and buses through Forgardenny throughout the day.

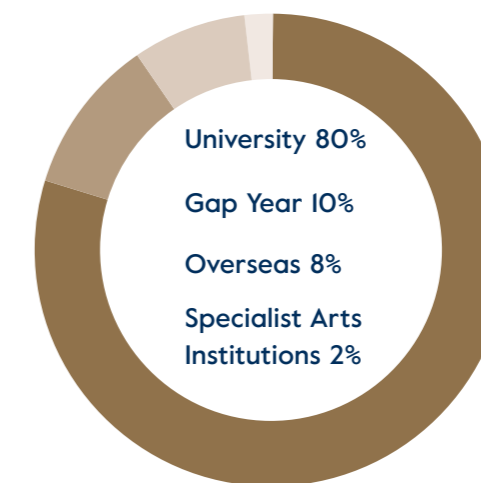
Leavers destinations

Over the last 3 years, our pupils have gone on to study at some of the best universities in the UK and abroad including the University of St Andrews, Russell Group universities, and in the USA, Harvard, Emory & Henry College, Lindenwood and Ringling College of Art & Design.

In 2022, over 80% of our pupils achieved their first-choice university while others have headed off to work, internships or apprenticeships.

This is testament to the specific investment and focus we have given to academic attainment and progression in recent years while maintaining the broad range of other activities in which our pupils excel.

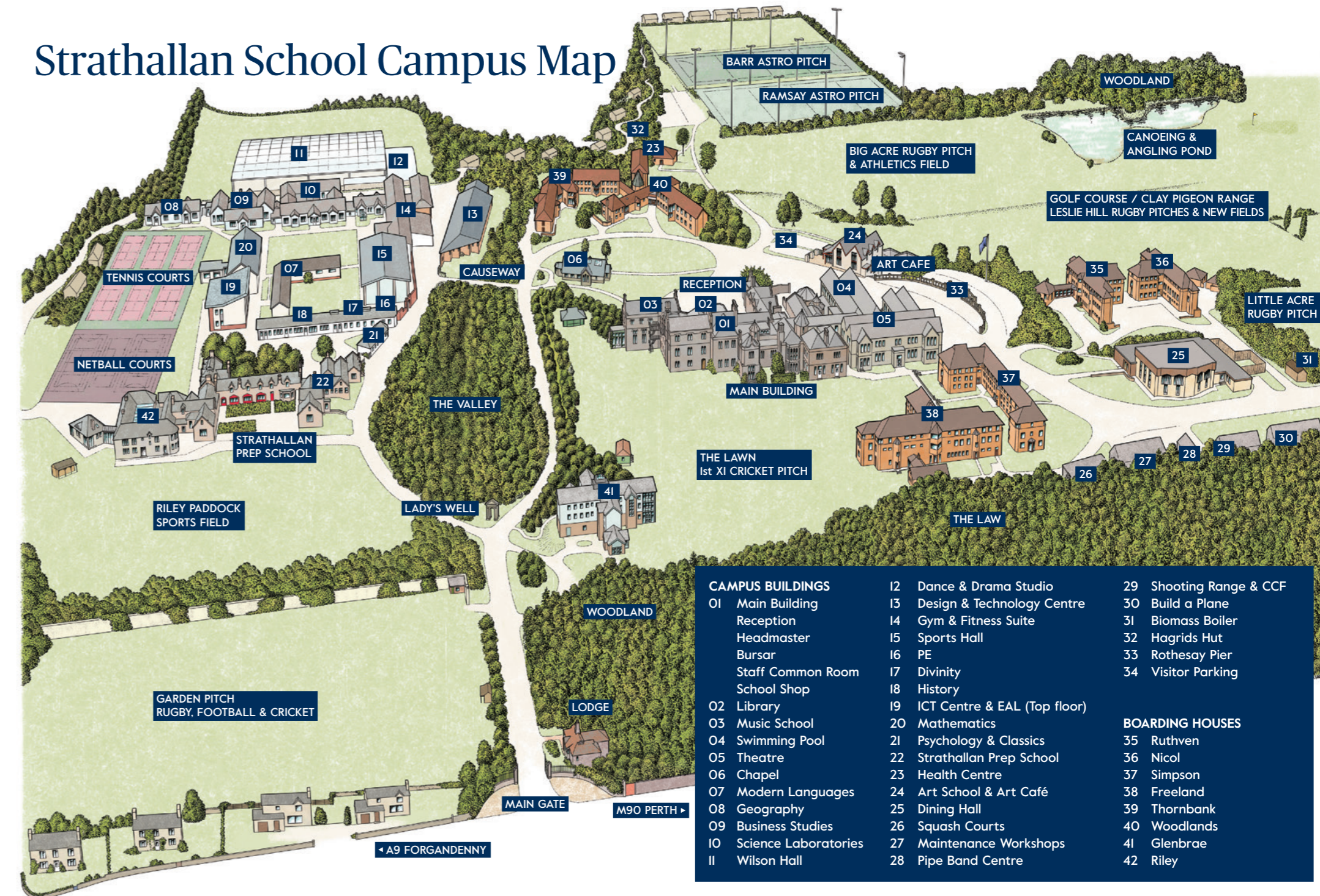
