Welcome to Burlington House School.



A short history of our community

Burlington House School was founded in 1998 as The Moat School by parents who had been searching for an understanding and nurturing educational environment to support their dyslexic children. Over the last 24 years, the school has enabled hundreds of neurodiverse children and young people to rebuild their confidence, discover their talents, enjoy learning and achieve more than they may have ever thought possible.

Since joining the Cavendish Education family of schools in 2017, the school has grown considerably and has experienced much success; it is rated as 'Excellent' by the Independent Schools Inspectorate and has a strong reputation across London. In September 2020 we launched a new Sixth Form, which not only offers a wide-ranging and appropriately demanding curriculum, but also prepares its students for success in Further and Higher Education, employment and adulthood.

A new prep school was opened in 2022 and this completed the Burlington House School group. We have strived to remain true to the original Moat School principles and have our focus firmly rooted in allowing children with dyslexia to achieve all they can, and truly excel in the areas they have such strength in.

Specialist support

Mainstream in structure but specialist in nature, our aim is to provide an education for pupils who have struggled in traditional learning environments. In order to achieve this, whilst following the National Curriculum, our staff are subject specialists and hold a post graduate qualification in teaching learners with specific learning difficulties.

Our Learning Support Assistants (LSAs) are also graduates and hold a level 3 qualification. We believe in continuous professional development and initiate whole school training programmes, to embed specialist teaching throughout all lessons.

In addition to our specialist teaching staff, Burlington House School has a team of therapeutic staff that includes Speech and Language Therapists (SaLT), Occupational Therapists (OT's) and Counsellors.

Speech and Language Therapists at Burlington House School help to improve pupils' receptive and expressive language skills, address vocabulary and grammar needs, literacy skills and verbal reasoning skills. Pupils who have social and emotional difficulties also receive ongoing support throughout their time at the school from the Speech and Language Therapy team through initiatives such as Group Communication sessions and 'Circle of Friends' groups.

The role of Occupational Therapy at Burlington House School is to identify how physical, psychological or Learning Difficulties affect a child's functional skills, and to help remediate these effects or develop compensatory approaches. Through a pupil-centred approach improvements will be seen in the areas of gross and fine motor skills, visual perception, attention, concentration, self-regulation, confidence and self-esteem.

Our school counsellors work closely with pupils who have short or long term anxiety difficulties or who are going through a period of emotional difficulties. Counsellors offer a 'Come and Talk' system by which pupils can knock on their door at any time if they need to talk. They also have a caseload of individuals who they see regularly. The school counsellors offer a variety of therapies including talk therapy and play therapy.

Every opportunity is sought to develop innovative and interesting ways of improving the child's skills during their time at Burlington House School. Through specific skills practice, coping strategies and remediation, therapy ensures all the needs of your child are addressed.

Choosing Burlington House School for your child's education is a choice that will put your child back in the running for academic success, where previously they may not have attained.

Burlington House School's main focus will always be helping pupils to achieve the results they deserve, in an environment that understands their specific needs.





Burlington House Prep School



From an early point in my teaching career, I realised that not every child learns in the same way or at the same time. Just like popcorn kernels don't all 'pop' at the same time, there are those children that require a different approach to learning. Whether there is a specific learning difference or not, surely all children can benefit from a learning environment where their strengths are encouraged and celebrated and their challenges are supported by a dedicated staff.

Here, at Burlington Prep, we continue the success of the senior school (formerly known as The Moat) that was founded in 1998 by parents who wanted a school to support

their dyslexic children. Early intervention is key for those children who are struggling to read, write or understand mathematics and our aim is to support and encourage the children on their learning journey. Having taught in mainstream and independent primary schools as well as internationally and within a specialist setting, I have witnessed the importance of a nurturing environment where a child feels understood and ready to learn. Self-belief, confidence, the ability to reflect on mistakes, resilience and having a growth mindset are just some of the foundations of a child's learning.

I envisage every child to be on a journey at Burlington: not every child will reach the same destination at the same time but we will help them to discover their unique strengths at their own pace. Come and visit!


This prospectus will give you a taste of the curriculum, our ethos and the range of teaching styles and support offered

Dear Students and Parents,

I am very pleased to welcome you to Burlington House Sixth Form. We are two years old now and I believe we are well on our way to being the best option for students who wish to complete their Sixth Form years with us. We work closely with the Senior School site and I believe we have created an atmosphere of true inclusivity within an adult learning environment. Duke of Edinburgh Awards

Burlington House School offers the Duke of Edinburgh's Award at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels across our Senior School and Sixth Form sites. The Bronze Award is open to all Year 10 pupils at our Bishops Avenue site with the option to progress to the Silver award in Year 11. Students at the Sixth Form are encouraged to enrol on the Gold award.

The DofE is a highly valuable, nationally recognised qualification for young people which builds resilience and fosters personal growth.



The Aim of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award is to get young people involved in an enjoyable, challenging and rewarding programme of personal development.

Among the many benefits of the award are self-belief, independence, time management, problem-solving skills, leadership skills and team-work skills. This awards links closely to the underlying ethos of the school, supporting the emotional wellbeing of our pupils and promoting self-reliance and confidence.



Extracurricular

Burlington House School's Enrichment Programme offers our pupils the opportunity to broaden their skills and aspirations through a variety of fun and engaging practical courses that enhance the curriculum and provide avenues for creativity and mastery.

Benefits of Our Enrichment Programme

Enrichment courses present specialist education and learning experiences in areas specifically related to students' vocational aims. It can also help pupils explore interests they may not otherwise have considered, while exposing them to related fields that may be more aligned with their talents and interests. At Burlington House School, we believe in providing direct experience to pupils wherever possible. Enrichment compliments the curriculum and fits with the character of the school.

Burlington House School's Enrichment courses are planned specifically to promote and develop problem solving and creative thinking skills, teamwork, behavioural and social skills, citizenship and decision-making skills. We hold an Enrichment Fair at the beginning of each term, where pupils choose 4 enrichments from the 12 different courses on offer.

A Comprehensive Range of Enrichment Courses

The parameters of our enrichment courses are expansive, from Lego Robotics to African Drumming. Those interested in drama have explored Set Design, Puppetry, Special Effects Make-up and our Improvisational Comedy Club.

Those with technical interests have taken Stop-Frame Animation, IT Functional Skills, Model Making and Further Additional Science.

Outdoor physical enrichment courses have included Gardening, Orienteering, Rock-Climbing, and The Duke of Edinburgh Award. Other enrichment courses offered thus far are Travelling Without Moving - Cultural Exploration, Bread Making, Martial Arts, Chess Club, T-shirt Design and Debating. We consistently monitor popular and specialist interests to offer enrichment courses that are challenging, interesting and match the creative and educational aims of our student body.



Open days

We only make individual appointments by invitation after our Admissions Team has reviewed an applicant's paperwork. However, if you would like to view the school before sending in your child's paperwork then please come to one of our Open Mornings.

Each term the school holds two Open Mornings where prospective parents and associated professionals are welcomed. Tours of the school take place in small groups, escorted by current pupils; these provide an opportunity to see teaching and learning in action. There is an opportunity to meet with staff in an informal setting on concluding the tour.

Admissions

Here at Burlington House School we try our best to help you make the right choice for your child and your family.
