We strive for educational excellence every step of the way. Our Early Years team ensures our youngest learners have the best possible foundations in communication, language, physical, personal, social, and emotional development. In Primary, children undertake CCL "Co-Curricular" projects for additional skills-based learning experiences that complement the British curriculum. During the Secondary and Baccalaureate (Sixth Form) stages, we offer a range of subjects at IGCSE and A-Level, the internationally recognised examinations from the British curriculum.

We aim to fully integrate sport and artistic talent with academic abilities. We support our students to go down a variety of pathways towards self-discovery, and self-expression. Our curriculum encourages students to participate in sports, artistic expression, painting, music, and acting. This is also reflected in our extensive extracurricular project. In addition, we have a select programme for elite sports students, which helps to recognise and augment their efforts and achievements.

EARLY YEARS

Effective learning and English immersion



This stage is for children aged from 1 to 5 years old. There are four divisions: Pre-1 (1 to 2 year-olds), Pre-2 (2 to 3 year-olds), Nursery (3 to 4 year-olds) and Reception (4 to 5 year-olds).

Until they enter the Nursery classes at the age of three, our youngest pupils are taught entirely in English. To ensure progressive and individualised learning, the curriculum is divided into core areas and specific areas. Our youngest pupils initially focus on the core areas: physical development, personal, social and emotional development, communication and language. A solid foundation in these leads to successful learning in the specific areas of literacy, mathematics, world understanding, expressive arts and design.

Our curriculum also focuses on the three "characteristics of effective learning", which form the foundation of our students' learning process:

- · Play and exploration
- · Active learning
- · Greative and critical thinking

A WELL-ROUNDED EDUCATION



Emotional well-leing

The emotional well-being of our pupils is of vital importance and we pay particular attention to the children who start their school career with us. We do all we can to ensure they enjoy their childhood and adolescence in a secure environment, so learning can take place naturally.

Engaged learning

Children learn best through play. Our pupils' acquisition of English is supported and accelerated by the 'Talk for Writing' approach, in which they become active storytellers and learn an increasing range of vocabulary associated with key actions and movements. In addition, we follow a literacy scheme called 'Read Write Inc', which introduces children to the sounds of the letters of the alphabet, and harnesses their enthusiasm to become emergent readers and writers.

Open environments

Environment plays a key role in children's development. Our classrooms are spacious, bright and welcoming, with ready access to toilet facilities and the outdoors. The classrooms are deliberately arranged to encompass different areas that stimulate and maximise children's learning.





The development of strong social skills is at the core of our Early Years curriculum. In this way, we put in place the foundation for children to become socially responsible citizens, capable of achieving success throughout their lives. At Elian's, we prioritise emotional intelligence by guiding our youngest pupils to manage their feelings, helping them to learn resilience and the ability to amicably resolve their differences.

To achieve our educational goals, the children enjoy a wide variety of trips to the theatre, museums, farms and many other places that allow them to broaden their knowledge of the world around them.

PRIMARY

A complete education



Comprises six academic years for children of 5 to 11 years old, which are divided into two educational stages: Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2) and Key Stage 2 (Year 3 to Year 6).

Our pupils enter the Primary stage at the age of 5 and remain there until they reach the age of 11, when they move on to Secondary. During these years, we provide a learning community that inspires, nurtures and celebrates achievement. We encourage pupils to develop their talents, fulfill their potential and strive to become the best possible version of themselves. We are a 'school with a heart', where the well-being of each child is at the heart of everything we do.







Our teachers use creative approaches to encourage critical thinking in the classroom and learning through experimentation and practical experience. Throughout the primary years, our teaching methodology is student-centred, which respects the learning pace of each pupil, while putting the emphasis on developing different areas of their intelligence, so they can learn in a way that is relevant to their daily lives.

We use the English National Curriculum as a tool to inspire, motivate and challenge pupils. Learning is approached through different topics, which connect each area of the curriculum and integrate the knowledge learnt so it relates to the real world. This approach emphasises creativity in all subject areas, which helps engage students, and makes learning more relevant and enjoyable.

We strive to ensure that each student reaches their full potential, not only academically, but also socially, physically and emotionally.

The core subjects taught in the classroom are English, Mathematics and Science. The other subjects are Art and Design, Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Computing, Geography, History, Music and Physical Education.

Computing and the use of new technologies are important skills for modern life. It is essential that our pupils gain the confidence and abilities they need in this subject. Preparing them for the challenge of a rapidly developing technological world.



GOING THE EXTRA MILE

Our students have ready access to shared Chromebook computers, which are used for different tasks in primary subjects. We are continually working to expand and improve these skills, integrating new technologies as part of the curriculum. In Key Stage 1, pupils use Class Dojo as an online learning tool and in Key Stage 2, they use Google Classroom.

Inside and outside the classroom

We organise outings throughout the year to reinforce what students are learning in the classroom. In Years 4, 5 and 6 we take short trips around Spain in order to encourage independence, cooperation and the development of interpersonal skills.

The all-round education we offer is enriched by our co-curricular programme. We believe it is vital that our students have the opportunity to experience interests and activities beyond the academic curriculum, or to develop the skills and talents they already have. Our co-curricular programme encompasses a wide range of activities, such as chess, performing arts or yoga. These programmes are taught by our existing teaching staff.

Bilingualism at Elian's

Our pupils' learning in English is complemented by studying Spanish language and culture, including social sciences and the language of the autonomous community, Valencian. Spanish is also taught as a foreign language so that international students can become proficient in it.

15 | Secondary

SECONDARY

Student-led advention



Covers five academic years for children aged from 11 to 16 and is divided into two educational stages: Key Stage 3 (Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9) and Key Stage 4 (Year 10 and Year 11).

During their secondary education, our pupils develop and consolidate their academic, social and emotional learning at the time in life when they need the most support from us.

From age 11 to 13, pupils benefit from a broad and diverse curriculum, studying subjects from the British curriculum and the Spanish curriculum:

Year 7 to Year 9

Our pupils study the curricular subjects of the British system, together with Geography and History ("sociales"); Spanish Language and Literature ("lengua"); and Valencian from the Spanish curriculum. International students also study Spanish as a foreign language.

This combination gives our students multiple advantages, as it provides them with different and complementary learning abilities that add up to a comprehensive education. Furthermore, this approach also allows for the double recognition of their studies, because students can obtain the British qualifications and, if the requirements are met, the Spanish qualifications as well.



International students, who do not have a high enough level of Spanish to follow the Spanish curriculum, can study Spanish as a foreign language in order to learn the language and reinforce their language skills.

Year 10 & 11

Between the ages of 14 and 16, our students choose optional subjects that will prepare them for their future studies. Subject are divided into compulsory or core subjects and options. All our pupils take the following subjects:

- Mathematics

t the end of Year 11, our students take the external British kaminations (International General Certificate of Secondal ducation) which give them access to further or higher ducation and also certifies that they have achieved the landards required in many areas of employment. They can so use their IGCSE results to apply for homologation with the Spanish ESO (Educación Secundaria Obligatoria).






SIXTH FORM

Everlasting opportunity

Key Stage 5 consists of two academic years for young people between the ages of 16 and 18 (Year 12 and Year 13).

Throughout Year 12 and Year 13, students at Elian's study between four and five subjects of their choice to prepare them for their future university courses. We have a team of counsellors to advise each student on their options, taking into account their individual needs and personal strengths.

With this in mind, from Year 11 the students attend workshops, individual meetings and take specific tests so they can get to know themselves better and ultimately make better informed choices.



THE SUBJECTS WE OFFER Year 12 & 13

We also organise visits to universities and university fairs so our students can find out first-hand the wide range of courses on offer.

As well as their academic work, Year 12 and 13 students manage our Student Council, and this experience goes a long way when applying to universities. In addition, it gives them the skills of planning and organising, which will be of great use in their future.

From 16 to 18 years of age, we aim to prepare our students for university. The Key Stage 5 curriculum combines the Advanced Level (A Level) subjects from the British curriculum and the Tests of Specific Competence (PCE) subjects from the Spanish curriculum.

In Key Stage 5, students choose the subjects they wish to study according to their interests, their performance at IGCSE and the university courses they're considering. Their choices are based on advice and academic guidance from their teachers, so they make the most appropriate decision in each case.

OUR FACILITIES Beautiful surroundings

The school buildings are surrounded by **interconnected playgrounds and sports fields**, designed to meet the needs of all our children, from toddlers to teenagers.

We have 53 spacious, air-conditioned classrooms equipped with the latest technology, including **computers and interactive whiteboards.** We also have three ICT classrooms and dedicated spaces for art and design, music and performance; including a dance studio and an auditorium. In addition, we have a well-stocked library, with a wide selection of fiction and non-fiction titles in English and Spanish.

The Early Years department (for ages 1-5) has a specially designed area for our youngest pupils. Each classroom is organised to support the early development of their language and physical abilities. Our pupils have access to a range of outdoor play areas, including an enclosed playground, equipped with soft flooring and a wide selection of sensory play equipment, such as water and sand trays.



OUR FAMILIES AND THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Involving families is essential for the whole educational community, which is why we maintain an open-door policy. We believe regular communication between families and the school is vital to ensure the proper development of our students. Our families take part in school life through a range of activities including open school mornings, assemblies, and concerts. As a school, we share small moments of our pupils' day-to-day life as they progress. We also ensure families get regular updates about the school's vision and achievements by providing an accessible forum in which these can be shared and discussed.

Through our Student Council, we also seek to raise awareness of some of the issues affecting the world we live in. Our teachers are naturally aware of these problems and invite our children to engage with them in positive ways. We encourage families to support and get involved with these initiatives wherever possible.
