What is it like working at Garden International, School Eastern Seaboard, Rayong?

After teaching in the UK for a number of years I decided to move abroad to teach and explore new countries and cultures. In my time working overseas I have worked in some vastly different countries, some bustling and vast, and some quieter and with fewer schools and amenities. Thailand had never really been on my "wish list" of places to work, as I pictured working in schools in central Bangkok or a smaller school with little support on an island – neither of which I felt was right for my career or my family. Standards are high, teachers are very professional and knowledgeable, and well-being is good. There are links with schools in the local area, Bangkok and through FOBISIA. My daughter attends the school, and she is happy and making excellent progress. She made friends quickly, and as most children speak English fluently, there are no issues with her being one of a few who don't speak Thai. Outside of school, staff organise a wide range of social events that all are invited to join in with. I like to go on the hikes, and my husband enjoys the Wednesday rugby and social.

In short, we are loving being at GIS, and in Ban Chang, we feel at home, and we have hopes of staying here for the long term.
