About Our School

Alexandra Park School opened in 1999 with the aim of creating a great comprehensive school at the heart of the community. We have become that great local school offering top-class education alongside a wealth of experiences for all our students.

We are a traditional school with an ethos of core values and an innovative edge. One of the reasons we are so successful is that we do not shy away from tough decisions. We enforce our behaviour policy and uniform code, whilst insisting upon healthy eating and refusing to tolerate mobile phones!

The recent Ofsted report highlights this as it states "Staff have very high expectations of pupils' behaviour. Clear systems are in place to enable pupils to meet these".

Childhood is a magical time and we want our students to grow and develop in a safe, healthy and supportive environment.

This focus on traditional educational values does not however prevent the school from being outward-facing and at the forefront of the changing world of education. We have a plethora of awards; we do not go out to collect them, but they indicate our priorities and our commitment to being the very best at everything we do.

We are part of the teaching school hub and continue to lead the recruitment and training of the very best teachers into the profession. We hold 'World Class School' status, the new standard in education for schools that have

moved beyond OFSTED outstanding. Whilst we hold the Prince's Teaching Institute Award for all three core subjects, English, Maths and Science, we are equally proud of our Artsmark & School Games Gold standard, reflecting our diverse, creative and lively musical, artistic and sporting talents. We are one of only a handful of Confucius Schools that lead a national programme to develop Mandarin learning within UK schools. As a Science and Maths specialist school, both subjects are thriving and we lead on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) training across London. We have been appointed as the regional coordinator for science teacher development for the whole of London. We are also an Ogden Physics School, opening the door to an array of engaging scientists and universities that inspire our students.

Our passion for education and learning runs through all our subject areas. We are so very proud of our school, our staff, our students and our achievements to date.













About Our Curriculum

The Key Stage 3 Curriculum

Our intent is to provide students with a broad, balanced and challenging curriculum that fosters a love of learning, has a positive impact and enables all students to reach their academic potential. We build on students' achievements in Key Stage 2 to develop the breadth and depth of their knowledge, skills and understanding, preparing them thoroughly for the end of Key Stage tasks, tests and assignments in Year 9 and for taking GCSE and Vocational courses at Key Stage 4.

At every key stage, "Teachers are experts in their subjects" (Ofsted 2023).

Each year within Key Stage 3 has a different emphasis:

In Year 7 the focus is on reinforcing and strengthening numeracy and literacy skills, establishing high expectations and developing students' enthusiasm and independence for learning.

In Year 8 the focus is on maintaining high expectations, developing students' self-motivation by providing them with a very wide range of learning opportunities including the world beyond school and raising the level of challenge to stretch the most able.

In Year 9 the focus is on preparation for the end of Key Stage tests or assignments, preparing students for the demands of GCSEs and on making choices for Key Stage 4.

At Key Stage 4 students have access to a variety of GCSE courses as well as vocational options. More information on all subjects offered is available on the website.

At Key Stage 5 APS has an outstanding and oversubscribed sixth form that offers more than 30 A-level courses as well as vocational studies.

Pastoral Care

At APS all students have a Form Tutor who stays with them throughout their time at the school. The tutor sees their form class at least twice a day, is the main point of contact for parents and provides day-to-day pastoral care. The Form Tutor monitors students' behaviour, attendance and has an overview of their academic progress.

A **Director of Studies** leads each year group and has overall responsibility for academic monitoring, rewards, encouragement, pastoral care and discipline. They are key in communication between home and school. They also work very closely with the Assistant Headteacher for the Key Stage and the Deputy Headteacher.

The school takes the safety of all students very seriously. APS is unequivocal in its intolerance of bullying incidents of any sort. Systems are in place to challenge wrongdoing and support victims and those whose behaviour causes upset or distress.

Students may receive commendations, postcards, emails, telephone calls or letters home to parents. Subject awards are distributed during 'Celebration Assembly.' Exemplary work is displayed in classrooms and corridors or shared with the class as a 'model.' Directors of Studies also issue school star badges during weekly assemblies to students meeting the threshold commendations for good work and behaviour.

Subject badges are issued to students who have demonstrated consistent engagement and attainment. 100% attendance badges are also issued and worn with pride on blazer lapels.



Within school, 'The Bridge' facility offers students who are finding mainstream lessons challenging, a short term and supportive environment in which to access support. This facility is also used for interventions and direct work. Key pastoral staff meet regularly to discuss students who may benefit from short term targeted additional support in school. We have support staff, mentors, a school counsellor and access to external agencies and alternative provisions, who may be able to offer more specialist intervention for students who need longer term support.

Transition

Year 7 students and their families benefit from the support of a dedicated Transition Manager. Ms O'Flynn works closely with feeder primary schools, making visits to the majority of our students whilst they are in Year6. She leads liaison with our primary school colleagues, Year 6 students and their families prior to their transfer to secondary school. Ms O'Flynn remains with the year group for the whole year and builds very strong and supportive bonds with the students and families.

A 'taster' day during the summer term acquaints students with their form tutor and new friends prior to joining us in September. An early team-building visit to an outdoor activity adventure centre, offers an opportunity to make friends quickly within the tutor group and across the whole year group. Students engage in 'settling in' activities in the first term during form time. Additionally, students can benefit from trained 'peer mentors' from KS4. These activities, coupled with the many and varied extra-curricular opportunities available, mean Alexandra Park School offers a uniquely supportive transfer and transition programme.

Families are involved right from the start. They are invited to an early information evening in the summer term and two student progress days through the year. Communication is very important and the website, regular newsletters, letters, 'parent call' and email are used to keep parents and carers involved and updated every step of the way. Alexandra Park School's Values

Our school is about more than exam results; we educate the whole student.

When we say goodbye to students at the end of their time with us we hope that they are well-rounded individuals, confident about their futures, with the skills to achieve on their chosen paths. To ensure this, we actively teach values and characteristics that we believe will help them during their time in school and later in life.

Resilience is the ability to deal with setbacks and the capacity to push on through difficulties to complete tasks. At school and beyond, this characteristic can be the difference between success and failure.

Enrichment

Alexandra Park offers a dynamic and varied enrichment programme. There are opportunities to get outdoors, for example through of hugely successful Duke of Edinburgh Bronze, Silver and Gold programmes as well clubs and trips throughout the academic year.

Music is thriving at APS, with opportunities to learn an instrument as well as perform in well-established large ensembles, choirs, bands and orchestras. The music and drama departments put on regular exciting productions, the most recent being The Wizard of Oz.

There are many curriculum based trips and opportunities to engage in: poetry, Shakespeare, debating, cookery, math challenges, travel, debating and public speaking, to name but a few.

Science is flourishing at APS, with opportunities to learn outside of the classroom for students, in clubs, engineering challenges, collaborative projects with externals, guest lectures and university outreach.

APS really embraces the international dimension. The languages department offers immersions in French, Spanish, Swiss and Chinese exchange programmes. International activities also include skiing and cultural trips to create well-rounded, independent-minded, curious, and global citizens.

There is a brilliant AstroTurf and a large number of sporting clubs and opportunities at APS, providing something for everyone, including athletics, badminton, cricket, dance, football, netball, fitness, rounders and rugby.




















Wellbeing

Attainment 8 is a student's best eight grades, with certain 'Ebacc' subjects prioritised.

Progress 8 is a value-added measure which compares each student's progress to the national average of students with the same level of prior attainment each year. To date, our Progress 8 figures show that students at Alexandra Park School are consistently performing "significantly above" (DfE / Ofsted) the national average for comparable students.
