


The journey begins here...



We have a highly trained group of staff working closely with students, staff and families to always provide support where it is needed.

At the core of this provision is a year system led by a progress leader and supported by coaches, student support and the inclusion team. This system provides your child with the care they need whilst allowing them to nurture friendships and develop a strong sense of community. You will receive regular updates of your child's progress through written reports, online data and at Parents' Evening. 
Teachers at St Mark's teach responsively and plan learning carefully. We set clear goals and ensure that students meet the same 'Big Ideas' at different points and in different contexts across their 7 years at St Mark's. Our curriculum is carefully sequenced and designed to ensure that students know and remember more over time. In lessons, we use a range of strategies to check students' understanding and to identify where they need further support or challenge, and adapt our planning accordingly. This personalised approach means that our students make excellent progress during their time at St Mark's.

Students receive high quality career guidance in the form of one to one interviews, assemblies, coaching time activities and work related learning. This helps all students to be clear on their ambitions and to fulfil their full potential in their next steps and beyond.

We believe that every student, with a willingness to work hard and overcome any challenges can and will achieve great things and aspire to greatness. Our dedicated teachers motivate students to aim high and encourage every student to exceed their own expectations. Our curriculum is broad and balanced and maximises the opportunities for a successful transition into higher or further education, training and employment.

Pathways to Success

The curriculum at St Mark's has been carefully designed to prepare our students to be successful in the 21st Century world. Skilfully constructed programmes of study coupled with high quality teaching and learning and excellent facilities allow our students to fulfil their potential.

Students in Key Stage 3 follow a broad and balanced curriculum that is engineered to maximise progress in the core areas of English, Mathematics and Science. We offer a wide range of traditional academic subjects, languages, Geography, History and RE alongside more practical subjects such as Art, PE, Drama, Music, Design Technology and ICT.

All our programmes of study at Key Stage 3 are built with the demands of GCSE and A Level in mind: students follow a logical 'spiral' where knowledge, understanding and skills are developed from Year 7 through to the end of Year 13, ready for university entry, employment or training. Our GCSE programme offers a very wide range of core and optional subjects.

We follow a model of a three-year key stage 4 at the Academy, giving the students the time and opportunity to maximise outcomes in the Year 11 GCSE examinations. Students go through a carefully designed 'guided choice' process in Year 8 in order to select the best possible profile of subjects for themselves. All students take Mathematics, English Language and Literature, Double Award Science and RE.

In addition to this, students take 3 subjects from: History, Geography, Spanish, French, PE, Drama, Music, Design Technology, Sociology, Art, Film Studies, BTEC ICT, BTEC Business or Functional Skills. This offer ensures that all students are well place with options to further their studies in Key Stage 5 either here in Sixth Form, at college or Apprenticeship programme.

We are committed to ensuring that every student is afforded the opportunity to aspire to greatness whatever their ability or level of need. Our impressive provisions for our high flyers enables them to be expertly stretched and challenged as they work as part of the Russel group. This enables them to participate in extra activities such as debating, collaborating with the Brilliant club and visiting top universities to get them thinking straight away about their future endeavours. Likewise, our SEND department is a beacon of excellence which leads the way in their innovative approach to ensuring highly bespoke support is always in place should any student require it. This allows any young person with any additional needs to be fully supported to ensure that they too go on to achieve to their full potential. This also applies to our fantastic EAL department who work closely with every student who comes to the Academy who may not speak English as their first language. Again, as each student is different we create a tailor made support plan, so they are fully supported and given all the skills needed for them to quickly feel confident to be fully immersed in mainstream lessons.

Throughout the curriculum, subject teachers focus on developing cross-curricular skills including literacy and numeracy along with Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural skills (SMSC). The development of these skills ensures students are able to learn effectively and independently.


Preparing for Success in the Future

At St Mark's, our mission is to provide an outstanding education for every young adult that learns with us. As a school based Sixth Form, students who attend can enjoy the extra freedoms and responsibilities, yet still remain part of a nurturing and challenging community founded on Love, Hope and Trust.

At the sixth form we have a proud track record of providing a sixth form education that will help every student flourish academically, socially and personally. Having already nurtured outstanding relationships with the students, our teachers are able to build on the knowledge of every student as an individual, who are all committed to excellence. Each day students experience high quality, creative teaching and learning, delivered by staff who have a unique understanding of pupils' strengths and areas of development. This will inspire a thirst for learning. Our team of expert practitioners are keen and dedicated to prepare all students for their next stage of their education, whether their ambition is to attend a Russell Group University, undergo an Apprenticeship, or gain credible qualifications recognised by universities leading directly into employment and training, we have the pathway that will facilitate this.

If you are one of our many students aiming to attend a top university, we offer a unique programme dedicated to supporting your application through our Russell Group. This programme is led by a coach who has themselves been to a top University, and who will arrange a programme of extra classes, work experience and enrichment opportunities such as; visiting Universities for lectures, leading book clubs in primary schools, supporting lessons in the lower schools or leading assemblies to parents.

Our Higher Education Programme combines academic experiences and cultural visits to provide an all-encompassing preparation for university life. A large proportion of our students go onto higher education. Recent leavers have left us to study Chemistry at the University of Warwick, Aerospace Engineering at the University of Leicester, Mathematics at the University of Glasgow and Biomedicines at the University of Exeter.

An Environment and Ethos to Enable Students to Lead

The academy champions student voice and leadership opportunities, enabling students from all years to be successful leaders and learners.

Our young people develop key skills across the curriculum in and outside the classroom, which they can use in later life, such as working in teams, public speaking, project management, overcoming challenges and mentoring.

Every year we continue to widen the opportunities available, ensuring student voice and leadership remain an integral part of academy life. All students are invited to participate in student surveys as well as attending our extended leadership meetings, which all feeds into our school improvement plans.

Lead Prefects and Student Ambassadors

The way we have selected our prefect team this year has changed significantly from previous year. We have slimmed down the team and assigned roles that truly reflect the demands of a modern school. As a result, we now have prefects focusing on the areas of: well-being, enrichment, charity and fund-raising and sustainability. To oversee that we have also recruited three head prefects who help lead weekly meetings to ensure all promises are kept and are delivered to the highest possible standard. They are at the forefront of all positive change at the sixth form.

Student council

Each year, a group is elected across the school, to represent all young people on the Academy Student council. They work together on a weekly basis to discuss key issues and concerns, enabling student voice to be part of school improvement projects and decisions. The whole academy goes through a voting process; each student will then be interviewed and asked to present ideas.

Student Ambassadors

This is the most popular leadership activity students of any age can participate in. As ambassadors students meet and greet visitors, representing the public face of the academy. Students take this role very seriously endeavouring to be internal and external ambassadors and acting as role models. Students have the opportunity to represent the academy at Open Days and Parents' Evenings, and even delivering presentations to parents, students and governors.

We look forward to collaborating with them on new exciting projects and helping prepare and develop our future leaders.

Enrichment Opportunities

As well as striving for academic excellence we encourage all of our students to become resourceful, resilient, reflective, responsible and collaborative learners. We aim to develop and nurture the whole child and enable them to not only to make tangible connections between their subjects but by raising their aspirations through high quality cultural experiences. This is consciously encouraged through lessons but also through the learning opportunities beyond the classroom. Our extensive and dynamic enrichment programme takes place in a variety of cross-curricular ventures over a number of different platforms. We work with the mind-set that we will enable every child to access to 'The Big 5.' This includes; trips, raising aspirations, university readiness, team work and curriculum development. This is achieved through our six enrichment days each year. These days see the timetable collapsed, and the students having excursions to places such as London theatre shows, art galleries, historical monuments, places of worship, field trips, museums, and some of the top universities in the country. We also invite inspirational speakers, well known sports people, leading professionals and experts in their field to come and lead workshops in school on these special days.

We also offer a vast range of extracurricular clubs and opportunities that run before and after school that every child is encouraged to participate in.

The sporting success of our teams is down to the high quality sporting offer that we have here at St. Mark's. This includes basketball, table tennis, football, boxing, BMX, tennis, rounders, lacrosse and netball. We also participate in and collaborate with the National theatre connections, The Shakespeare for Schools festival, Step into Dance, The Rambert dance company, the BRIT school of performing arts, Wimbledon Bookfest and of course our own in-house whole school performances. Students can be part of the school choir, learn an instrument or become a chapel prefect to help lead collective worship. Students are also able to participate in the Jack Petchey speak out challenge, spelling bees and poetry slams. Whilst the learning and resource centre is open throughout the day for students to play chess and use the high quality ICT facilities. We are also very proud to offer international trips to support our modern foreign languages seeing our students visiting France and Spain each year and some students having the opportunity to recently visit China and Korea.

All staff are expected to lead an extracurricular enrichment session, and this is how we are able to offer such a highly innovative and broad range of enrichment activities that raises the cultural capital of every student and ensures they develop their interests whilst also nurturing their God given talents.

Working Together Towards Common Goals

At St. Mark's we start forging these relationships right from Transition. Parents are invited to come and meet the principal and our staff and are shown around the academy by the student ambassadors. Parents have an opportunity to engage with us through a range of one to one meetings, information evenings and at extended leadership forums. These are real opportunities for us to get to know a family and to work collaboratively to enable every young person to thrive.

We take pride in the way we communicate with families. Staff will not hesitate to contact parents to offer support, guidance and encouragement. We operate an open door policy, enabling all parents to come to see us should there be any reason to do so. We use parentmail to send out important messages via email and text message to give updates or to share our newsletters as this is the quickest most efficient way to communicate with you.

We also have a parents section on our website that gives a more detailed guide for parents, and is a go to for any information that you may need to access about the Academy.

New parents will also be issued with a parent handbook, which will give clear guidance as to how parents can best support their child by working closely with us. We have an extensive programme of Parents' Evenings throughout the year.

These are vital to the success of all learners by offering an opportunity for parents to meet with staff to discuss the progress of their child, with them also receiving a written report documenting their learning journey.

Parents can be involved in many ways to support the work we do here at St. Mark's including; joining our Parent forums, group surgeries, and taking our parent surveys. Parents are actively encouraged to join us in our strategic planning sessions held throughout the year, as we see parents as key stakeholders in the success of their child.

We seek to build strong relationships with many community partners including our feeder primary schools, local churches, businesses and residents. This enables us to work with these stakeholders in order that we utilise every opportunity for our students and also to give back to the local community.
