
I hope you will find relevant and useful information in this handbook, which is designed to give parents and children children all the information they need about life at ISS.

History and Context

The school was founded in 1969, as a co-educational, non-profit making organisation. The school is owned by the International School Association, of which every parent of children in the school is automatically a member. The school is recognised and licenced by the Ministry of Education.

Initially the school was established to provide a British-style education for children of expatriates working in the Seychelles. However since 1994 the school has welcomed Seychellois children. Today these children are in the majority with children from over 30 different nationalities also represented. Over the years the school has grown and expanded from primary age children to an all-through school from ages 3-19 years.

The curriculum is based on the UK National Curriculum and offers accredited learning programmes that are internationally recognised. The International General Certificate of Education (IGCSE) is taught in years 10-11 and Advanced Level (A level) is taught from years 12-13. All of these examinations are administered and accredited by the University of Cambridge, UK. The majority of our A level students proceed to undergraduate courses at colleges and Universities around the world on completion of their programme.

Mobile phones are not allowed on the premises for Year 7-11 students.


Opening hours of the school


Unless there is a special event, school opens at 7am and closes for all pupils after their last lesson / activity.

Pick up / drop off

The front gate and the back gate are available. Parents are asked not come out of their vehicle and to place a sign with their child's name and class in the window.





Houses



Co-curriculum

Clubs

A programme of lunchtime and after school clubs is available to all students and revised at the beginning of each term. Students can join a range of clubs that might include table tennis, Production, volleyball, journalism, chess, amongst others.

Educational visits

Whenever possible, educational visits are organised. In the past year, those have included a Travel and Tourism trips to a luxury island resort, a History trip to a museum and a Maths kite flying workshop offsite.

Guest speakers

Whenever possible, the school uses guest speakers to widen the students' horizons. In the past, those have included talks about justice / drugs and workshops on mindfulness.

Careers Education and Guidance

We have a comprehensive Careers provision in place, including access to specialist websites and advice on various career paths.













Student Leadership

A key feature of ISS' success is the active involvement in students in the life of the school.

The school offers a diverse range of leadership opportunities for students that includes joining leadership teams and participating in leadership programs. Two representatives from each class are elected at the beginning of the academic year to form the Secondary School Council.

Communication

Email is used by all staff to communicate with students and parents.

A weekly newsletter is sent out to students and parents every Friday. It includes highlights of the past week as well as key dates and notices for the following week.

We use iSAMS as a parent portal. Parents and students get instant notifications about merits and demerits. Individual communication to parents might also be sent via iSAMS.

D6 is the school App via which group communications are sent out.

Before the start of every half term, Curriculum Newsletters are circulated to students and parents with key dates and notices.

Each year group has 2 Parents' Meetings per academic year.

The School Facebook and Instagram pages publish school updates.

Students appear in school publications; this can take the form of photos, videos or work, and these can be shared with the press. In the event of you not wanting your child to feature in publications, please inform the Principal at the beginning of the year.



Dress code

Up to Year 11, all students are expected to wear the school uniform.

- The school uniform is a school polo shirt.
- School shorts or skorts.
- Footwear, which should be smart and safe, should as much as possible reflect the colours of the uniform. Flip flops or shoes without a backstrap are not acceptable.
- Students are expected to have clean and well-presented hairstyle.
- Boys should be clean shaven or have clean and neat facial hair.
- Neither make-up nor nail polish is allowed.
- The following jewellery is acceptable:
 - -One bracelet /One chain or necklace worn inside the shirt /One safe ring one pair of studs or small earrings (max 5mm) in the ear lobe.

Please ensure your child wears the standard uniform when in school. To purchase a uniform, you can liaise with the school's Accounts team.

Members of the community who do not conform to the Dress Code will be sent home to change.

It is beyond the scope of the Policy to provide guidance on every eventuality. In the event of queries, the Head of Primary / Secondary will act as the arbiter. If you fail to comply with these guidelines you will be dealt with in line with school policies and procedures.

Learning in school

Students are expected to come into school with the right equipment for each lesson, e.g. stationery, books, PE kit.

Online learning

In exceptional circumstances when the school campus cannot be open, staff and students switch to online learning and use Google Classroom / Google Meet. This works with the students' ISS email addresses; students must accept invitations sent by teachers to be able to access the work and live lessons. A separate online learning handbook is available.

Private tuition

With the education given to students at ISS, private tuition is not something the school deems necessary. We do understand some parents might like to have this option though; any private tuition arrangements made are private.


This handbook is relevant for all Key Stages and provides an overview of the entire Primary school.










Map of Primary and EYFS

Homework Frequency:

 Homework will be given out on a weekly basis every Friday and handed back in the following Wednesday.

Project Based Homework:

- Children will be given on-going project based homework linked to the topic. Some of the tasks will require children to use their Art/DT skills and knowledge to complete the given task.

All homework will receive an acknowledgement of work done but will not be diagnostic.



Baseline assessments

In order to help students achieve their full potential, students in Year 7, Year 10 and Year 12 sit compulsory CAT4 examinations at the start of the academic year. CAT4 is the UK's most widely used test of reasoning abilities for children aged 6 – 17+ years. The cost of CAT4 testing is added to the invoice for school fees.

It is an assessment of developed abilities in areas known to make a difference to learning and achievement – namely verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning – and it provides an objective perspective on potential student achievement.

Importantly, CAT4 also provides indicators for examinations.





Inclusion

At its heart, inclusive education is a provision that is committed to educating all students, including students identified as experiencing special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in a common learning environment. In such settings, all students have access to quality instruction, intervention and support, so that they experience success in learning.

ISS is committed to inclusion. We aim to engender a sense of community and belonging, and to offer new opportunities to learners who may have experienced previous difficulties. The special educational needs of all children will be met, where appropriate, in mainstream settings, otherwise in a withdrawal setting for a given number of interventions.

We will respond to learners in ways which take account of their varied life experiences and needs. We believe that educational inclusion is about equal opportunities for all learners, whatever their age, gender, ethnicity, impairment, attainment and background.

We pay particular attention to the provision for and the achievement of different groups of learners:

- Additional Needs

For children in Early Childhood, we understand that prolonged use of face coverings could be difficult and even inappropriate for some students, therefore we will not enforce face coverings for children in Reception 1 and Reception 2.



ace coverings should not include anything inappropriate or that could become a straction to the learning environment. Also, please do not use bandanas, nock galters (fishing masks), or one-way valve masks.

In the event a student or staff forgets their nask or face shield at home or needs a new mask or face shield during the school day, disposable face masks will be available for sale from the accounts office.



WILL HAND SANITIZER BE AVAILABLE?

The school is stocked with adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviours including soap, hand sanitizer, tissues, and no-touch trash cans. Hand sanitizer isavailable at reception, back gate and entrance gate.

Regular hand washing is encouraged and reminded by teachers.

All students are also encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer to use in school.



WHAT IS THE DAILY SCREENING PROCESS FOR STUDENTS & STAFF?

When required by Ministry of Health guidelines, all students will be temperature checked at arrival by a touchless thermometer. Any student with a temperature of 37.5° C or higher will be sent home. We are asking families to perform daily temperature checks of their children before coming to school for the day. If a student has a temperature of 37.5° C or higher, they should stay home.

In addition, when required by Ministry of Health guidelines, all staff and visitors will also be required to check their temperatures daily to ensure the health and safety of our campus.





HEALTH & SAFETY MEASURES

HOW WILL THE SCHOOL PLAN FOR SOCIAL DISTANCING?

Understanding that schools, by design, are not conducive to physical distancing, ISS will adhere to guidelines in order to maintain a safe learning environment. We will take advantage of the opportunity to utilise space in the open grounds available. According to the Ministry of Health, keeping space between you and others is one of the best tools we have to avoid being exposed to the virus. We will continually encourage and monitor good hygiene practices in the classrooms.

WHAT WILL BE DONE TO EDUCATE AND ENCOURAGE SOCIAL DISTANCING AND SAFE PRACTICES?
